Simpkins Named Man of the Year by K&Q Republicans

The Republican Party of King and Queen County met at Rainbow Acres Recreation Hall on Tuesday, May 1, 2018, for its annual Man/Member of the Year meeting at 6 p.m. After a large catered dinner by Java Jacks of Tappahannock, Chairman Bill Rilee recognized Board of Supervisor Lawrence Simpkins as the guest speaker.

Mr. Simpkins talked about the newly approved 2019 budget of \$22,392,185, which is an increase of \$1,054,343. Across the board raises were approved for employees, especially the Sheriff's Department, in order to keep the trained and valuable employees now working for the county.

Capital improvements would be made without raising tax rates. A new EMS/fire station will be built in the Court House area for \$400,000, improvements at the Court House will cost \$200,000, and a new telecommunications center will cost about \$750,000.

For the good news for the county, Mr. Simpkins announced that King and Queen county officials and state officials met recently with Premier Tech, a world leader in the horticulture industry. In May

2016 Premier Tech acquired the manufacturing facility formerly owned by the German company ASB Greenworld in Mattaponi. The King and Queen plant is competing against another Premier plant in Minnesota that is also being considered by the company for expansion.

To Mr. Simpkins' surprise, Bill Rilee announced that Lawrence was being recognized as the Man of the Year by the King and Queen Republican Party. He was presented a plaque in appreciation of his dedication and contributions to the county over the years.

Fire Destroys Home on Etna Mills

Fire and rescue crews from King William and Mangohick responded to a residential fire in the 100 block of Etna Mills on Tuesday, April 24, 2018, at approximately 9:30 p.m. Based on information from dispatchers, the call was upgraded to add units from Caroline and Hanover counties.

First fire units arriving on scene found a two story residential structure fully involved in fire. It took about two hours

to bring the fire under control. In addition to Andy Aigner, Chief of Fire & Emergency Services, ten units from King William, Mangohick, Hanover, and Caroline responded. The fire is under investigation.

Chief Aigner said the fire was "manpower intensive" and the heat took a toll on the firefighters. There was one firefighter treated and released on scene for a heat related injury. No other injuries were reported.

Dear Editor,

As I recall, there was a time when statements like the following would be considered part of a comedy act i.e., 'Who's on First?' unfortunately, in King William the following is reality, and not funny.

The new 2019 County Budget, passed by a 3-to-2 vote Monday April 23rd has found a way to eliminate \$2,000,000 of the County 'unassigned-reserve funds,' that were over \$10,000,000, of your tax dollars. This, thanks in part, to our previous Board of Supervisors' tax hikes on your property.

Ask the Supervisors to find a way to return the money to you, the taxpayer; fat chance! Two holdovers of the Last Board members and one newly elected; voted for the following 2019 Budget line items:

The 2019 KW Budget provides the County Economic Development Authority (EDA) with a \$2,000,000 Budget 'set-aside' in 2019 for 'Economic Incentives.' No, not money returned to the taxpayer, but rather your cash to bring some yet unknown business to a place in the County that the EDA believes most appropriate. I can already hear a pig farm calling.

Once again there is a \$225,000 'set-aside' for Broadband Committee; and \$20,000 for a 'part-time' consultant, for the EDA. This on top of the approved \$20,000

Budget set-aside for the EDA members to travel, and interact with other Economic Development groups; not necessarily in Virginia.

In other words, about 0.18 cents of every 0.88 cents of our 2019 Property Tax revenues are now dedicated to the County Economic Development Authority, of which our County Administrator is the Secretary and Treasurer. Now ask yourself, how will this \$2,000,000 'infrastructure money' be spent?

Would part of it be for a new Fire Station and equipment i.e., fire engines, firefighting equipment, another EMS ambulance and equipment, etc.? Of course, not; who would think of such a way to subvert the 2019 Budget. Wait for it; remember it only takes three votes of the KWBoS to spend any or all of this taxpayer money doesn't it? What a coincidence!

The only restriction on spending the 'set-aside' is the approval of the three Board members, who voted to set-aside the monies in the first place. Do-the-math; but then again, maybe you should not.

A Stacked Deck

When the draft budget is presented by administrators, the deck is already stacked.

Three supervisors have never *initiated* any substantial reduction (\$5K+) in the budget since they were last elected. Oddly, two of these supervisors were active in the KW Democratic Party; but, now appear to depart from party ideals & shift the tax burden (through exemptions) to low/working/middle income households.

Had it not been for the "lists" developed by Hansen & Ehrhart while in office, it's doubtful any reduction in property tax would ever have been recognized. *The other 3 supervisors have yet to come to the budget session with a red pen (but instead a rubber stamp).*

Some specific illustrations are as follows.

At the April 13 budget session, Supervisor Greenwood ABSTAINED from voting on a \$120K increase in the budget for capital/funds to the fire department. By failing to vote (on something he previously opposed), the proposal to strike this increase died by a 2-2 vote.

As long as the school budget comprises ~45% of the budget and exemptions continue to shift taxes, no appreciable

reduction will ever be seen with the 3-2 imbalance. Opportunities to return "overtaxed revenue" or further reduce the burden to homeowners were rejected. Eliminating the vehicle tag fee alone would have reduced the school budget by ~\$300K and returned about \$60/year/household. This action has twice been rejected by 3 supervisors (one of who doesn't pay the tag fee to KW County).

A final perfect example of how easily your money is spent - when the budget was reduced by \$19K (P&R, DSS, & other areas)- 3 supervisors by the "nod of the head" on April 13 decided to keep that savings and contribute it to employee health care; this action was later affirmed by resolution #18-16 on April 23.

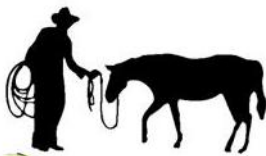

Supervisors Adopt FY 2018-19 Budget– Tabled Ordinance on Hunting deer with Rifles



County Administrator Bobbie Tassinari presents Budget Resolutions to the Board for approval.

The King William Board of Supervisors April 23 regular monthly meeting got off to a somewhat unusual start. Supervisor Greenwood was on vacation and advised Chairman Hodges in advance he would not be in attendance. Supervisor Moskalski made a motion which was seconded by Hodges to allow Greenwood to "call in" and participate in the meeting. According to County Attorney Dan Stuck, county policy allows Supervisors to miss two meetings a year for personal reasons. However Supervisors Hansen and Ehrhart thought Greenwood should be in attendance and therefore voted not to allow Greenwood to participate via phone. Therefore the motion was tied at 2 - 2 at that point. After much discussion Supervisor Ehrhart stated if allowing Greenwood to "call in" is consistent with county policy then he would vote for the motion. Motion was approved 4 - 0.

A public hearing was conducted on the proposed adoption of Ordinance #02-18 to amend the county code to allow the use of rifles 0.23 caliber or larger for deer hunting if the hunter is in an elevated stand at least 10 feet above ground level. Six people spoke during the public hearing, three in favor of the ordinance and three against the ordinance. Supervisors agreed it has been a hot topic and people have strong feelings "for and against" the ordinance. Supervisor Moskalski moved to table the decision to allow more time for research and allow people in favor of the ordinance to educate people against the ordinance. Motion to table was approved 4 - 1 (Hansen dissenting).

In other matters Supervisors :

1. Approved by a vote of 3 - 2 (Hansen and Ehrhart dissenting) Resolution #18-15 adopting the County Operating Budget for FY 2018-2019. The budget totaled \$27,465,659

of which \$11,155,395 is designated for Schools and Education.

2. Approved by a vote of 5 - 0 Ordinance #01-18(R) adopting a reduction of 2 cents in the real estate tax rate from the current \$0.90 per \$100 of assessed value to \$0.88 per \$100 of assessed value (\$0.39 designated for the County and \$0.49 for the Schools) for calendar year 2018.

3. Approved by a vote of 3 - 2 (Hansen and Ehrhart dissenting) Resolution #18-16 adopting FY 2018-2019 Employee Health Plan. The County will contribute \$902,464 as the employer's contribution to health insurance while the employee will contribute the remaining \$248,194 for a total cost of \$1,150,656.

4. Approved by a vote of 4 - 1 (Hansen dissenting) Resolution #18-17 approving the FY 2018-2019 Revised County Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual.

5. Approved by a vote of 4 - 1 (Hansen dissenting) Resolution #18-18 adopting the County Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for FY 2019-2023. The CIP is a long range planning plan subject each year to review and approval (except for those projects specifically approved and funded in the FY 2018-2019 budget appropriation process). Included in the FY 2018-2019 budget is \$2,000,000 for infrastructure for business development.

6. Approved by a vote of 3 - 2 (Hansen and Ehrhart dissenting) Resolution #18-19 Appropriating the County Operating Budget for FY 2018-2019.

County Fire & EMS Chief Andy Aigner presented to the Board the March 2018 Fire and EMS Call Statistics. The next meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be its regular meeting on May 28 at 7pm in the County Administrative Bldg. There will be no work session on May 14.

Pine Savannah Restoration Funding Available for Local Landowners

Picture yourself on a crisp May morning. The sun is shining as you walk through your mature loblolly pine forest, keeping an eye on your old bird dog just up ahead. Unlike the thick loblolly stands that cover much of the county, this forest is different. It isn't dark and it lacks the typical thick layer of pine needles under your feet. Much to the contrary, you take notice of how majestic the stand is. The canopy is wide open and sunlight scatters all around you. The trees are getting towards sawtimber stage, ready for harvest in a few years, and their lower bark bares a black charring. Fire has been here. You see emerging vegetation all around you – broomsedge, goldenrod, boneset, partridge pea, blackberry – so much so that a stranger might never guess the place was burned just a few months ago. What a paradise!

Yes, this could be you. Whether a hunter, non-game enthusiast or all-round wildlife conservationist, you could have similar experiences. Maybe your dog is simply a happy old lab taking an early morning stroll. Or perhaps you are just enjoying a walk in the woods with your grandchild. Whatever be the case, you too could manage this unique ecosystem that we call a pine savannah along with all its associated game and non-game wildlife. Savannahs are a native ecosystem that have been fairly extirpated from the state over the past few centuries, but you can help bring them back to your own property. Our team has already helped other Coastal Plain landowners achieve their dreams to great success as seen here and are always looking to do more.

There are trade-offs, of course – financial and

in terms of management. Simply put, the more pulpwood you take out, the less potential sawtimber you have for future harvest. And pine savannah habitats do require more work with understory spraying, firebreak establishment and rotational prescribed burning all necessary to keep the ecosystem in shape. Thankfully, there are various state and federal programs to help you achieve this goal. The federal Environmental Quality Incentives Program provides incentives for marking the timber, the thinning itself, as well as associated management practices. The state Forestry Quail Habitat Recovery Cost-share Program also offers assistance for practices such as understory spraying and prescribed burning. Essex, King and Queen, and King William are priority counties for both the state and federal programs. Finally, if you only want technical assistance, our team is glad to help you on that front as well. So do you want to create your own paradise for wildlife and your own enjoyment? Singleton to Speak at Mothers Day Service

Center Cross Church of God will be having a special Service on Mothers Day, Sunday, May 13th at 11:00 am. This years theme is "Mother's the Modern Day Hero", we are honored to have a true unsung hero as our special guest speaker Clarence Singleton.

He is a motivational speaker, author, retired United States Marine, veteran of the Vietnam War, and a Purple Heart recipient. Singleton is also a decorated former New York City Firefighter whose unit responded to the first attack on the World Trade Center in 1993, where he was credited with saving numerous lives. After retiring from the FDNY in 2000, Singleton volunteered for duty on September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Center, where he was seriously injured and was featured in One Nation: America Remembers September 11, 2001 by the authors of Life Magazine.

During his 22 years tenure with the New York City Fire Department (FDNY), he received a number of awards for bravery and outstanding initiative. When the World Trade Center was again attacked on September 11, 2001, donning his firefighter uniform Singleton voluntarily went to "Ground Zero" to help. Working at the base of the collapsed South Tower, along with another firefighter and a police officer, he extinguished numerous vehicle fires. While there, the second tower collapsed, seriously injuring Singleton. After being treated at a nearby hospital, Singleton made his way back to Ground Zero, seeing what he could do to help. Suffering from extensive injuries and post-traumatic stress disorder, Singleton decided to leave New York City and ultimately ended up in Midlothian, Virginia.

Recently he became a Director, on the Board of the Freedom Flag Foundation. This foundation was designed and created by Richard Nicholas Melito of Richmond, Virginia to memorialize the victims of the horrific events of September 11, 2001. A bill has been

signed into law by Governor Northam, and becomes effective 7/1/2018.

In August 2014 Mr. Singleton published his memoir "The Heart of a Hero". He covers his Journey from Vietnam to the World Trade Center Bombing to 9/11, he tells the harrowing story of former United States Marine and decorated New York City Firefighter from a hard- scramble childhood, through the jungles of Vietnam where he was awarded a Purple Heart, through the dust and rubble of Ground Zero on September 11 to hope and starting over. The book will be available for purchase following the morning service.
