





Registrar Speaks to Crime Solvers

At the April meeting of the Mattaponi Crime Solvers, King William County General Registrar Bobbi Langston was the keynote speaker and spoke on election security. Bobbi gave an overall view of the election process and the security measures that are set in place prior and during elections each year. All voting machines are calibrated and certified before each election then sealed and locked up at the courthouse. The voting machines and electronic poll books are not connected to the internet, therefore hacking into the machines via internet is not possible.

Bobbi stated King William currently has a little over 12,000 registered voters and six voting precincts. The Electoral Board oversees the election process and trains (with the help of the registrar) the approximately 40-50 officers of election (poll workers) working at the precincts each election.

Recently the Electoral Board met and elected their new officers for 2018. They are Chairwoman Drucilla Tate, Vice Chairman Eugene Rivara, and Secretary Gene Campbell. The Board is busy planning for the June 13th Primary elections.




