On November 17th Chief Anne Richardson of the Rappahannock Tribe in King & Queen County welcomed speakers and guests to their culture center in Indian Neck. Speakers were Joe McCauley, Chesapeake Conservancy and Kym Hall with the National Park Service. During the lunch break guests were treated to a fantastic luncheon that included stuffed mushrooms with sage sausage, venison meat balls with gravy, smoked turkey, corn chowder seasoned with wild rice, sourdough bread and sweet potatoes.

The Rappahannock people first met Captain John Smith in December 1607 at their capitol whose name Smith recorded as "Topahanoke".
