## VSU Offers Free Five-Week Beekeeping for Beginners Course

Beekeeping for Beginners is a free five-week course being held at Hopewell United Methodist Church, 4585 Dry Fork Rd, Dry Fork, VA (Pittsylvania County). Classes will be held for five consecutive Tuesdays beginning January 23, 2018, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. There will also be a field day trip to a hive on Saturday, March 3, weather permitting.

This five-week course is being offered by the Small Farm Outreach Program (SFOP) of Virginia State University (VSU) Cooperative Extension. It is designed for individuals interested in starting a beekeeping operation.

Participants will learn about the history and purpose of beekeeping; the basic biology of bees and equipment needed; getting started and harvesting; and how to manage pests, disorders

and parasites. Mike Rogers and Patrick Ferrer from the Pittsylvania County Beekeepers Association will be presenters in the course, along with Berry Hines, a master beekeeper.



## Christmas@TheCornerStone



At Aylett this year, Christmas@TheCornerStone started off with a special luncheon for about 70 seniors and culminated with a visit from Santa and lady Claus to families at 'The CornerStone' on December 16th. Over a hundred and twenty-five families took pictures with Santa that day. Pictures with Santa has been a special feature for the last fifteen years here in Aylett. John & Carrie Fischetti have been gracious each year sharing their resources. John is a professional photographer. Together with their daughters they combine their professionalism with grace and warmth at Christmas. There is much fun and laughter as the Fischetti family usher in the guests to pose with Santa that makes Christmas memorable to so many. Families look forward to this joyous experience and most of them try not to miss out.

Over a two-week period prior to Christmas, volunteers at 'The CornerStone' spared no effort to have donations collected, sorted and distributed. Over 785 children from King William, West Point and King & Queen got toys, games, puzzles and some even got bicycles for Christmas at Aylett this year.

A second part of the distribution of toys occurred around several other counties where 'Aylett Toys for Tots' works with existing Christmas programs. 'The CornerStone Community Development Center's Christmas Program came to a crossroad a few years back when the number for families needing help at Christmas surpassed the level of local donations. While community support is consistently amazing each year, leftover toys from the Gloucester Toys for Tots campaign became a supplemental resource for the shortfall. Last year 'Aylett Toys for

Tots' was authorized by the U.S. Marine Toys for Tots Program to bring to children toys at Christmas. Local donations to the Christmas program are important to this endeavor as they have been for the past 16 years. The Marines ensure that no child in need is left without a toy for Christmas. Not only do children in King William and King & Queen benefit from this generosity, several other counties participate in it as well. Well over 1400 children whose families qualified based on income in over ten counties received toys this Christmas through the Aylett Toys for Tots program. Donations are raised in these other counties too. Pictured is one of our toy drop off sites. 33 Toys for Tots boxes were at different drop sites. Some came in full and overflowing, few were nearly empty.

A Marine who served two terms made his appearance in uniform at our Christmas celebration in Aylett. This was a special gesture and brought home to us a reminder of those who give their all in sacrifice for others.

It would be impossible to name all those who contributed to making Christmas special this year but certainly will endeavor to thank them individually. Apart from our ever willing gang of volunteers we are treated to extraordinarily loving people who at this time of the year walk in ever so mindful of the families that 'The CornerStone CDC' takes care of through the year. One such morning a lady brought boxes with about 66 toys that her son had bought at a sale over the previous weekend. A kind, friendly and neighborly face, a hard working single mum reaching out to help families in need at Christmas. Several knocks on the door this season brought to a continuing realization that Christmas is all about loving and caring for people.

Cool Spring Primary School in King William celebrated 12 days of Christmas this year. When Dr. Rachel Ball called for a pickup of donations, volunteers had no idea that there was a load of 421 pairs of socks, 190 scarves, 155 hats, 165 pairs of gloves and 12 blankets apart from 482 food items apart from tooth brushes and tooth paste.


Local churches, groups and business helped to collect such donations as well. Food was in plentiful supply and the 'Wall of Hats, Scarves, Gloves and Socks' was loaded.

West Rock at West Point led the donation trail with their employees gathering over 150 toys, games and puzzles and nine bicycles.

West Point public schools followed closely behind with a collection of 125 toys, games and puzzles. Bicycles and toys have been distributed locally to children at



WestPoint, King William and King and Queen families. Every attempt has been made to keep local donations, distributed locally and only to those in need. Teary eyes and grateful hearts say a big thank you to all donors and volunteers who so willingly and constantly give of their time, effort and needed resources.



- Approved 4-0 adoption of Ordinance 22-17 rezoning Z-03-17 consisting of 4.5 acres owned by D. S. Mitchell Electric and Tri-County Appraisers from B-1 (Limited Business) to B-2(General Business).
- Approved 4-0 adoption of Ordinance 23-17 rezoning Z-04-17 consisting of 15.96 acres owned by Darrell Kellum, Inc. & Steve Adams, Inc. from AC (Agricultural-Conversation) to B-2(General Business).
- Removed from the agenda consideration of Resolution 17-62 which would have authorized the use of funds in the amount of \$113,836 in the County Proffer Cash Fund 305 to help defray design costs of proposed new additions to the Hamilton Holmes Middle School Project.
- Approved 4-0 waiving the building permit and land disturbance permit fees for the Hamilton Holmes Middle School Project.
- Reviewed Fire and EMS Statistics for November with Fire Chief Andy Aigner.


