A Veteran Among Us: Lanny G. "BO" Herrel

Lanny G. "Bo" Herrel, was born on May 22, 1950 in Delbarton WVA to Ray and Westa Herrel. He had 3 brothers (Older twin brothers Jack and Bob and baby brother Randy) when the family moved to Bellevue, Ohio. He grew up with a strong sense of loyalty to his country and always knew he wanted to join the military to serve.

He graduated from Bellevue High School in 1968 and joined the US Air Force strategic air command. "It was payback time", he said after watching his high school buddies coming home in body bags. After Basic training in San Antonio, TX, he was deployed to Phan Rang, Vietnam in August of 1969. There he worked as a Jet Fuel Specialist until August of 1970 and achieved the rank of sergeant. He participated in the fueling of jets, was on flying status to deliver fuel bladders to army outposts, pulled daily perimeter duty, and loaded bombs. (They had "the pleasure of a magic marker" and wrote "customized" messages for the bomb's recipients).

Congratulations Brooks - \$1,000,000 Lotto Winner

Kelley Brooks of King William bought a Mega Millions winner after her husband Larry sent her a reminder text to pick up a ticket. While the Brooks' ticket did not match all the numbers in this week's historic \$1.6 billion drawing, it matched enough to earn the couple \$1 million – a fact Kelley learned after she received another text from Larry. "You won!" the text read. "No, I didn't!" was her reply. But when she learned it was true, "I was shaking," she said. "I couldn't believe it!" Kelley bought the winner at Chill Stop in Central Garage. She used Easy Pick and let the computer choose her numbers. "I still feel the same way," she said when she picked up her big check. "I'm still going to be the same person."

The Virginia Lottery said in a statement that the chances of matching the first five numbers in Mega Millions are 1 in 12,607,306. The Virginia Lottery generates more than \$1.6 million daily for public schools across the state, Mega Millions lottery drawings take place Tuesday and Friday nights at 11:00p.m.

The Chill Stop was awarded \$10,000 for selling the winning ticket. The Brooks said in a press release that they have no immediate plans for their winnings.



Dear Editor,

Show Me the Money

To those touting the claim, “we have the money” here is more accurate depiction.

1) At the start of this budget cycle, King William had an unreserved fund balance of ~\$10 million (the Board has since appropriated 2 million to the capital improvement plan).

2) The county operating budget has increased the last two years.

3) In September [and not support by me], all non-essential program funding was restored from the budget reduction two years ago.

4) Change order costs for Hamilton Holmes School (including potential roof repairs not originally identified) will now likely exceed the budget line (*I'm the only supervisor who did NOT approve these additional costs*).

5) Additional funds are anticipated due to Medicaid expansion (~\$11K locally in 2020).

6) Another budget increase will likely come from Social Services in December, based on a state report advocating higher annual salaries.

7) Meanwhile, we still remain one vote away from eliminating the \$25 vehicle tag fee which would benefit all residents (especially low to moderate income).

8) King William currently has a debt obligation of \$34.7 million. Taxpayers do the math: \$34.7 million - \$8 million in reserve = \$26.7 million debt. Does that sound like “we have the money” or ca-Ch’ing to homeowners with more spending?

A friend suggested I investigate Miniature Herefords especially as I wasn't interested in selling the farm and it was not in the cards to turn the pastures into small grain production," said Jean Shepard of Chimaera Farm.

The idea behind "Pasture-2-Plate" developed when Shepard's research of the beef industry indicated a trend that included an increasing number of health conscious consumers demanding a higher quality, more flavorful all natural product, an aging population seeking small portion sizes and better (sic tender) quality, and a shrinking financially viable resource base (land, feed) to support animal growth.

Starting with carefully researched Mini Hereford bloodlines, the farm acquired Mini Hereford bull calves and a heifer, then began to look for Full Blood (99.9%) and Purebred (51%) American Aberdeen Angus (formerly Lowline Angus) to further refine and achieve its production goals.

"We were fortunate to find two champion registered Fullblood (99.9%) AAA heifers and a well bred registered Purebred AAA heifer that we crossed with our Mini Hereford bulls in August 2017," said Shepard. "Sadly, a heifer was lost at birth this Spring, but the two that lived are cuties, although I'm scratching my head as to how they inherited their color traits." "Elecktra" should have a bald face, but does not have single white hair. "Cleo" should also be a black baldy, but at first glance she looks all Hereford until you notice her Angus back.

The farm has been under the day-to-day management of Bucky Moody for the last few years while Shepard pursued international interests, returning to investigate possible acquisitions and develop and manage breeding plans. Moody, a retired King William and

King and Queen High School sciences teacher and coach, finds the Mini herd easy to be around, demands fewer resources, and achieves maturity much earlier than its full sized counterparts. Throw in the economic advantage its no wonder they are highly sought after as production stock for smaller farms, 4H and FFA projects, show animals, and pets.

"A Mini Hereford must be between 38" and 43" at the hip and will be market ready between 900 and 1000 pounds. It will yield more meat per live weight pound and have a larger ribeye ratio than its larger cousin," noted Moody. "Crossing with the Aberdeen Angus refines the yield and cuts without sacrificing compact size. And, when you can raise 3 Minis on the same resources needed to raise one standard sized cow and achieve greater total market yield, with a whole lot less wear and tear on the land and fences, it's a no brainer."

Chimaera Farm may be a bit away from achieving its "Pasture-2-Plate" program, but Shepard is convinced the farm will meet its objective of being a small, niche market quality beef producer.



When his enlistment came to a close, he returned stateside. He spread a Richmond Times Dispatch across the table and searched "pages and pages" of job opportunities in the help wanted section. 




