## Custis Mill Pond Road in King William will Remain Closed through May

*Completion date for a bridge replacement project over Mill Creek has been extended due to winter weather conditions*

**FREDERICKSBURG** – Custis Mill Pond Road in King William County will remain closed through May, as crews continue a bridge replacement project over Mill Creek. The bridge is located between Seatons Lane and Wakema Road.

Due to recent winter weather conditions, the project schedule has been extended beyond the original completion date in March.

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) closed Custis Mill Pond Road in late December 2017 to begin work to replace the structurally deficient bridge with a 55-foot long concrete single slab bridge on new concrete abutments. State forces are constructing the new bridge, which is more than double the length of the existing structure built in 1968.

Weather permitting, the road is now expected to reopen by the end of May.

The recommended detour route will remain in place until the project is complete, which is approximately six miles:

- Route 30 (King William Road)
- Route 626 (Rose Garden Road)

Message boards will alert motorists to the new completion date.

Custis Mill Pond Road carries an average of 930 vehicles a day, according to a 2016 VDOT traffic count.

### Trailer Time

Trailers are an important part of horse people's lives. With show season and trail riding almost here, we need to make sure our trailers are in good shape and are working properly and safely. Trailers come in lots of sizes from straight load, slant load, or stock trailers and can be either bumper pull or goose-neck. We know to always check the tires for wear and proper inflation and check to make sure the lights are working. We also need to check the brakes and wheel bearings so as not to have any problems with pulling or stopping. The flooring needs to be looked at for any weak spots that the horse may crack or step through. Check the inside of the trailer to make sure there are no sharp or loose objects that could injure your animal. Our trailers sit sometimes for long periods without use so we need to keep a good eye on their condition.

I remember a story about a friend of mine that had the bright idea of him getting inside his horse trailer and have his wife take him for a short trip to make sure everything was safe and tight. She closed him in and locked the rear doors and got in the truck and



drove around for about 5 to 10 minutes before pulling back in at their house. She said she heard beating and yelling coming from the back of the trailer so she jumped out and opened the doors on the trailer. Her husband ran by her with his hands in the air screaming. It took a little bit for her to catch up with him and calm him down. She said it looked like somebody had beaten him with a stick. He had knots and whelps all over his head and arms. Come to find out, wasps had built a nest inside the trailer and stung him several times once they started down the road.

Always check for unwanted bees and wasps in and around your trailers.

## King William Park Gets Improvements

In the last budget season the King William County Board of Supervisors approved \$80,000 from the Capital Improvement Project Fund for new playground improvements to the county playground on Route 30.

According to Alison W. Fox, Manager of the Parks and Recreation Department for King William, a new site would have been the best option but the department ran into a few hiccups along the way so the new playground will be on the same site. A new system has been ordered from Miracle Recreation Equipment Company and will be delivered and installed shortly.

Once the playground is up and running, a grand opening will be held, hopefully, by the end of April or very early May. Once a Grand Opening date is set, invitations will be sent out through the Recreation System email as well as posted on the Facebook page so the community can come and enjoy the new playground.

The updated picnic area near the concession stand will include new picnic tables with bright umbrellas for shade and better landscaping with new plants and shrubbery to make the area more inviting. One special touch to this new picnic area will be the customized stepping stones created by the King William County Parks and Recreation After School Recreation participants.

The King William Little League received an enhancement/development of the Softball Program Grant through Little League with their "Grow the Game" grant opportunities. This grant will update a new playing field to help

aid the growth of the softball program in King William. This field was not only made possible with the grant but with the help of local donations, volunteers and partnership with the Park and Recreation Department. The new field will have a Grand Opening when the Little League season gets underway.

Ms. Fox stated, "I am extremely excited for all the new improvements coming to our Park facility. We truly appreciate the support from our Board members for allowing us to move forward with these improvements and also working with the King William Little League to create a great playing atmosphere for the youth of this county. The additions will not only look great but they will be great for our community to enjoy."

## CornerStone Thanks Dr. A.W. Lewis, III

The CornerStone Community Development Center in Aylett runs a food pantry, clothing shed, and a health clinic that includes dental, vision, and medical care for the citizens of King William and King & Queen counties.

Clients and patients are not charged for services.

The food program was started in 2000 by St. David's Church in the old Aylett post office. The free health clinic was started in 2002 by Dr. Thomas Hubbard of Ashland, who is both a physician and dentist. He approached the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia about starting a free dental clinic and recommended organizing one associated with the food bank.

Seeing the need in the area, Dr. Hubbard called on Dr. A. W. Lewis, III, a local physician, to handle the medical clinic and Dr. Hubbard would concentrate on the dental needs. Both these doctors are the mainstay of the clinic. There are clinics when Dr. Lewis sees no less than 18 to 20 patients and will sit for two to three hours to write up notes. Over the years Dr. Hubbard has done all partials and dentures for patients.

Executive Director Sheila Iswariah says

of Dr. Lewis, "Dr. Lewis is an extraordinary medical professional with a genuine, down to earth and caring disposition. His generosity of spirit is seen in the way he listens to his patients which is a wonderful prescription for good health in itself. Volunteer nurses and front desk staff are always in awe of his stamina at each clinic. When everyone is practically worn out at the end of four hours on any clinic date, Dr. Lewis settles in to write his notes on each patient and this probably takes him another two hours. All of us at the free clinic know that Dr. Lewis is known not only in Aylett but way beyond at overseas medical mission trips. He farms, cooks, spins and bikes and yet there are very few times when it is not difficult to reach him when a patient has a request or if one is in need of a quick consult. The CornerStone Free Health Clinic is extremely fortunate to have Dr. Lewis not only as their Clinic Director and is also indebted to him for his guidance, contribution and oversight of 'The CornerStone Community Development Center'.

## Manquin veteran heads to Aspen to push herself further-honor father

Manquin resident Jessica Oliff says the only limits she has are the ones she sets on herself. She sustained serious injuries while in the Army, including two deployments to Iraq—she is now paralyzed and dealing with the lasting effects of traumatic brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder and a stroke—but that

doesn't stop her from doing what she loves.

"I was hesitant to try [adaptive sports] at first, but then I attended the National Wheelchair Games and found out I could still do the activities I'd loved, I just had to find a new way to do them," said Oliff. "My adaptive sports therapist at VA encouraged me to sign up for the clinic because I think she knows I'm up for anything with my 'can-do' attitude."

While Oliff has participated in summer sports, the first time participant at the **National Disabled Veterans Winter Sports Clinic** will be trying many winter



adaptive sports – like skiing and sled hockey –for the first time. The 32nd annual event is scheduled for April 1-6 in Snowmass, and is a world-leader in adaptive winter sports instruction for U.S. military veterans and active duty servicemen and women with severe injury or illness.

A major supporter in Oliff's life was her father, who passed away only a month before the clinic. She said it's because of him and his constant encouragement that she decided to come to the clinic this year so soon after his death.

## CornerStone Thanks Carroll Lee Walker

This request came to the Country Courier from Executive Director Sheila Iswariah from the CornerStone Community Development Center in Aylett: "Your recent article in the last issue of CC about Carroll Lee Walker made me wonder if Mr. Walker is aware of all the love and care that flows out to people from within these walls of the former Southside Bank."



In 2013 Carroll Lee Walker not only opened the doors of the former Southside Bank to welcome "The Cornerstone" under one roof but he also covered the expenses of installing dental and vision equipment to facilitate the move. For years he has permitted the use of the building for a rental fee that is below the standard rate. This has allowed the free clinic to provide the care it has to patients who have no health insurance.

According to Ms. Iswariah, "Mr. Walker probably has no idea of all the good that happens within the walls of this old bank building." In addition to patients being seen regularly for medical and dental needs, all families are totally blessed throughout the year. Every August backpacks with school supplies are distributed to over 400 children. Over 400 turkeys are distributed at Thanksgiving. In 2017 about 1,500 children from ten counties, including King William, King & Queen and Essex, received gifts from the U. S. Marine Corp. Toys for Tots, which is a premier community action program.

Ms. Iswariah states, "From the many people who have been helped by the CornerStone and the staff at the Cornerstone, 'THANK YOU, MR. WALKER, FOR YOUR GENEROSITY TO YOUR FELLOW MAN.'"

## Drug Investigation Leads to Bust

On March 28, 2018, Sandra J. Jenkins, 46, was sentenced to 2 years of active incarceration in the Department of Corrections following convictions on four charges related her illegal distribution of drugs. An additional eighteen years of incarceration was suspended upon the condition that Ms. Jenkins follow the rules of probation for ten years after she is released from prison. The charges arose out of Ms. Jenkins's ownership and operation of "MJ's," a storefront business formerly located in Southridge Plaza in the Town of West Point.

A six-month investigation by the King William County Sheriff's Office and Twin - Rivers Drug Task Force led to Ms. Jenkins being indicted by the Multi-Jurisdictional Grand Jury for King William, King & Queen, New Kent, and Charles City Counties on September 20, 2017. After a one-day trial on January 18, 2018 in the King William Circuit Court, Ms. Jenkins was convicted of three counts possession with the intent to distribute cannabimimetic agents, also known as "synthetic marijuana" or "spice." She was also convicted of one count of conspiring to distribute these substances. Ms. Jenkins has been held in custody since her arrest at the end of September 2017.

The evidence presented at trial revealed that on February 7, 2017 and February 14, 2017, law enforcement officers from the King William County Sheriff's Office and the Twin-Rivers Drug Task Force conducted controlled purchases of "spice" from MJ's using a confidential informant. On February 17, 2017, a search warrant

was executed at the business, during which law enforcement seized hundreds of packets of items labeled "Cheap Trip" and "Vato Locos." Also seized were dozens of packages gummie style candies labeled "Chill Gummies." The seized items were analyzed by the Virginia Department of Forensic Science and found to contain cannabimimetic agents, Schedule I drugs. Business and personal records seized pursuant to search warrants demonstrated that these illegal controlled substances were the top-selling items at MJ's, bringing in thousands of dollars in profits to the store.

Lieutenant Timothy Hixenbaugh of the King William County Sheriff's Office testified for nearly three hours regarding the investigation of MJ's, the controlled purchases, and the execution of the search warrant. Lieutenant Hixenbaugh told the Court that he had received calls from individuals from Gloucester County and the Northern Neck describing how family members were purchasing "spice" from MJ's and then suffering from serious overdoses. The Lieutenant described how prior attempts to make controlled purchases in the store were thwarted by store employees, some of whom were openly carrying firearms. Ultimately, law enforcement was able to make purchases of the illegal drugs, leading to the search of the business on February 17, 2017.

The Office of the Commonwealth's Attorney thanks law enforcement for their efforts to shut down Ms. Jenkins' distribution of dangerous illegal substances. Without their excellent work, this case would not have succeeded in the manner it did.

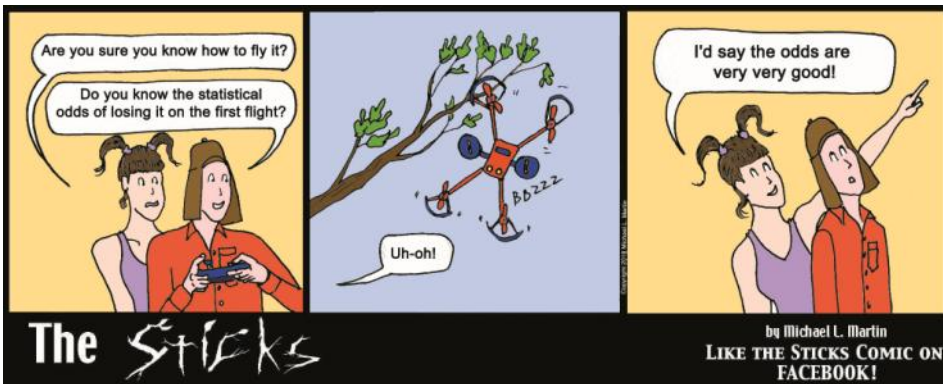

## Citizens & Organizations Weigh In On Proposed Budget & Tax Levy

It's budget time and the King William Board of Supervisors are busy going through each county department's request for funding for the coming 2018-2019 budget year. At the March 26th regular board meeting County Administrator Bobbi Tassanari presented the proposed 2018-2019 budget to the board. On April 2nd, a public hearing was held, and citizens along with organizations got their turn to give their input on the proposed budget and tax levy.

Six people stood before the board asking for increases in funding for their individual organizations. Bill Doyle representing Rappahannock Community College told the board 57 students from King William received their degrees last year from RCC and currently 412 King William residents are pursuing degrees. Bill asked for an additional \$235,000 to cover operating funds and capital projects. Bay Aging President Kathy Vesley requested their funding be restored to the \$7,800 level it was several years ago. Ken Pollock representing Bay Transit also asked for their funding to be restored to \$25,800. He said because of the cuts in funding last year they were not able to accommodate

1,854 rides for citizens.

Ann Kloeckner, the executive director of Legal Aide Works, also wanted their funding restored to the group's previous level of \$5,040. Tim Dice with Arts Alive in West Point however did not ask for additional funding but would welcome it. He stated, "Your continued support is appreciated." Audrey Mitchell with the Pamunkey Regional Library said it has been 10 years since her organization received an increase in funding.

Resident Beth Dandridge voiced her opposition to the proposed assessors office and a new fire house. She also thought employee raises should be merit based and not across the board. She felt the tax levy could be lowered 2 cents by not funding an assessors office and some capital projects.

Resident Charles Piersa thought the proposed budget was good overall. He was glad to see debt service addressed and agreed with the proposed tax levy.

The Supervisors will hold a budget work session on April 9th beginning at 7:00 pm, hold a day long work session from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm on April 13th, and vote on the final budget at its regular April board meeting.

## King William Sheriff’s Office Taking Back Unwanted Prescription Drugs

**Date:** April 28  
**Location:** The Central Crossing Shopping Center Located at 4915 Richmond-Tappahannock Highway

King William, Virginia – On April 28 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the King William Sheriff’s Office and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its 11th opportunity in six years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to the Central Crossing Shopping Center at 4915 Richmond-Tappahannock Highway. (The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.) The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

This initiative addresses a vital public

safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

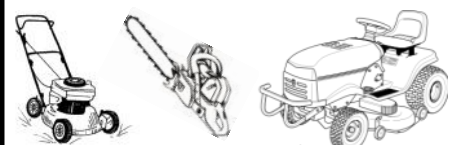

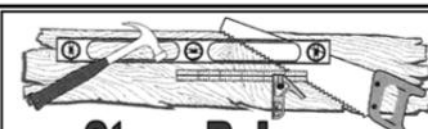
