



King William Couple Help Feed the Homeless

A King William couple, Dave and Shari Anderson, along with others from the Cross Roads Church, volunteer one Saturday a month to feed the homeless through the Moments of Hope Outreach. Four to five groups from local churches and businesses prepare and serve a delicious meal to 150 -250 struggling neighbors, many of whom are homeless, at Brookhill Azalea Shopping Center at 5300 Chambelayne Road.

Moments of Hope Outreach started about three years ago when Bob Humner, a Hanover resident, saw a man on Chambelayne Avenue asking for food. Bob stopped, picked the man up and bought him food. The man was homeless so Bob offered help. When meeting the man again, the man brought friends who were also homeless and hungry. Bob was soon overwhelmed with the needs of the homeless

He told a friend who is a member of Cross Roads Church in Aylett about the tremendous needs of the homeless. She offered to fix a Thanksgiving meal for the homeless. She put an email on social media about her idea. Quickly many people volunteered to help.

Now four to five groups, Cross Roads Church, Gethsemane Church of God, Fairmount Christian Church, Grove Avenue Baptist Church, and Beca Auto Repair take turns serving delicious meals. The groups consist of men, women and children who come to serve and help.

The meal starts at 2 p.m. with an opening prayer and is served until 3:30 p.m. Also available is the Mo Hope Mobile Pantry that distributes canned/dry goods, fresh veggies, toiletries and clothing. 

KW Mother of 5 Killed in Icy Crash

On Tuesday, January 9th, State Police reported that a 35 year old King William woman was killed and five children were injured in a single vehicle crash caused by ice on Globe Road, just east of Mitchell Mill Road.

According to State Police, a 2002 Chevrolet Silverado was traveling west on Globe Road around 10:20 a.m. when the driver lost control due to icy roads and ran off the road before veering back onto the road, hitting a culvert pipe and flipping onto its driver side and hitting a tree.

The driver of the vehicle, Cynthia Leigh Lapierre of Aylett, was pronounced dead at the scene. Five children, a son age 15, two 12 year old girls, one daughter age 2 and a one month old girl, were all transported to the hospital - three with minor injuries and two with serious injuries. The teenage son and 12 year old stepdaughter continued to recover at VCU Medical Center on Wednesday.

Police said the children were wearing seatbelts and the proper safety restraints at the time of the accident.

The family of Mrs. Lapierre have set up a GoFundMe page to help pay for Cindy's funeral costs. Donations are also accepted through a bank account set up under David Lapierre for the benefit of Cynthia Lapierre at Sonabank in King William. 




