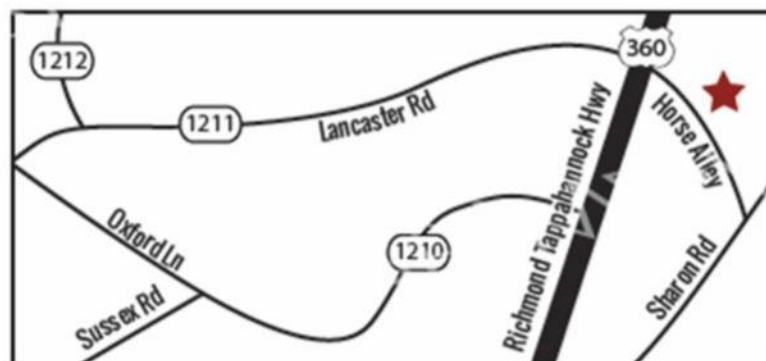

Getting Answers

VFW POST 9501 HOLDS VETERANS' MEMORIAL SERVICE

VFW Post 9501 of King William held its 20th Veterans' Memorial Service on Sunday, May 27, at the Caleb and Mary Pollard Family Veterans Memorial Park on Route 30.

Caleb and Mary Foster Pollard had four sons, Willie, Clinton, Eddie and David (who was killed in action on foreign soil) to serve in two major wars. The land that is home to the VFW was part of the Pollard family and was donated by a direct descendant of the Pollard family, Mrs. Eva Inez Pollard Atkins. The donation of property interests from Lt. Col. Lee and Mrs. Evelyn Vessels made the VFW building site a reality.

The guest speaker was Dr. Rodney Sidney, Director of Victims Abuse for the Essex County Sheriff's Department. Dr. Sidney has three Associate Degrees, two Bachelor Degrees, two Masters Degrees and two Doctoral Degrees. He has been very active in church and civic organization for many years. Given Dr. Sidney's broad experiences, his educational achievements, and his level of community engagement, he talked about helping to ensure the rights of victims.

Also on the program were two youth speakers. Jordan Waller, an eighth grader at Hamilton-Holmes Middle School, won the VFW Patriot's Pen Award. He read his submission to the group. He stated, "I am thankful for the many gifts America has given to my generation. I am thankful that I live in this great place that allows us to have so many different choices in life. I hope everyone takes the time to see how blessed we truly are living in America. I wouldn't want to live in any other place." The second youth speaker was Margaret Styles, a senior at King William High School, who won the local VFW Voice of Democracy Competition.

Hickman presented the Teacher Recognition to Virginia Harvey Young from King and Queen. She has been in the school system for many years, is an ordained minister and is one of the singers with Cora Harvey, a well known gospel singer from the northern end of King and Queen.

Three scholarships for \$1,000 each were presented by VFW member Cecelia Johnson. Two of the students, Briana Harvey and Taylor Hill, were from King and Queen Central High School. The King William student, Lamont Harris, has completed high school and his first year at Rappahannock Community College.

The Memorial Roll Call of deceased veterans from King and Queen and King William was read by Carolyn Brown and Colleen Williams with a bell chiming after each name. The bell chiming was done by Past Post Commander Fred Brown.

The posting of colors was done by JROTC from King and Queen Central High School. The Retiring of the Colors was done by AFJROTC from King William High School.

This event was well attended by family and friends of the deceased veterans. It was a time to stop and think of so many lives lost and still being lost each day so that we, as Americans, can feel safe and well protected. WE, AS AMERICANS, THANK ALL THOSE WHO GAVE AND ARE GIVING THEIR LIVES FOR US.

A few days ago I received a flyer in the mail from 1st District Congressman Rob Wittman titled "Important Updates for Virginia Seniors". 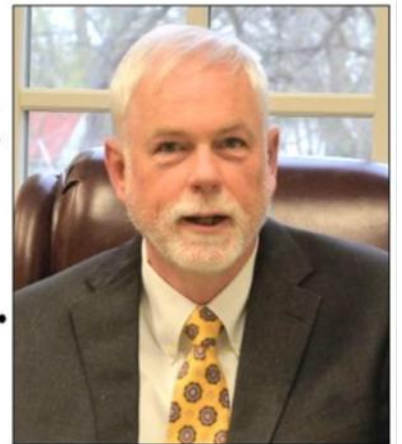

Upper Mattaponi Tribe Celebrates Heritage and Federal Recognition

On May 26 under a beautiful blue sky and billowing clouds looking like smoke signals, the 31st Annual Upper Mattaponi Tribe Spring Festival and Native American Pow-Wow got under way with the traditional Grand Entry at high noon. With the traditional color guard leading the way and chiefs/former chiefs directly behind them, the procession proceeded around the scared circle and stopped for the raising of the flags. Immediately after the raising of the flags all veterans in attendance were invited into the circle for a special walk/dance honoring their service and sacrifice in protecting America. After special remarks by Upper Mattaponi Chief Frank Adams and others, traditional dances such as the grass, jingle dress, fancy, and others were performed by tribal members (both men and women) in their colorful regalia.

This is the first Pow-Wow the Upper Mattaponi people have celebrated as a federally recognized tribe, securing that status in January when President Trump signed a bill granting federal recognition to not only the Upper Mattaponi tribe but to six other Virginia tribes as well.

I have missed only a couple of Pow-Wows and would take my father when he was not able to attend on his own. He loved the Pow-Wows and had the highest respect for all Native Americans. One of the highest honors of his life was in 2010 when he was honored at the Pow-Wow by then Chief Ken Adams and the entire Upper Mattaponi Tribe. Many thanks to the tribe for the respect they always showed to my father.

KW Supervisors Approve Extending Internet Service to Courthouse Complex

By Gene Campbell

At the May 21 King William Board of Supervisors meeting County Administrator Bobbie Tassanari requested approval to extend internet fiber from the Hamilton Holmes Middle School Complex to the courthouse complex. Lumos Networks is currently under contract with King William County Public Schools to bring fiber to Hamilton Holmes Middle School and King William High School. Extending the fiber line approx. two miles down to the courthouse complex and animal shelter will have a one time cost of \$50,000. In addition there will be a monthly recurring charge of \$2,786. Tassanari said this will provide better internet service to the courthouse complex and cost less than the current internet provider. The \$50,000 initial cost will come from a contingency fund set aside in the 2018 budget. The Supervisors approved the request by a 4-1 vote with Supervisor Hansen dissenting.

In other matters Supervisors:

1. Approved resolution 18-22 celebrating Bay Aging's 40th year of service to the community.

2. Approved by a vote of 4-1 (Supervisor Hansen dissenting) the appointment of EDA Vice Chairman Ed Moren to represent King William on the newly formed PamunkeyNet Advisory Team. The Team will not be a decision making body...only serving as thought-leaders and be communication

channels back to their local leadership. Supervisor Moskalski advised the Board the initial commitment of \$5,000 for the PamunkeyNet Project was reduced to \$3,726 due to the number of partners that have joined the project.

4. County Administrator Tassanari advised the Board the EDA is considering increasing the number of members on the Authority from seven to nine and also adding three ex-officio members. A joint meeting between the Supervisors and the EDA is scheduled at the June 11 work session.

5. Fire Chief Andy Aigner presented Fire and EMS call statistics for April 2018.

6. Approved by a vote of 3-2 (Supervisors Hansen and Ehrhart dissenting) the appointment of Garland Jenkins of West Point to fill an unexpired term on the EDA ending on June 30, 2019.

7. Approved by a vote of 4-0 (Supervisor Hodges abstaining) the reappointment of Brian Hodges to the EDA for a four year term expiring June 30, 2022.

8. Approved by a vote of 5-0 the reappointment of John Breeden to the Planning Commission for a four year term expiring June 30, 2022.

The next meeting of the King William Board of Supervisors is a work session scheduled for June 11 beginning at 7pm at the County Administrative Bldg,

Agriculture Leader Longest Died in April

Virginia's agricultural finance leader H. Earl Longest, died April 23, 2018. He was the retired Chief Executive Officer and President of Virginia's largest agricultural leader, Colonial Farm Credit, ACA, which had a base volume of \$470 million and an asset base of \$500 million when he retired.

Mr. Longest was promoted to CEO and President of the Richmond Farm Credit Association on January 1, 1977, which at that time had an asset base of \$67 million. He became the chief architect of the process to consolidate eight Farm Credit Associations (six in Virginia and two in Southern Maryland) into the Colonial Farm Credit, ACA, on September 1, 1988. The chartered territory included 53 counties and cities with thirteen branch offices in Virginia and three in Southern Maryland.

Mr. Longest had provided leadership to Virginia's industry of agriculture for more than twenty years. He served as Chairman of the Governor's Agriculture Credit Committee, as President of the Virginia Agribusiness Council, the Virginia Forestry Association, the Friends of the Industry of agriculture, and the Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts. He served as a member of the Virginia Governor's Job Training Council, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Bay Private Industry Council, a member of the King and Queen county School Board, acting Chairman of the Southeastern National Association of Conservation Districts Research committee, member of the NACD Forestry Committee, and Executive Director of the colonial Agricultural Educational Foundation, Inc.

The agricultural and forestry industries have recognized Mr. Longest's leadership by awarding him the Outstanding Friend of the Industry of Agriculture in 1985, the Virginia Soybean Association's Outstanding Cooperative and Support Award in 1988, the Virginia Extension Service's State 4-H Alumni Award in 1988, the Virginia Agribusiness

Council's Distinguished Service Award in 1988, the Goodyear Award of Merit for Outstanding Accomplishment in Resource Conservation in 1989, the College of Forestry and Wildlife Resources, VPI, Appreciation Award in 1992, and the Virginia Council of Farmer Cooperatives' agribusiness Leadership Award in 1992.

Mr. Longest states that the most rewarding part of his agricultural finance career has been the opportunity it offered to help others, both customers and employees, reach their goals and the many friendships developed along the way.

He states that over the last twenty years he has seen the industry of agriculture's restructure from family owned and managed farms to large commercial operation. In this process, more than 60% of the farm operators were squeezed out by a political, monetary, and export policies over which they had no control.

If he could make wishes come true, he would have two. First, he would bring the Virginia agriculture and forestry industries together into one powerful organization. The two similar industries working together politically and economically would be the most influential groups, the industries have very little influence. Secondly, he would establish a Secretary of agriculture and Forestry in Virginia which would represent the interests of farmers and timber owners every time the Governor's cabinet met.

When asked what accomplishments in his career did he receive the most satisfaction, his quick answer is the three educational foundations to which he has provided leadership: the Colonial agricultural Educational Foundation with more than \$250,000 in assets, the funds and commitments, and the James R. Nichols Educational Endowment which has more support of other educational activities for rural youth.

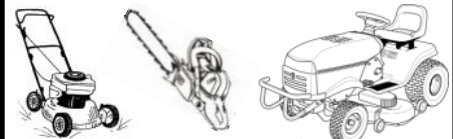

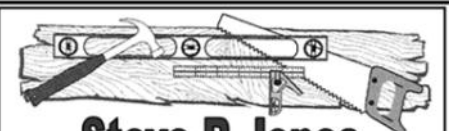

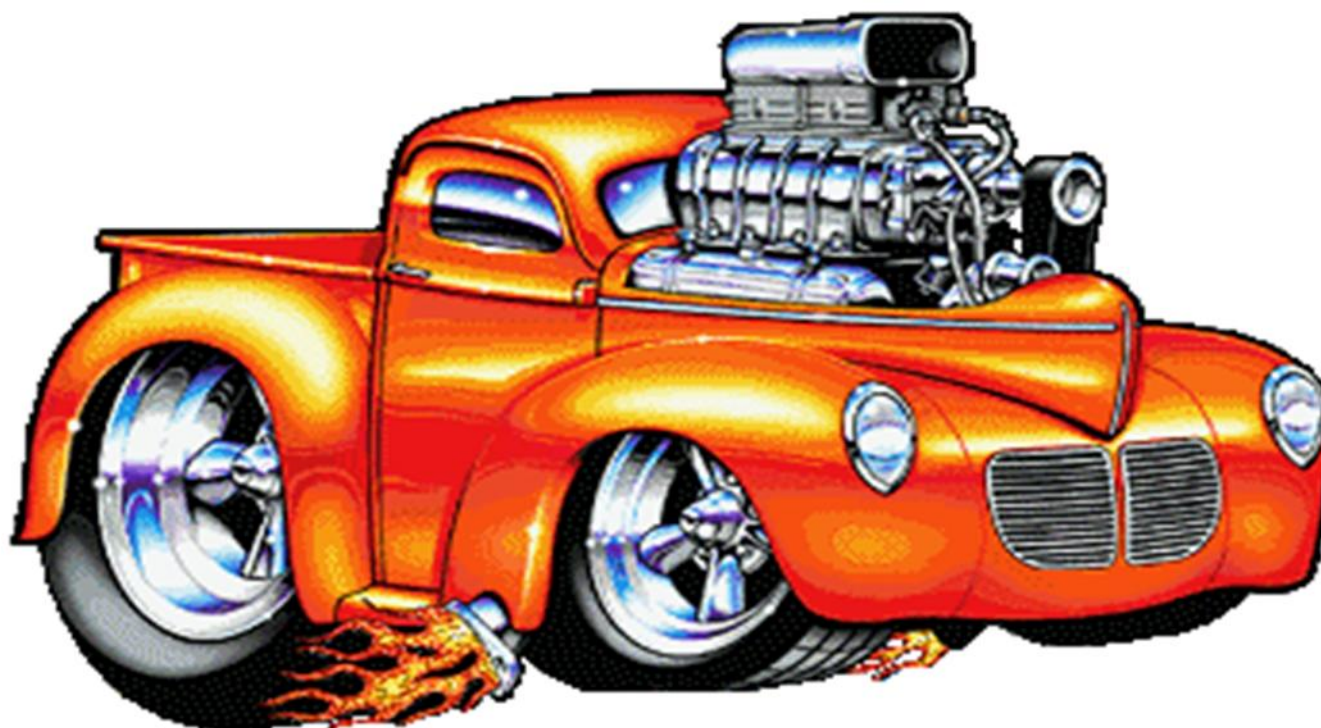
