Pamunkey Tribe Receives New Weather Station from USDA NRCS and BIA

Group Shot: A multi-state team from USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and representatives from six tribes gathered on Pamunkey tribal land September 11-12 for a hands-on training activity to set up and operate a new Soil Climate Analysis Network (SCAN) weather station.

As the first stewards of the land, American Indians have a particular interest in sustainable agriculture and environmental conservation. The Pamunkey Tribe now has a new tool for making good land management decisions, courtesy of their friends at USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

A DJ played music throughout the day from the stage and where the prizes for the car show were presented at 12 noon. One of the vendors was Rappahannock Electric Cooperative from Bowling Green showing a 2017 Electric Chevy Bolt. Representatives Jimmy Cecil and Stuart Schools were promoting the savings using electricity instead of gas. The fuel cost per mile for electricity for the Chevy Bolt would be \$.04 per mile compared to \$.08 per mile for a compact gas car.





On hand Tuesday night September 11th was First Congressional District Congressman Rob Wittman who presented Club President Ronnie Moore with a Congressional Resolution honoring the club's anniversary. Delegate Chris Peace also commended the club for its accomplishments and service to the community. He surprised deceased member James Townsend's family represented by his wife Rebecca and son Langdon with a General Assembly Resolution honoring James for his service and dedication to the club and community.

After a delicious meal it was time to reminisce. The club's Annual Fish Fry was started on April 11, 1939 on the banks of the Mattaponi River at club member Ben Garrett's cabin, later moved up river to my father's cottage and continues today at the club's facility on Rt. 30. During World War II club members trained as "minute men" at club meetings by shooting balloons across the Mattaponi River. In 1949 the Club was largely responsible for the building of the Community Building next to the old high school which was demolished in 1976 to make way for the new high school. At one time in the 1980's the club had over 100 members and was the largest club in the Ruritan organization. In 2008 the club's present facility on Rt. 30 was dedicated.

The highlight of the night was the presentation of fifty year service badges by Ruritan National President Guy Cox to four senior members of the club. Two of the four members were present, namely Bob Stevens (50 years) and Drew Pollard (50 years). Not present were B. W. White, Jr. (66 years) and

Erwin "Tootsie" Campbell (58 years).

The King William Club has been true to the Ruritan motto "to promote fellowship, goodwill and community service" as they have donated over \$450,000 to the community from their fund raising events such as the fish fry, shrimp feast, steak feast, catfish fry, Oktoberfest, Stew and Q, Brunswick stew sales, golf tournaments, gun raffles, and catering of local events. Most recently the club has sponsored a National Night Out every year. The club continues to be a leader among organizations in the community. Ruritan is a National Civic Organization with over 1,200 clubs and 30,000 members east of the Mississippi.



Middle Peninsula Family Day

The Virginia Economic Development Partnership team visits the Middle Peninsula Region to learn about its potential for job creation!

"We learned so much about the Middle Peninsula's 'blue/green economy'! That's what representatives of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership said after spending a full day experiencing a few unique venues in Middlesex, Mathews and Essex Counties and the Town of Tappahannock.

Three representatives from VEDP's Business Investment Division spent the day sailing on the water, creating art, learning the history of boatbuilding, and meeting with business and civic leaders. VEDP's BI Division is responsible for marketing the regions of the Commonwealth to businesses which may want to expand or locate and create jobs. One of the ways the BI managers understand the types of businesses that could locate here, is by personally visiting the Region and learning about its workforce, its transportation, its agriculture, marine and aquaculture businesses, and the vision that its leaders have for creating a sustained, healthy economy.

Michael Kucera and Anton Webre of *Norton Yachts* in Deltaville (Middlesex County) started the day off with a sailing excursion that showcased the beauty of the Middle Peninsula's rivers and the impact of aquaculture and marine trades on our

economy. The team was then hosted by the *Deltaville Maritime Museum* and received a guided tour from Board member Bill Powell, learning about the importance of the boat-building history. "We are so proud of these local assets," Middlesex Tourism and Economic Development Manager Michelle Brown said. "Business owners like Michael and Andre, and volunteers like Bill, are the heart of what makes our community so special."

Bay School Community Arts Center in Mathews County showcased its unique position as the heart of the Middle Peninsula's artisan network by offering the VEDP team members the opportunity to create their own art to take home as a reminder of this cultural gem. EDA Board member Hal Bourque, Mathews County Visitors Information Center Director Emily Allen and the Bay School's Executive

Director Pam Doss hosted the event. VEDP team members also received a tour of Mathews' newest lodging venue, the Callis House Inn. This special community presents a valuable sense of place that is so important to entrepreneurs and businesses.

Ending the day in Tappahannock, the team members met over a casual dinner at the *Essex Inn* with business and civic leaders, including Delegate Keith Hodges, Tappahannock Mayor Roy Gladding, Essex Board of Supervisors Member Rob Akers, Essex EDA Member Bill Croxton and staff Trent Funkhouser, Rappahannock Community College Workforce VP Jason Perry, and Ronnie Gill from Farm Credit and a member of the Essex County Agricultural and Economic Development Committee. Discussions about the agricultural and forest base of the northern portion of the Region helped the VEDP team understand the "green" of the Middle Peninsula's "blue/green economy".

"Connecting with the VEDP staff is important to our Region, as VEDP is the Commonwealth's primary connection to new businesses who are looking for locations in which jobs can be created," said Travis Moskalski, Chairman of the Middle Peninsula Alliance. "We are pleased that our partner communities participate and

showcase their assets so effectively. This time, we thank Middlesex County, Mathews County, Essex County and the Town of Tappahannock for their involvement. In previous visits by VEDP staff, our other local partners of King William County, Gloucester County, the Town of West Point, and King & Queen County have taken similar steps. We believe these visits help bring visibility to our Region and will ultimately lead to new job creation."







A wide variety of cars and pickups made for interesting conversations among owners of the vehicles and the community.

One of the most interesting cars was a white 2013 Subaru BRZ owned by Lynne Barnette from New Kent. The license plate reads UNGORKD - her favorite wine. She says her husband told her this is her toy that she can decorate. Her car is adorned with pink over calipers, a pink engine cover and a pink striped American flag. Her husband has his car but she allows him and her son to ride with her - but no shoes or no eating inside the car.

Probably the oldest vehicle was a 1935 Ford painted Viper Red and owned by John Fulwider from Mechanicsville. A

local car was a red 1950 Ford coupe owned by Eppa Wimbish of Turpin, Va. (HISTORY NOTE; Turpin, Virginia is located at Route 30 and Venter Road..

According to Mr. Wimbish, the name Turpin is located at this location on state maps and is named for a Dr. Turpin who was a local doctor who lived in this area in a big house and had his medical practice there in the early 1900's.)



“I still laugh about that day,” Nelson said. “I’ll always remember it; not for the unpleasant smell and the look of horror on my mother’s face, but for the realization I had. I knew at that moment that I loved animals and wanted to work with them in the future.”

Since 1979, Nelson has worked as a licensed funeral director, helping his clients work their way through the grief associated with losing a loved one. One day while on the job, Nelson said he came to a realization of sorts.

“There’s a whole industry built around providing support and empathy to people who lose friends and family members,” Nelson said, “and even though our pets are often an extension of our family, there’s not any type of support system in place to help pet owners get through the grief of losing their faithful friend. I want to change that.”

From that day forth, Nelson has worked to combine his two passions – helping families overcome tough times and caring

for animals. That dream has led to the opening of Caring Pet Cremation Services.

Pamunkey Chief Robert Gray plans to use the new weather station to better manage their lands and enhance community engagement by providing data for the local community. This is the fourth tribal weather station to go online nationwide.

NRCS staff from eight states joined representatives from six tribes for a hands-on training activity on September 11-12 to set up and install a new Tribal Soil Climate Analysis Network (TSCAN) weather station on Pamunkey land. Sited in King William County, it is only the fourth such station set up nationwide through a partnership with NRCS and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA).

TSCAN is a cooperative effort between NRCS, BIA, and selected tribes to coordinate placement of these climate stations to:

1. Provide localized soil and climate data for agricultural and forestry management decisions
2. Strengthen tribal outreach to support production management as well as Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education, and
3. Build and strengthen partnerships and alliances.

"We were particularly interested in the weather station because of the information it can give us to manage our land and the opportunities to engage with the local community by making the data available to them," said Chief Robert Gray.

The solar-powered TSCAN stations monitor soil temperature and moisture as well as atmospheric data like air temperature, wind speed/direction, rainfall, and solar radiation. Once the station is up and running, data will be

stored and made available online through the NRCS Soil Climate Analysis Network (SCAN) website. This project is also developing a web-based platform to link SCAN and TSCAN data to tools useful for agricultural production. These resources include growing degree days, livestock heat index, and drought data. It will also provide a forum for tribal students to enhance their scientific understanding of climate, land use, and associated technology.

Deb Harms, Hydrologist Team Leader for the NRCS National Water and Climate Center is providing technical direction for the project, which may include up to 30 stations over the next two years. She and her team selected components to create the stations and are providing installation training for setting up the units. They will also offer follow-up assistance to tribes and make the station data available online.

The first two TSCAN training sessions were held at the Tule River Reservation in California and Lower Brule Sioux Reservation in central South Dakota. The Virginia station joins three others deployed in Rhode Island (Narragansett Indian Tribe), Wisconsin (Bad River Band of the Lake Superior Chippewa), and western New York (Seneca Nation of Indians).

The Pamunkey received federal recognition in 2015, establishing a government-to-government relationship with USDA agencies and access to an array of programs/services.

Wittman Holds Veterans Forum in Hanover
