On Monday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> the King William Board of Supervisors recognized EMS members for their role in saving the life of Mr. James Harris. Those recognized were Chief Andy Aigner King William Fire and Rescue, Captain Caleb Mason, Mattaponi Rescue Squad, Lieutenant Joshua Petree and 911 Dispatcher Tracy Pace Curlee.

Mr. Harris stated, "If it were not for these folks, I would not be here tonight. I could never thank you enough for what you have done." Mrs. Harris thanked the 911 dispatcher Tracy Curlee saying, "you helped to keep me calm while getting help to us so quickly."

The BOS also honored the life and service of Curtis Mason Sr. who passed away July 18<sup>th</sup>. Mason was the founding member of the Mattaponi Rescue Squad. Life Care transport was also recognized for their service to King William over the last four years.

During the comment period, Third District Supervisor Stephen Greenwood with sincere emotion recalled the time Curtis Mason responded to a life emergency situation at his home some years back. Bob Ehrhart, Fifth District Supervisor said, "There is a lot that goes on behind the BOS meetings. We want to see the citizens get involved and be a part of the process. We appreciate your interest and involvement." David Hansen, Fourth District Supervisor stated, "If we keep giving awards to every firefighter or EMS, we'll run out of paper! What did they do that's above and beyond what they are paid to do?" BOS Chairman William Hodges, First District said, "I do not want to respond to Mr. Hansen's question as to what the service members did to deserve the recognition." Chief of Fire and EMS, Andy Aigner also refused to comment on Hansen's statement. County Administrator, Bobby Tassinari said, "We want to thank the volunteers and Chief Aigner for all the great work they do. They all deserve a pat on the back!"

For those who have been to Vinny's recently and seen the Coming Soon sign on the door of the adjoining building, a new donut shop named K-Dub Donuts will be hopefully its doors probably by the end of August.

Jim Sitton, one of three owners of the new establishment, lived in King William for several years and found there was no place to take the family for ice cream, donuts, or good coffee. You had to ride to Mechanicsville, Tappahannock or West Point to find these items. He decided a donut shop that would have ice cream, fresh donuts, and good coffee blends was needed in King William.

A cousin who owns a donut shop in New Kent is helping him get started. The new donut shop will sell yeast donuts made on site, soft serve ice cream and custard, and specialty coffees including a Hawaiian Kona blend.

The new establishment will be open from 6 a.m. – 8 p.m. every day and night closings on weekends will be flexible. At this time Mr. Sitton is seeking bakers, managers, and front end workers – young people, young mothers or seniors – anyone looking for work part time during the day.

Mr. Sitton states, "I lived in Short Pump and came to King William as a lawyer. The people here are so friendly and everybody knows everybody. I like the friendly atmosphere. ## Indian View Baptist Church Elects Hometown Minister as New Interim Pastor

### For Immediate Release:

Change is inevitable, and last fall, for the first time in nearly ten years, Indian View Baptist Church, found itself without a senior pastor. Uncertain of where to turn, the congregation contacted a former guest revival preacher and King William native, Joshua S. Lewis to begin covering their Sunday worship services for them. After several months of worshipping together, the congregation extended an offer to Rev. Lewis to serve as their new Interim Pastor.

On Sunday April 1, during the Sunday morning worship service, Lewis accepted the offer of the congregation. For the past three months the congregation has seen a 25% increase in average Sunday attendance, a rise in new worshippers to the community and are on the verge of revamping their children's ministry and facilities. One of the challenges facing the church, Rev. Lewis says, is communicating to the general public that the historic church of the Upper Mattaponi tribe, is not just a tribal church, but is open to everyone in the community."

A pastoral transition is the perfect opportunity for a congregation to reassess who they are, and where they are going, Lewis said. The 76 year old congregation has rich cultural roots that are unique to most churches in Virginia, much less King William county.

Indian View was started as a church for the Upper Mattaponi Indian tribe and "will always celebrate that rich heritage. However, in order to continue thriving as a witness in the community, Indian View is beginning to aggressively communicate that it is a church for all people, ethnicities, and religious backgrounds", says Lewis.

Joshua S. Lewis, a resident of Mechanicsville, was born and raised in King William, Virginia. He relocated to St. Louis, Missouri in 1997 where he graduated from Lindenwood University with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in Christian Studies. In May of this year, Lewis graduated from Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia with a Master's of Divinity and is presently



applying for PhD programs that will allow him to conduct doctoral research in the field of theology.

A Pentecostal Christian, Lewis is pasturing his third church and his second Southern Baptist congregation. "I think most people are less concerned with what name is above their church and more concerned with how God can be realized in their everyday life. I don't think God is impressed with our church names or denominational titles. The average person isn't either" Lewis said.

According to Lewis, Indian View Baptist Church is on the verge of great things happening. The congregation is grateful for their historic past all the while excitedly reaching for their future.

*Should Our Elections be Secure and Legal?*

Given the brouhaha(s) surrounding foreign meddling in our country's elections, how would you feel if your Congressman voted to eliminate funding for Election-Security? Well it happened on Thursday, July 19<sup>th</sup>. 2018. Rob Wittman voted against adding Election-Security funds to a 2019 Budget for Environment, Treasury and District of Columbia after those Election-Security funds had been previously stripped out of that bill.

Also, were you aware of a bi-partisan House of Representative letter sent to President Donald Trump in February 2018 requesting the Federal Election Commission be fully staffed so that it could function? There are 6 positions at the FEC and only 4 are filled. So, because of the requirement that there be 50% Republicans and 50% Democrats, the FEC does not

have a proper quorum and nothing can be done. Created in 1974 through amendments to the **Federal Election Campaign Act**, the FEC describes its duties as "to disclose campaign finance information, to enforce the provisions of the law such as the limits and prohibitions on contributions, and to oversee the public funding of Presidential **elections**. So, without proper staffing this agency cannot protect us against illegal acts in past or future presidential elections. For your information Rob Wittman was not one of the signatories to the February letter requesting filling the empty positions and to the writer's knowledge he has not addressed the issue.

This again brings up questions. Is Rob Wittman a leader? Is he a follower? Does he represent us and our best interests?

## Heavy Rains could bring sinkholes

The Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals, and Energy reports that sinkholes have been reported in our state since colonial times.

*"In the spring of the year 1780, the earth at the bottom of this sink suddenly gave way and fell into the cavity below, forming a circular aperture about the ordinary circumference of a common artificial well . . . There being no artificial or natural means to prevent the earth immediately about the well from falling in, the aperture is greatly enlarged, forming a sloping bank, by which a man on foot can easily descend within eight or ten feet of the water*

*.... The whole depth of the cavity is thirty or thirty-five feet"* (Kercheval, 1850, p. 273).

As in several of the other locations of sinkholes around the U.S., Canada, and other countries, in Virginia sinkholes are associated with karst formations. The sinkhole photograph (from Virginia's DMME) shows a sinkhole that formed in Russell County, Virginia. According to the DMME, [quoting]

In Virginia the formation and modification of sinkholes (also known as sinks, dolines and dolinas) is a natural process in areas underlain by limestone and other soluble rock. The location and rate at which sinkholes form can be affected by man's activities.

Sinkholes are basin-like, funnel shaped, or vertical-sided depressions in the land surface. In general, sinkholes form by the



*The most damage from sinkholes occurs in Florida, Texas, Alabama, Missouri, Kentucky, Tennessee and Pennsylvania, according to the U.S. Geological Survey.*

subsidence of unconsolidated materials or soils into voids created by the dissolution of the underlying soluble bedrock.

The rock exposed in a collapsed sinkhole is usually weathered and rounded, but some sinkholes contain freshly broken rock along their steep sides. Freshly broken rock may indicate that the sinkhole has formed by the collapse of a cave (naturally occurring) or a mine (man-made).

Where sinkholes and caves have formed by the dissolution of soluble rock, such as limestone, dolomite, and gypsum, surface water is uncommon and streams may sink into the ground.

This type of topography, formed by dissolution, is referred to as karst terrain. In karst terrain, sinkholes are input points where surface water enters the groundwater system.

## DGIF Officers Assist in Multiple Person Rescue on Lake Anna

RICHMOND- On July 21, The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) Conservation Police Officers Katiana Quarles and Daniel Eller responded to a call regarding several persons who were missing from their boat on Lake Anna. Once the officers arrived on scene, they observed two boats, one of which had several occupants and was actively attempting to assist another boater with dislodging his grounded boat. Two of the occupants of the assisting boat were in the water and utilizing ropes in an attempt to dislodge the grounded boat. Luckily, the assisting men were wearing their lifejackets while in the water. Wearing your lifejacket (PFD) can save your life so DGIF urges anyone in/on the water to always wear one! As wind began to make the current unbearable, DGIF officers acted quickly when they noticed the two men in the water begin to struggle as the now dislodged boat quickly made its way back out to deeper water. The men attempted to swim out to the boat but given the strong current, were unable to reach it. Officers Quarles and Eller pulled up alongside the men in order to get the stressed boaters into their patrol boat. They were able to get the first man inside the boat and noticed his PFD was on incorrectly. The other man had floated further away from the first individual, so our Officers made their way over to him. As they tried to save the man who had floated further away, they observed that his PFD was not fully buckled which made it difficult for him to reach the patrol boat. Officer Eller threw him a

stern rope and pulled him around the motor towards the ladder. As he got closer to the ladder, the struggling man let go of the Officer's rope and began sinking under the water; with his PFD now the only thing Officers were able to see. The man attempted to say he could not make it before going under, which was at the same time Officer Eller was able to grab his PFD and pull him back up to the water surface, and then to the ladder. As the officers got the second man into the boat, Officer Quarles noticed a third man, who had been assisting on the now dislodged boat and subsequently fell overboard, in the water without a PFD. As the wind and currents remained strong, and getting stronger by the minute, Officers had no time to waste in order to get this man to safety. Officers reached the exhausted man and attempted to help him get into their boat. Officer Quarles searched for a rescue device to throw the man and Officer Eller kept trying to move the patrol boat closer to him. At this time, the man's face was underwater and he began choking as he gasped for air. Officer Quarles jumped from the patrol boat into the rough waters with the flotation device and swam toward the man. She reached the unconscious man, turned him around and started life saving measures to get a response. During this frantic time in the water, Officer Eller was asking DGIF dispatch to send assistance.

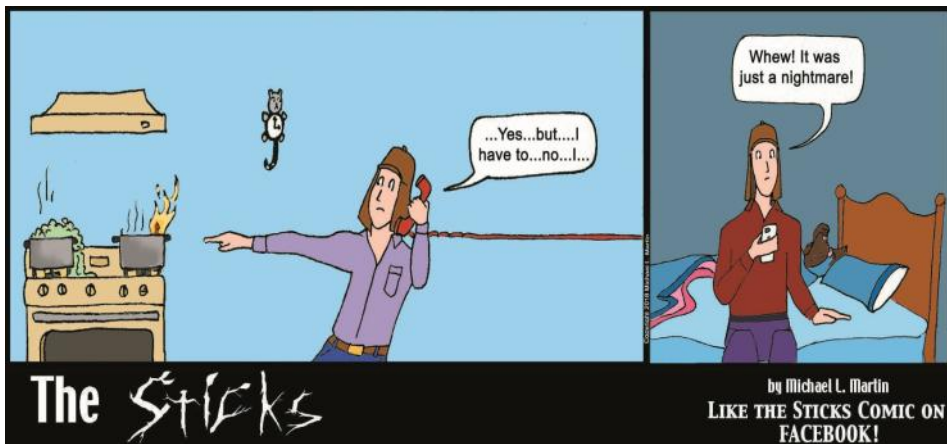

## Electric Co-op Members File Legal Challenge Against Rappahannock Electric Cooperative

*SCC filing seeks a preliminary injunction to allow members to vote on reasonable reforms*

Fredericksburg, Virginia - Three co-founders of the Repower REC campaign today filed a petition with Virginia's State Corporation Commission (SCC), alleging that Rappahannock Electric Cooperative (REC) is improperly blocking their efforts to reform the largest electric co-op in Virginia. After months of attempted engagement during which time REC's full board refused to participate in dialogue, the Repower REC members are asking the SCC to allow member-owners to pursue meaningful reform. The reform efforts, which have gained the support of nearly 200 member-owners since the campaign launched in May, focus on bringing increased transparency, financial accountability, and member control to the co-op.

The petition asks the SCC to issue an injunction requiring REC to allow the proposed bylaw amendments from Repower REC's co-founders be put before the co-op's membership for a vote. The bylaw amendments would allow co-op members to observe board of directors' meetings, receive financial disclosure of board-member compensation, and clarify the proxy ballot process for board elections. This, the petition alleges, would uphold "the policies of democratic control and member participation" that are embodied in Virginia law pertaining to electric cooperatives.

The petitioners are longtime REC members Brigadier General John Levasseur (US Army, retired), Dr. Michael Murphy (a retired educator), and Seth Heald (a retired lawyer). General Levasseur served on REC's board of directors for more than three years. They are represented by the non-profit public interest law firm Appalachian Mountain Advocates.

"All we're asking is that REC's board members live up to the cooperative principles they claim to follow. It's a shame we've had to file this petition to do that," Dr. Murphy said. "We attempted to discuss our proposed reforms with the full board, but were told that the board did not want to engage in a 'dialogue' with us. We're hoping our SCC filing will lead eventually to a constructive dialogue with board members, and significant reforms at REC."

One of the largest electric co-ops in the United States, REC provides electric service to more than 160,000 member-owners in portions of 22 Virginia counties. Electric cooperatives are by definition member-governed electric utilities in which customers have a significant voice in governance and decisions affecting

electric rates and other important financial decisions. Virginia law and REC's bylaws both authorize REC members to propose bylaw changes for membership vote. But, the petition alleges, REC's board of directors has improperly refused to allow the member-owners to do so.

One of the three proposed bylaw amendments would clarify REC's election proxy ballot by ending the current practice of treating signed but otherwise blank proxy forms as delegating the member's voting authority to the board of directors. Another proposed bylaw amendment would require REC to disclose in its member publication the total compensation paid annually to each board member. The third bylaw proposal would require REC to allow co-op members to observe REC board meetings, in person or through online streaming. "We're proposing modest, reasonable reforms," Heald said. "Virginia law grants electric co-op members the right to propose bylaw amendments for a membership vote. REC's board exceeded its authority in barring us from exercising that basic right."

"Transparency and fair elections are the cornerstone of a properly functioning democratic co-op," General Levasseur said. "It's unfortunate that REC's board has denied co-op members their right to submit these pro-democracy reforms for members to vote on."

Repower REC is a grassroots coalition formed in response to the REC board's history of secrecy and undemocratic practices. The coalition's purpose is simple: To promote a more transparent and democratic Rappahannock Electric Cooperative by helping our fellow REC members reclaim their roles as owners of a democratically controlled, transparent cooperative, and to advocate for the fair and equitable treatment of distributed energy resources such as rooftop solar.

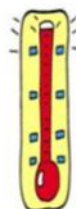

Once Officer Eller and the two previously rescued victims were finally able to get within a safe distance to Officer Quarles and the unresponsive man in the water, they all tried to help get this man in the boat. At this point, the two other victims that had previously been rescued jumped back into the water to try to help Officer Quarles rescue the drowned man. Not only are we trying to save a possible drowning victim and keep our Officers safe, there are now two more people in the water who had already been rescued once. Officer Eller managed to get the group to the stern of the boat while hanging on to each other.

At just that second, the unresponsive man started coughing and showing signs of life. As the Officers patiently waited until Spotsylvania Rescue returned, everyone eventually made it carefully into a patrol boat and transported to safety. The selfless, quick actions of Officer Quarles and Eller resulted in three lives being saved that day. Conservation Police Officers and Officers in general, spend each day protecting the citizens of the Commonwealth and beyond.

They are not thinking about what is best for them and in this situation, it is perfectly clear that our Officers had one

thing on their minds: saving the lives of people just out for an afternoon boat ride. Mr. Hector Flores, from Maryland, who was the unresponsive man in the water, is grateful to Officer Quarles for saving his life. "I always have life jackets aboard my boat. However, when I went in the water to assist another boater, I had no idea I would need it. In hindsight, this was a mistake on my part. From now on, I will wear my life jacket and I encourage others to do the same. I am so thankful to the female Officer [CPO Katiana Quarles] that saved my life and to the others from her agency [DGIF] that came to my rescue." DGIF wants everyone to be safe on the water which means ALWAYS wearing your lifejacket. There are many different types and fits so we urge you to take some time to find one that is right for you.

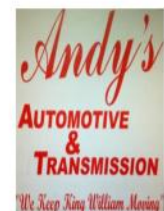

On Tuesday, July 24, 2018 at approximately 5:30 p.m. an Undercover Narcotics Operation was set into place by the King and Queen County Sheriff's Office, where an undercover/confidential informant made a purchase of a white crystal-like substance believed to be crystal meth from a residence on The Trail in King and Queen County.



After the purchase, a search warrant was issued for the residence. At 8:52 p.m. the King and Queen County Sheriff's Office executed a search warrant at 17203 The Trail in the area of King and Queen Courthouse, the home of Russell William Vonwald. Russell Vonwald was not at the residence at the time the search warrant was executed. During the search warrant, a larger amount of crystal-like substance believed to be crystal meth was found along with other items used in the distribution of methamphetamine. The evidence will be submitted to the Virginia Department of Forensic Science for analysis.

Two subjects were placed under arrest; Russell William Vonwald and Crystal Lee Pardue without incident and taken to the King and Queen County Sheriff's Office for processing.
