Horse Care in Winter

Blanketing a horse is necessary to reduce the effects of cold or inclement weather when: No shelter is available during turnout periods and the temperatures or wind chill drop below 5° F. There is a chance the horse will become wet (e.g. rain, ice, and/or freezing rain -- usually not a problem with snow).

Caring for your Horse in Cold Weather

- Provide warm water (45° to 65° F).
 - Feed additional hay during extreme cold.
 - Make sure there is access to shelter.
 - Perform regular hoof care.
 - Assess your horse's body condition regularly.
- Evaluate your facility's stability and ventilation.

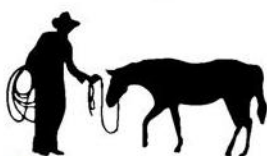

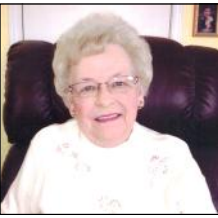
FOGG

K&Q County Historical Society Program on African-American Education

The public is invited to attend the Sunday, January 27, meeting of the King and Queen County Historical Society at 3:00 p.m., at King and Queen Courthouse in the General Courts Building. Dr. Alvin Lomax will speak about the development of formal education for African-Americans beginning in 1869, and the important contributions of Samuel Benton Holmes (1868 – 1945) and India Hamilton (1877 – 1950) from King and Queen County.

Dr. Lomax is a long-time resident of King William County and an active member of the Middle Peninsula African-American Genealogical and Historical Society of Virginia. He is a graduate of Hampton University, and holds a doctorate of education degree from the College of William and Mary. After graduating from Hampton, Dr. Lomax was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. After completing two years of

active duty, he continued to serve in the Army Reserves for eighteen years, while concurrently, beginning his civilian professional career as a teacher with a focus on the natural sciences and chemistry, and completing his graduate education. Dr. Lomax returned to his native King William County in 1992, after thirty-one years on the faculty at Norfolk State University where he was a Professor of Education and Assistant Vice President. There he had a broad range of teaching and administrative responsibilities.

We are moving swiftly towards getting everything ready. We are still waiting on the final OK from VDOT, but that should be coming very shortly as both our side and King William County are working hard together to make sure every I is dotted and T is crossed.

Also we have purchased our equipment and have had it delivered to a warehouse in Richmond, awaiting its installation. We will be running a 10BBL system which will allow us to produce 310 gallons with every batch. We will also be running a smaller system for test batches once we open.

The biggest delay right now is actually with the Government Shutdown. While the shutdown is happening we are unable to acquire the necessary licenses from the TTB, which is currently closed. Hopefully if that is reopened shortly, we will be able to open in Early 2019.

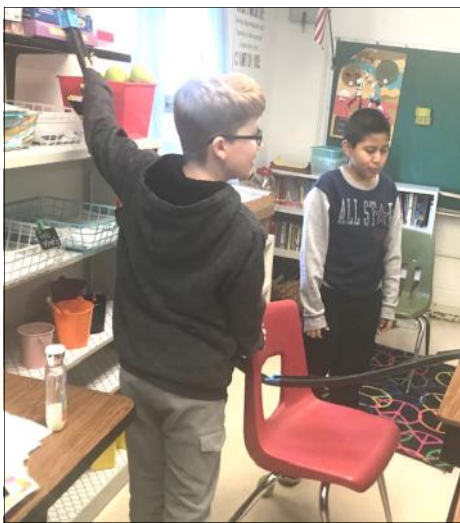

Forty-seven businesses collected 1811 toys and gifts for the Toys for Tots Program which is run by the United States Marine Corps Reserve. All donations of money and toys collected locally is kept in the same community it is donated in.

1196 boys and 1158 girls received toys and gifts. 1572 children were primarily from King William, King and Queen, Hanover and Essex counties, of which 853 were children from King William and King and Queen counties.

Aylett Toys for Tots is the local coordinating organization that collects and distributes these toys at Christmas each year. The generosity of these local businesses was evident in the abundance of toys collected during the 2018 Christmas season. Children were excited and thrilled. It was an outstanding experience of overwhelming support and the expression of gratitude for toys and gifts received over the last four weeks has been remarkable.

A load of blessings to be thankful for. Students of Cool Spring Primary School, King William donated tooth brush, toothpaste, bathroom tissue, kitchen paper towels, gloves, socks, hats and scarves which was distributed to about 230 families. A local resident donated exquisite scarves.

It was a lot of fun with Santa. Some parents were stunned to receive toys that brought back memories of their childhood. There were books, dolls, games, puzzles, cosmetics, art sets and so much more, for boys and girls at Christmas.
