


Publisher's Message

33 Horses Seized Again in King William

On Thursday, January 24th, thirty-three horses were seized from the New Beginnings Horse Rescue, a privately owned facility on Upshaw Road in King William, by the Attorney General's Animal Law Unit and assisted by law enforcement agents. A spokesman for the Attorney General's Office said the search/ seizure was part of an investigation of suspected animal cruelty. Back in 2016 about forty horses were seized from this farm by the King William Sheriff's Department for animal cruelty. All the horses were returned to the owners and no charges were filed. The owner paid a fine for cruelty to one horse.

According to Andrew Bodoh, an attorney for the owners, stated, "This is a surprise to my client and a surprise to us. The search warrant says 'Cruelty to animals' - no date, no time, no description, no details whatsoever, just cruelty to animals. Show me the abuse, where is the abuse? Who is claim ing there is abuse?" Budoh is suggesting that the raid is retaliation for a pending lawsuit for a previous incident.

No further information is available at this time. Calls to the Attorney General's Office - Virginia Animal Cruelty have not been returned.
