On November 17th Chief Anne Richardson of the Rappahannock Tribe in King & Queen County welcomed speakers and guests to their culture center in Indian Neck. Speakers were Joe McCauley, Chesapeake Conservancy and Kym Hall with the National Park Service. During the lunch break guests were treated to a fantastic luncheon that included stuffed mushrooms with sage sausage, venison meat balls with gravy, smoked turkey, corn chowder seasoned with wild rice, sourdough bread and sweet potatoes.

The Rappahannock people first met Captain John Smith in December 1607 at their capitol whose name Smith recorded as "Topahanoke".

Do you feel like you have a monkey on your back? I know that's the way I feel sometimes. I really enjoy this time of year. Christmas with family and friends can be a lot of fun or can be stressful if you think you forgot something or somebody. The older I get the more I have to write things down or I won't remember it. I'm not sure if that's forgetfulness or truly understanding that most things are really not that important. Ha! I try to plan ahead and have a couple of extra gifts wrapped just in case I have forgotten somebody.

We need to plan ahead for our animals too. The days have gotten so much shorter, and the nights colder. We leave in the dark and come home in the dark. One of the main things this time of year is frozen drinking water for our horses and mules. We need to keep the ice broken up in the watering trough so they can always have access to drinking water. Also keeping it full can be a challenge if the water line gets frozen. I plan ahead with an extra little 40 or 50 gallon water tank in the back of my truck. If the need arises with a real bitter cold snap and everything outside stays froze solid, I can find somewhere

Smith returned to the Rappahannock Tribal lands in the summer of 1608, when he mapped fourteen of the tribes towns along the banks of the Rappahannock river. The Rappahannock Tribe is a state recognized Indian tribe, whose tribal area is located in Indian Neck in King and Queen County.

In the late twentieth century, the tribe owned 140.5 acres of land and the Rappahannock culture center had about 500 members on the tribal roll.

Both King William & King and Queen Counties are unique in having a Native American population that have been here for thousands of years.

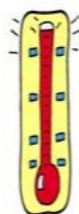

In response to *Expose the facts and let people decide for themselves* (November 21, 2018 issue) I agree that we let people decide for themselves, that is what our democracy is based on. But democracy is also about civil discord, and the venomous tone of the article is palpable.

Virginia ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in the US in teacher pay, as well as garnering the following from the study: "Virginia is in the middle of the rankings for affordability but is in the **top half of the states for its education ranking.**" Both accomplishments for which I am proud of. But just because Virginia ranked 7<sup>th</sup>, which

averages salaries of the entire state, I prefer to evaluate my county on its own performance. Specifically, King William county teachers received 6 pay raises over the last 10 years (FY10-No, FY11-No, FY12-Yes, FY13-No, FY14-Scale correction, FY15 through FY18 Yes, FY19-No) The "language" exposed (scale adjustments, step increases) is terminology relative to the occupation – Educators. They are actually terms that are quite descriptive of their meaning and implications.

Teachers are educated professionals who are teaching the next generation of Americans. King William County, and all of our residents, are employers. We employ teachers to fulfill a

job description pertinent to their specific duty. Employers provide employees' salaries and benefit packages to recruit and maintain the best professionals educated and equipped for the job. The letter in reference conveyed the opinion that paid Holidays, hospitalization and retirement benefits are somehow unusual in professional occupations. Yes they are generous, and part of what attracts, and keeps, top professionals in the school system. Young people go to school and college in order to grow up and secure jobs in professions that provide these benefits.

As an employer, we (KWC) delegated oversight of the KWC school system to the leadership of Dr. White. As his title implies, he is highly educated and experienced in overseeing the responsibility of this school system. I defer matters to the professional in their area of expertise, and as long as the matrixes define successes, I support the decisions and direction defined by the

professionals. Doesn't mean there isn't any oversight, because there is from the school board, and then ultimately the BOS. In times of prosperity, all should benefit. In times of decline, we are all asked to sacrifice. It's not always about "how much you can keep from spending". Spend according to the accomplishments to maintain a high standard of learning for children.

As a KW county resident, I support annual pay raises for teachers. I look to Dr. White for methods and planning to educate the ever changing challenges of a diverse population of kids, all the while conforming to a vast amount of government regulation. As our school system continues to achieve the defined matrixes, I will continue to advocate for what is a reasonable response to their effort and achievements – pay raises.



The question is-was this money supposed to be collected to pay for 911 upgrades-or like so many “dedicated revenue sources” was it siphoned off to be spent elsewhere?

It is a fair question and one our Board of Supervisors should truthfully answer before they spend the anticipated \$800,000. Accountability isn’t just a word, it is something all citizens should demand from our elected officials. The Watchdog is on guard.

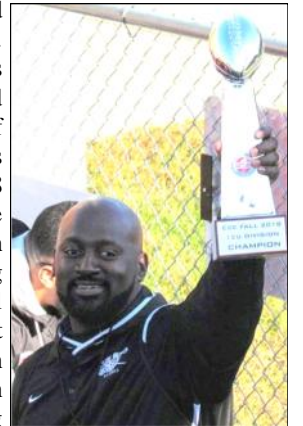

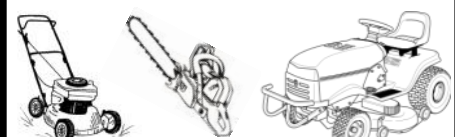

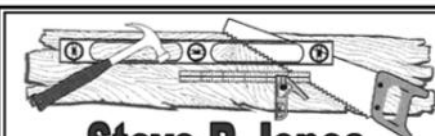
