
Publisher's Message





The Grand Marshal of the parade was Ralph Baylor, the honorary mayor of Walkerton. He has lived in the Walkerton and St. Stephens area all of his life and is an usher at New Morning Star Church. Since 1985 he has worked at Scott's Store in Walkerton and King William Pharmacy in Aylett for 24 years. Years ago he worked at a store/service station across from Scott's Store. When a fire call would come into the store/service station, he would go to the fire house behind the store and sound the fire siren, sometimes riding to the fire and helping the volunteer firemen fight the fire. Everyone loves Ralph around Walkerton because he always has a smile on his face whether he knows you or not.

After the parade everyone gathered behind the Post Office. Emcee Gene Campbell welcomed everyone and introduced Mr. Baylor. Mr. Campbell also told the crowd this was the second year that the firemen did not have a queen who raised money for the department. A letter campaign was started in 2017 that raised over \$40,000. The department is planning to replace an older fire engine with a newer style Rescue Engine that will carry more equipment and personnel to better serve the citizens during emergencies. This rescue engine will cost about \$470,000 with an expected delivery time of 12 - 18 months.




