Colosse Church Breaks Ground for New Addition

On Sunday, May 5, 2019, Colosse Baptist Church broke ground for a new addition to the church. The new addition will include a large multipurpose room, a large kitchen, six new classrooms, a large fellowship lobby and will be handicap accessible.

At a short dedication service at 12:15 p.m., Historian Jeff Walton stated, "Colosse's history of growing to meet the needs of the ministries here in our small part of the county goes back to our beginning in 1791. Colosse's first church building of its own burned in 1850. Our current sanctuary was built in 1852 and

has served as our "church" continuously for 167 years." Several additions have been added over the years. In 2004 the Building Committee recommended proceeding with developing plans to expand.

Former Pastor Don Campbell and present pastor, Jeff Mills, broke ground for the start of the new addition.

Mr. Walton stated, "Today, fifteen years of planning has come to fruition. Our theme of "Growing a Loving Church" stands true today as it has in the past. Colosse has been a beacon of hope spreading the Gospel to this community for 228 years."

The harvested birds are judged with an aggregate scoring system of weight, beard length, and spur length. This year Samantha McInteer, a 13 year old student at Hamilton-Holmes Middle School was the overall winner of the One Shot Turkey Hunt with an aggregated score of 67.82. The gobbler weighed in at 21.07 pounds, with spurs of 1.3 inches, and a beard of 10 3/8 inches. Samantha received a scholarship to enter the hunt by writing an essay on the importance of game laws for the One Shot scholarship contest. She was guided by recently retired Executive Director of VDGI, Bob Duncan on Retreat Farm in Hanover County. As overall winner of the One Shot Turkey Hunt, she received a Franchi shotgun, and an original acrylic painting of a gobbler by Guy Crittenden. She also won a lifetime hunting license. Although rain was promised, it waited until later in the afternoon to arrive but Mattaponi had rented a very large tent for several vendors selling candles, jewelry, signs and baked goods. One vendor, Pat Perry, mother of Mattaponi member Tammy Mason, had a large table with handmade crafts for sale. All proceeds are donated to the Down Syndrome Association of Greater

Richmond in honor of her grandson, Jackson Mason who has down syndrome. King and Queen Sheriff's Department's John Charboneau and deputies were on hand for security and one deputy was doing fingerprinting of the children on scene.

This fundraiser is one of several that the organization does during the year. On June 15 the organization will be part of the Mattaponi Madness Drag Boat Races at Rainbow Acres. All proceeds are going to the Truck Fund. The organization has recently taken possession of a new heavy rescue truck. Tammy Mason stated, "Every fire and rescue department in King and Queen can use this vehicle as a command truck. It will be used to cross train the units so that all departments can utilize the truck for the betterment of the community."

That's impossible!" At the time, the Tidewater Resource, Conservation and Development (RC&D) was in existence and her husband suggested she go talk to them for advice. With her business plan in hand, she went to pitch her idea. The RC&D loved the idea, helped her form a committee, suggested she add wine tasting into the mix, and she was off to the races.

The problem was still logistics. How was she going to sell the tickets at the gate, pick up the trash, park the cars, run a silent auction, run an area for kids to do artwork, while checking on her vendors. It's amazing what word of mouth does. She starting talking up the festival and everyone she talked to offered to help. Many of the non-profit organizations in the area loved the idea of coming and helping. Thus the Arts & Wine Festival at Locust Grove was born and is still running with the help of the local non-profit organizations. The festival supports all these organizations with the money that is raised from ticket sales.

Being the first cultural event in King & Queen County, over 900 people came to

Set around a family plantation house that was built in 1775 right beside the Mattaponi River, it has become a country getaway for thousands of people over the years. The Junior Ag. Mechanics team placed 2nd out of 10 teams, which then qualified them for states. They were only ten points behind placing first. For

Tanner Lipscomb, Cole Richardson, and Marc Gresham. Lastly, the Hippology team placed 1st overall in their competition, their competition consisted of identification, feed rations, tool identification, and horse anatomy. The members of this team were Alania Hawkins, Lexi Bareford, Mattie Watkins, and Gracie Tranium. The King William FFA has all four of their teams going to compete at states this year.

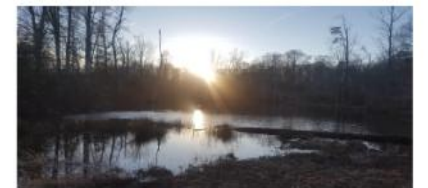

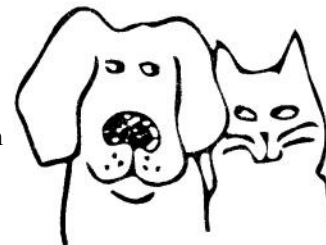

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Resolution 19-24 the FY 2020 (Budget) 'Class and Compensation Plan' passed the KW Board of Supervisors by a vote of 4 to 1 April 22nd.

Resolution 19-24 allows our County Administrator, Ms. Tassinari, to increase County employee salaries on her own, with no Board review or approval; at any time the County Administrator finds appropriate e.g., Chapter 1: The Personnel Administration System. The County Administrator does have this authority as granted by the Personnel Manual and the Board of Supervisors as long as it is performed within budgetary constraints.

Three County positions now have a top salary range of \$100,710 e.g. 1) Chief of Fire and EMS; 2) Director of Community Development; and 3) Director of Financial Services. These salary caps are, in some, cases, more that elected Constitutional Officers i.e., Sheriff Walton, A few other salary 'CAPS' include: 1) Emergency Services Technical Assistant (KW Chief's 'secretary') \$57,404; 2) County Administrator's 'Executive Assistant - Special

Projects' \$54,111; 3) Firefighter/Medic (EMT - Paramedic) \$59,000; 4) Firefighter/Medic (EMT - Basic) \$54,111; 5) Firefighter/Medic (Intermediate) \$57,404; 6) Manager (Regional Animal Shelter) \$64,950; 7) Parks and Recreation Manager \$64,950; 8) Utilities Manager \$80,120; and Captain Deputy Sheriff \$69,723.

Kelsea Sprouse, LPN can't explain exactly why, but when she volunteered to escort one of her Riverside Convalescent Center – Saluda residents living with dementia to a doctor's appointment in Richmond, "something told me to drive myself, to follow the transport and have my own car with me," Sprouse said.

And she was glad she did. The hired transport service dropped the resident off at the wrong doctor's office.

"Since I had my car with me, I put him in my car, figured out where he needed to be and got him there, and back home later, myself," Sprouse said. "Had he been by himself, given his dementia, it could have been very dangerous for him."

For her kindness far and above the call of duty, Sprouse was named the Riverside Champion of the Year for the Middle Peninsula. She was among more than 90 Riverside team members from the region recognized for having been nominated four or more times in 2018 as a Champion of Caring or who were named the monthly Champion for their facility.

Martin Billups, a Protection Officer at Riverside Walter Reed Hospital, has spent his career in service having retired from the U.S. Army before joining Riverside two years ago.

"I want to give back in as many ways as I can while I'm still healthy," Billups said, explaining that as a protection officer he helps secure the hospital, maintain order, give patients and families directions and help wherever they are needed. "I can't seem to get away from putting on a uniform and serving people."

Billups sees his job as helping ease the stress of patients arriving at the hospital and believes that's why he was nominated as a Champion of

"I'm often the first person to see patients and their families when they arrive at the hospital," Billups said. "I try to read their body language and know what they need before they even ask. It means I can help send them to the doctor in a good mood and the positive effects of that can snowball for their entire visit."

Smith Named Virginia Superintendent of the Year

Former West Point Superintendent Dr. Jeffrey O. Smith has been named Virginia Superintendent of the Year. Dr. Smith started his administrative career as an assistant principal in King George County Public Schools in 1993 before working as a principal in Westmoreland County and as a principal in Hanover County from 1994-2000. He then served as an Assistant Superintendent in three different school divisions before his first superintendent appointment in West Point in 2008 where he remained until his current appointment as Hampton's Superintendent in July 2015.

Under his leadership as superintendent with the Hampton City Schools, the school division has strengthened its dual enrollment program with Thomas Nelson Community College, to date yielding a 600 percent increase in the number of dual enrollment credits taken by HCS students. The on-time graduation rate has increased from 88 percent for the Class of 2015 to 92.6 percent for the Class of 2018. The dropout rate has decreased from 5.1 percent for the Class of 2015 to 1.57 percent for the Class of 2018. The division

posted its highest accreditation rate in six years with 93 percent of the schools earning accreditation without conditions. The Hampton City community has earned the distinction of being the first Ford Next Generation Learning Community in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

As Virginia's Superintendent of the Year Dr. Smith will be eligible for the National Superintendent of the Year Award, which will be presented next February in San Diego, CA by the American Association of School Administrators.

Dr. Smith is married to the former Lorianne Samuel of Caroline County, a public school educator. They have two children, a daughter who is a graduate of Christopher Newport University and Eastern Virginia Medical School with a master in Public Health Policy and Management, and a son who is a junior at Bridgewater College.

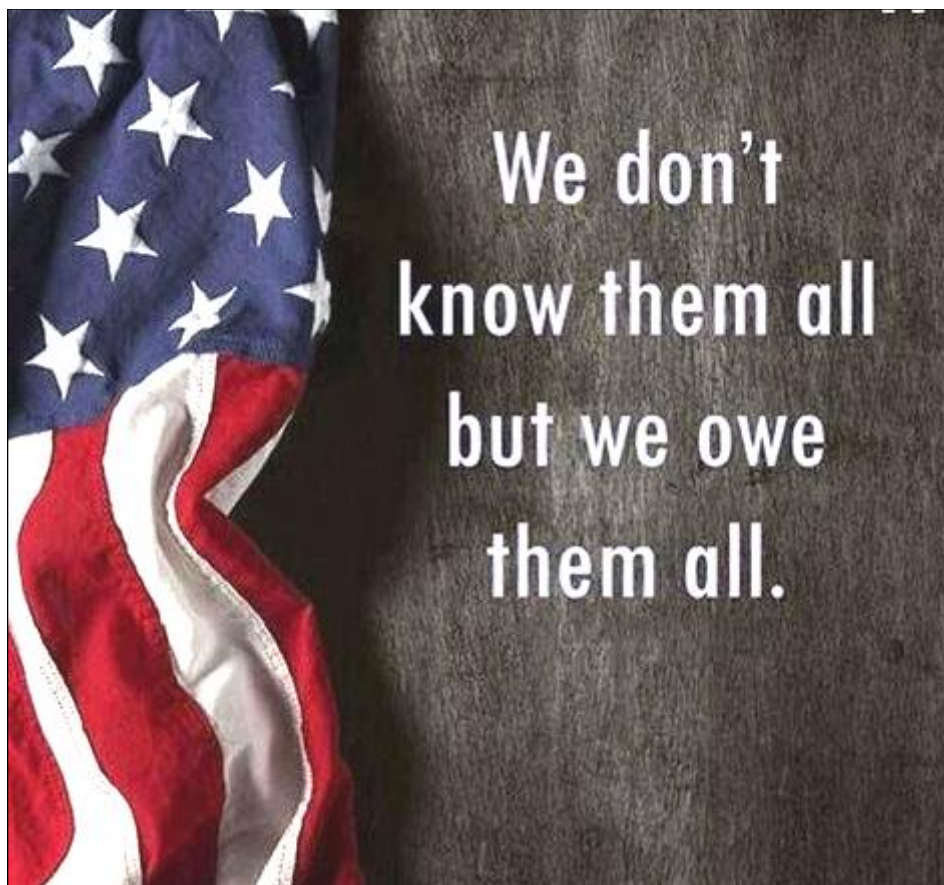
