Mr. Harris stated, "If it were not for these folks, I would not be here tonight. I could never thank you enough for what you have done." Mrs. Harris thanked the 911 L. to R. Chief Andy Aigner, BOS Chairman William Hodges, Curt Mason, Debbie dispatcher Tracy Curlee saying, " you helped to keep me calm while getting help to us so quickly."

The BOS also honored the life and service of Curtis Mason Sr. who passed away July 18th. Mason was the founding member of the Mattaponi Rescue Squad. Life Care transport was also recognized for their service to King William over the last four years.

During the comment period, Third District Supervisor Stephen Greenwood with sincere emotion recalled the time Curtis Mason responded to a life emergency situation at his home some years back. Bob Ehrhart, Fifth District Supervisor said, "There is a lot that goes on behind the BOS meetings. We want to see the citizens get involved and be a part of the process. We appreciate your interest and involvement." David Hansen, Fourth District Supervisor stated, "If we keep giving awards to every firefighter or EMS, we'll run out of paper! What did they do that's above and beyond what they are paid to do?" BOS Chairman William Hodges, First District said, 'I do not want to respond to Mr. Hansen's question as to what the service members did to deserve the recognition." Chief of Fire and EMS, Andy Aigner also refused to comment on Hansen's statement. 



Indian View Baptist Church Elects Hometown Minister as New Interim Pastor

For Immediate Release:

Change is inevitable, and last fall, for the first time in nearly ten years, Indian View Baptist Church, found itself without a senior pastor. Uncertain of where to turn, the congregation contacted a former guest revival preacher and King William native, Joshua S. Lewis to begin covering their Sunday worship services for them. After several months of worshipping together, the congregation extended an offer to Rev. Lewis to serve as their new Interim Pastor.

On Sunday April 1, during the Sunday morning worship service, Lewis accepted the offer of the congregation. For the past three months the congregation has seen a 25% increase in average Sunday attendance, a rise in new worshippers to the community and are on the verge of revamping their children's ministry and facilities. One of the challenges facing the church, Rev. Lewis says, is communicating to the general public that the historic church of the Upper Mattaponi tribe, is not just a tribal church, but is open to everyone in the community."

A pastoral transition is the perfect opportunity for a congregation to reassess who they are, and where they are going, Lewis said. The 76 year old congregation has rich cultural roots that are unique to most churches in Virginia, much less King William county.



"In the spring of the year 1780, the earth at the bottom of this sink suddenly gave way and fell into the cavity below, forming a circular aperture about the ordinary circumference of a common artificial well . . There being no artificial or natural means to prevent the earth immediately about the well from falling in, the aperture is greatly enlarged, forming a sloping bank, by which a man on foot can easily descend within eight or ten feet of the water






