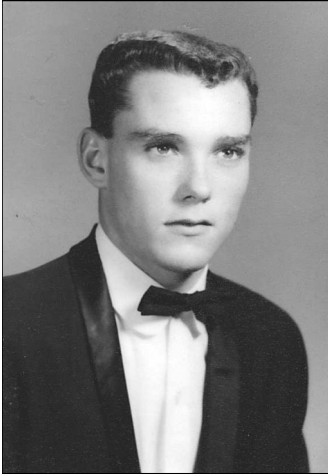

## Carroll Lee Walker - Local Philanthropist



Carroll Lee Walker

People far and wide know the name Carroll Lee Walker. Most don't know the man personally but most know him as the rescuer and restorer of old historic buildings in both King William and King and Queen counties. He does not see an old dilapidated building that most people would tear down or burn down. He sees it as something that was a part of history and he restores it to its former beauty.

Born and raised in the small

village of Walkerton to Janet Temple Griggs and S. Ryland Walker, he is married to Nora Acree Walker (Biddy) and is the father of a daughter, Evelyn Ryland Walker (Carlee). Carlee is married to David Mann and they have one son, Wilks.

After he returned to Walkerton from a three year stint in the Marines, it broke his heart to come home and find many of the buildings dilapidated and overgrown in vines. Mr. Walker stated, "You can't know how

growing up as a little boy. I wanted to put this town back as clean and neat as I knew as a child."

In 1969 he bought the abandoned Taylor and Caldwell, Inc. cannery located by the Mattaponi River. The plant once canned black-eyed peas, butter beans and peas but the plant closed in 1955. He spent the next few years cleaning it up. He converted part of the cannery into an office, a self-service boat and car wash and a "Dairy Treat" snack bar. In the next few years he bought several more buildings in

Walkerton and restored them. He bought the cannery's water supply, helped organize 40 subscribers who formed the Walkerton Water Systems and he put up \$12,500 needed to buy the community water system. Later the state highway tore down the cannery to make way for the new bridge to cross the river. He bought the old steel span. It sits next to the new bridge and is in the middle of a waterfront park that can be used by people launching boats on the river.

## Fire Destroys Two Structures in King & Queen

About 9:45 p.m. on Wednesday night, February 6. A fire was reported in a residential structure at 1719 Canterbury Road. A passerby saw the fire and determined there were two fully involved structures – a house and a workshop that possibly contained explosives, and a steel building with equipment and several vehicles in the yard.

Upon arrival units reported heavy fire conditions driven by wind. Fire units from Walkerton, Upper King and Queen, Central King and Queen, King William, and Mangohick responded, as well as King and Queen Emergency Services. Units remained on scene until 2 a.m. controlling hot spots.

The cause of the fire has not yet been determined. The house had been vacant for some time.

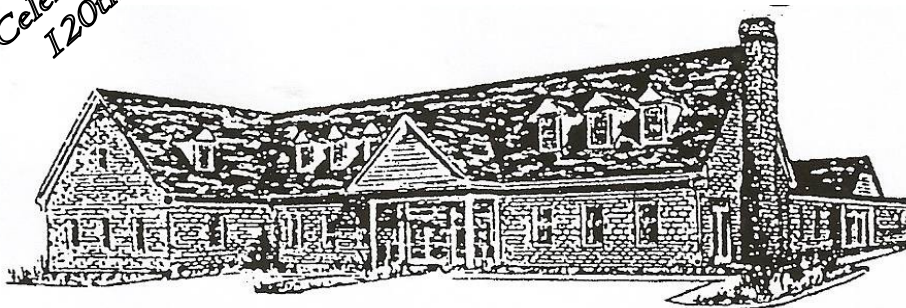

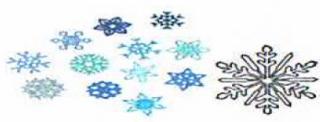

## President Trump Signs Virginia Tribes Recognition Bill Authored by Wittman into Law

WASHINGTON – Congressman Rob Wittman (VA-01) applauded President Trump for signing H.R. 984, the *Thomasina E. Jordan Indian Tribes of Virginia Federal Recognition Act of 2017* into law. This legislation, championed by Rep. Wittman, grants federal recognition to six Virginia Indian tribes. Rep. Wittman introduced the bill in February of 2017 and today, nearly one year later, it is receiving the president's signature.

"Today we celebrate a decade of hard work. Our 'first contact' tribes of the Commonwealth of Virginia will finally receive the recognition they deserve," Rep. Wittman said. "This is an issue of respect; federal recognition acknowledges and protects the historical and cultural identities of these tribes. Not only will it affirm the government-to-government relationship between the United States and the Virginia tribes, but it will create opportunities to enhance and protect the well-being of tribal members. I want to thank Senators Kaine and Warner and Representatives Scott, Beyer, and Connolly for supporting my efforts as we finally give these tribes the recognition they have long deserved."

This law grants federal recognition to the

the Upper Mattaponi, the Rappahannock, the Monacan, and the Nansemond tribes. These tribes received official recognition from the Commonwealth of Virginia but had faced barriers preventing them from receiving federal recognition due gaps in official records. The *Thomasina E. Jordan Indian Tribes of Virginia Federal Recognition Act of 2017* rights this wrong.

Federal recognition grants Virginia's tribes legal standing and status in relationships with the U.S. government. This status enables the tribes to pursue repatriation of historical and cultural artifacts, comment on federal agency actions that could affect their future, and gain access to a number of federal programs.

Rep. Wittman introduced H.R. 984 on February 7, 2017. The bill passed the House by voice vote on May 17, 2017 and the Senate by Unanimous Consent on January 11, 2018. President Trump signed the legislation into law this afternoon.

Congressman Rob Wittman represents the 1st District of Virginia. He serves on the House Natural Resources Committee and the House Armed Services Committee, where he is the Chairman of the Seapower and Projection Forces Subcommittee.

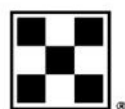

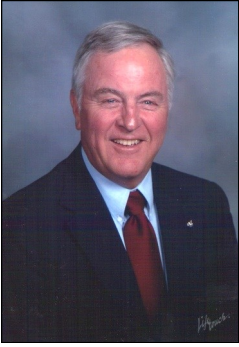

In June of 1980 Bennett Mineral Company, owned by Dr. Paul J. Bennett, Jr., his son Paul and his daughter Deady – all geologists, discovered large deposits of diatomaceous earth (fuller's earth) in the area of Walkerton, including the Walker Farm. This form of clay is useful as an industrial absorbent and domestic cat litter.

By the end of June 1981 construction of a \$2 million dollar clay processing plant was underway. When the mining and processing was completed, about 40 – 60 people were hired. A six acre plant site was built as the plant where the clay is processed and sold to large corporations.

Another large Walker project was the restoration of Marriott School, which Mr. Walker graduated from in 1963. The school was built in 1938 and closed in the 1970's. A group of county residents created a nonprofit corporation to save the historical old building. The needed money was not forthcoming. Carroll Lee purchased the property from the county for \$130,000. After extensive renovations, the cost of renovation was \$2.2 million dollars. Part of the building will be used for community events and the remaining building was leased to the Pamunkey Regional Library.

On August 30, 2012, Carroll Lee and family gave the remodeled Marriott School Building and grounds back to King and Queen County. County Administrator Thomas J. Swartzwelder thanked Carroll Lee and his family for the energy, generosity and vision by saying, "You have made our world a better place and through your example reminded us all of the greatness of the human spirit and the responsibility each one of us bears to make a difference."

Another of Mr. Walker's restorations is the Lester Manor Village located at 102 Lester Manor Lane next to the Pamunkey Indian

Reservation on the Pamunkey River. In the late 1800's and early 1900's Lester Manor was a booming railway town. The railroad was a connection between the areas of King William, King and Queen and the city of Richmond.

The Lester Manor Depot, or train station, was built in 1859. Other buildings included the Lester Manor Hotel and Tavern and the Lester Manor General Store and Post office. The original buildings have long disappeared but thanks to the historical nostalgia of Carroll Lee, new representations stand in their place. Now there is the Lester Manor Store, a carriage house with carriage, a stagecoach building, blacksmith shop, a log outpost, totem pole and two teepee representing the Pamunkey American Native Americans.

Mr. Walker's latest project has been the Prestley Barn and Old Virginia Barn. The barn was built in 1925 by Guy O. Townsend and the Old Virginia Barn predates the larger barn by more than a century. The two barns are located on a once 800 acre working dairy barn on Route 360. The barn had become dilapidated over the years since the dairy closed in the 1970's. In the 1990's three owners owned the property.

In 2013 Carroll Lee acquired seven acres of the property. Restoration took the better part of a year. The old silos and out-buildings were torn down. Now a shock of fresh red paint marks the restoration of a landmark.

Dragon Run Brewery is scheduled to open inside the red barn in the Summer of 2018. The brewery will be a first for King William. Tommy and Lindsay Adkins, brother and sister, the owners of the brewery. Lindsay is a forensic toxicologist in Richmond and her brother Tommy has worked for nearly a decade in the hospitality industry. Lindsay will be the brewmaster and her brother will be chief

executive officer. Up to a dozen beers will be on tap with names such as Big Red Barn Red JPA, Prestley Park Milk Stout, and 1725 Courthouse Albier (named for King William Court House built in 1725).

The first phase of construction will be a tasting room on the ground floor with a limited menu anytime the brewery is open. The second phase will be the upper level to be used as rustic space for wedding receptions and other events.

Mr. Walker has restored other numerous history sites and buildings. In King William there is Acquinton Church, the Lanesville Christadelphian Church, and Southside Bank in Aylett. In King and Queen there is Jones Store in Stevensville and Griggs' Store in Bruington.

He once was asked what his motivation was in restoring the historic sites, he said, "I just love fixing old properties."

Who's Who Directories, a New York based biographical reference publication, named Carroll Lee Man of the Year Recipient for 2015 – 2016. Recipients of this distinction are those who have excelled professionally and who have made it their mission to be active philanthropically and walk with graciousness and humility. Mr. Walker has consistently displayed the passion, vision and dedication necessary to be successful in the business world. The press released stated, "His kind, loving and warmhearted disposition make him the most appropriate recipient for our Man of the Year Honor."

All the citizens of King William and King & Queen appreciate the improvements he has made in the two counties over the years. Whether they know Mr. Walker personally or not, they all say "THANK YOU."

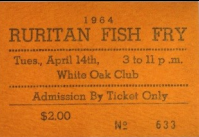

## King William Ruritan Fish Fry - Back in the Day

When forty local gentlemen got together and formed the King William Ruritan Club in 1938 they decided to meet the second Tuesday of each month and work together to make the community a better place in which to live and work. In 1941 the idea of catching some "spawning" shad, frying them along with the roe and serving them up with some "fixens" to Ruritan members and friends at the April meeting was started. Thus the "Annual Rite of Spring" tradition know as the King William Ruritan Club Fish Fry was born.....and continues seventy-seven years later. It all began at club member Ben Garrett Jr's Cabin on the banks of the Mattaponi River behind the Courthouse. Tickets were \$2 each in the 1960's. In 1969 the fish fry moved up river to my father's cottage (Dick Campbell's Cottage) because as the fish fry's popularity grew over the years, it had more space for parking. In 2010 the fish fry moved to the Club's new facilities on Rt. 30.

In the early years Governors, US Senators, Congressmen, Supreme Court Justices and local politicians would mark the second Tuesday in April on their calendars as a day to gather with the local "good ole boys" and shoot the breeze, tell tall tales, deal some cards, roll the dice, and pitch horseshoes (there are stories told where the judges were called upon during a "rousing" game to

render a final decision as to whose shoe was closest to the stake). During the World War II years the men or "minute men" as there were called, would sharpen their shooting skills by shooting balloons across the river.

This year the festivities are on Tuesday, April 10 from 3 - 7pm at the Ruritan Park on Rt. 30 (three miles south of Central Garage). The club serves catfish instead of shad these days but you still can get a "heaping helping" of shad roe, cole slaw, clam chowder, crispy bacon, hush puppies and pork skins along with the catfish.....all washed down with your favorite beverage while listening to some "live" country/blue grass music by Van Walker and Friends. Tickets are \$25 each and can be purchased at King William Pharmacy, Union Bank in Manquin, Essex Bank and SoNa Bank in Central Garage, Aylett Tire, 360 Hardware, Exxon Station in Manquin and West Store in Hanover....or see any Ruritan member or call 363-1781. Some of the proceeds go back to the community in the form of donations to charitable organizations such as local fire and rescue squads.

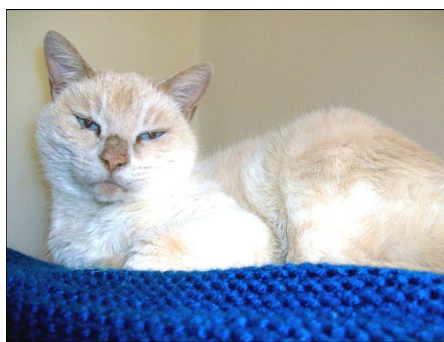
## Taliaferro Wins Spelling Bee

Sharon states "I am truly honored to have been selected for this important position and to join such a great team. I am looking forward to moving to the County soon and serving the citizens in the coming years."

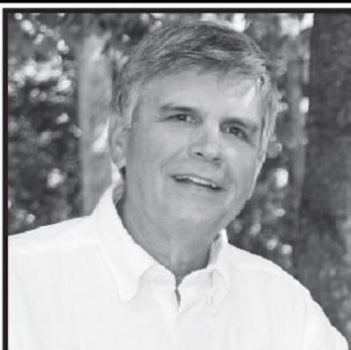
