Prayer Vigil Held for Slain 8 Year Old Boy

A grieving community gathered at 5:30 p.m. on Saturday, January 26th, at Acquinton Elementary School, to hold a prayer vigil for eight year old Orlando Anderson, Jr., who was fatally shot on Monday, January 21, at his father's home. A large crowd of probably 300 – family, friends, classmates and their families,

came to say good-bye and release silver and blue balloons in his memory.

A well organized and uplifting prayer vigil was held by the family. Rev. Marvin Fields of Hanover Second Mount Zion Baptist Church, Orlando's father's church, and five other local pastors offered words of comfort to the group.

King William County to take over Station One

King William volunteer Fire and Rescue in Aylett may soon belong to King William County. At the January 28th King William Board of Supervisors meeting, county Administrator Bobby Tassinari presented to the board two resolutions to signal the board's intent to move forward with a draft agreement. Resolution 19-03 Authorizing the County Administrator to accept a deed conveying real property to King William County from King William Volunteer Fire and Rescue. Resolution 19-04, Authorizing the County Administrator to accept personal property and assets to King William County from King William Fire and Rescue.

There will be cost to the county. The building costs \$282,646.12, would come out of the county's unassigned general fund balance of \$7.3 million.

Station One loans, a tanker and engine with a loan balance of \$264,185.03. This would be refinanced said, Tassinari. Daniel Stuck, County Attorney said, "The resolutions are not binding or final. The board will have the opportunity to look at the agreement and make a final decision". During the public comment period, Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Squad Chief Curtis Mason jr. said, "I've been told in a roundabout way that you are doing away with the funding for Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue".

The two resolutions were approved. Hansen and Ehrhart voted No on the assets resolution and Hansen voted No on the building resolution. During the supervisors comment period, Supervisor Greenwood said, "I would like to send out our heartfelt condolences to the family of Herb White. I have enjoyed his friendship for many years".

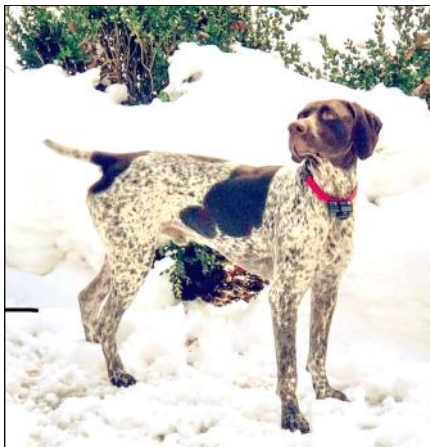

Activist Herb White Dies at 77

Herbert L. (Herb) White, Jr., age 77, died suddenly on Sunday, January 27, 2019. He was an activist. The dictionary definition of "activist" is someone who brings about change – socially, politically or physical. Herb did all of this. From the list of his civic activities over the years, he made changes in the community far and wide and helped many people have a better life. Herb strived to make King William a better place in which to live and work.

With his wife of 56 years, Marian, by his side and the support of son Scott, Herb was involved in many service oriented organizations. In 1963 he was one of four individuals who founded the King William Volunteer Rescue Squad and in 1965, was instrumental in adding on the King William Volunteer Fire Department, remaining an active member in both organizations for more than 20 years and was a Charter and Life Member. He was a member of the King

William Ruritan Club, serving as past Secretary/Treasurer of the Ruritan Foundation, Inc. during construction of the new Ruritan Community Building and Park, charter member of the Mattaponi Crime Solvers; a director of Prevent Blindness Mid-Atlantic, serving as a Chairman of the Board for two years; a member of Joppa Lodge #40 AF & AM; and a member of Colosse Baptist Church. He also served as director on the King William County Historical Society Board during the renovation of the historic Acquinton Church Project as well as the old jail at King William Courthouse Renovation Project. He was a Board Director for King William Emergency Ministries as well as working for many years with its Christmas Wishes Program.

In local government Herb served as Chairman of the King William Board of Zoning Appeals for thirty-six years and served on the County Tri-Centennial Committee and Redistricting Committee.

Gene Campbell, a friend and fellow

member in the King William Ruritan Club, states, "I came to know Herb's passion for community service. You always knew where you stood with Herb and he was not afraid to stand up for what was right. I remember Herb speaking at the Board of Supervisors meetings, not to complain, but to bring attention to the good things that were happening in the county. From his career working for the Richmond Newspapers for 37 years to his service in the King William community – Herb unselfishly devoted himself to helping people."

At his funeral, several of Herb's friends and relatives defined an activist – mover and shaker, godly, wise, committed, dedicated, caring, and compassionate. One friend stated that the team of Herb and Marian weren't just members who showed up sometimes but became very active in the activities of that particular organization. The pastor defined Herb as a Christian who loved his neighbor. Herb will be greatly missed in the community.

33 Horses Seized Again in King William

On Thursday, January 24th, thirty-three horses were seized from the New Beginnings Horse Rescue, a privately owned facility on Upshaw Road in King William, by the Attorney General's Animal Law Unit and assisted by law enforcement agents. A spokesman for the Attorney General's Office said the search/ seizure was part of an investigation of suspected animal cruelty.

Back in 2016 about forty horses were seized from this farm by the King William Sheriff's Department for animal cruelty. All the horses were returned to the owners and no charges were filed. The owner paid a fine for cruelty to one horse.

According to Andrew Bodoh, an attorney for the owners, stated, "This is a surprise to my client and a surprise to us. The search warrant says 'Cruelty to animals' – no date, no time, no description, no details whatsoever, just cruelty to animals. Show me the abuse, where is the abuse? Who is claiming there is abuse?" Bodoh is suggesting that the raid is retaliation for a pending lawsuit for a previous incident.

No further information is available at this time. Calls to the Attorney General's Office – Virginia Animal Cruelty have not been returned.

Life at North Point Plantation in the 1800's was brought to life at the January 20th meeting of the King William Historical Society. Guest speaker at the meeting was Martha Marinelli whose great-great-great-grandfather Archee Brown bought North Point in 1832. North Point, majestically situated on the King William side of the Mattaponi River just above Walkerton, was built around 1742.

Martha's great-great-grandmother

Mildred Carter Hasseltine Semple lived there until the plantation was lost to the carpetbaggers in the 1870's. During this time Mildred made a hair wreath which included locks of hair contributed by many family members. It took her several years to make and she purchased a frame for it in 1864. The Hair Locks Frame has been handed down in the family and is currently owned by Martha's sister Chrissy Stevens. At Chrissy's request, Martha presented the hair frame to the King William Historical Museum.

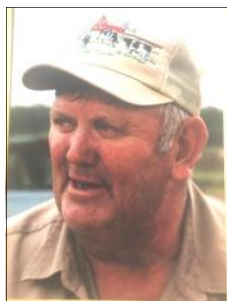

Mattaponi VRS Helps K&Q Family

Amanda Jones is a member of Mattaponi Volunteer Squad in Walkerton. She and her family – husband John, children, Parker – 13, Kaylei – 10 and Allie – 9, moved to Walkerton the first week of October 2018 because the family wanted to be in a rural setting and not too far from daughter Allie's doctors.

The next week Hurricane Michael moved through and left three feet of water in the basement of their rental house. At least 90% of the family's belongings were destroyed—clothes, furniture and especially medical equipment, including a lift, for Allie.

Allie is in hospice because of several health issues, including cerebral palsy and multi-organ failure of the stomach, small bowel, liver and pancreas. She has two types of feeding tubes and requires round the clock care.

The members of Mattaponi helped take water out of the basement, take furniture and boxes out of the house and helped them find a new home. The organization voted to give Christmas to the children, including bikes for Kaylei and Parker and a pedal car for Allie and gift cards to the family.

Thirteen year old Parker is autistic, has Asperger's Syndrome since 7, as well as several other medical conditions. Parker did not like being around people and preferred to be alone because of his autism. Since he has been going to the Mattaponi building with his mom, he has developed a passion to attend events with or without his mother, such as the monthly salt fish breakfast, Walkerton Day and the Walkerton Christmas Parade. Parker's unique gifts in math have made him

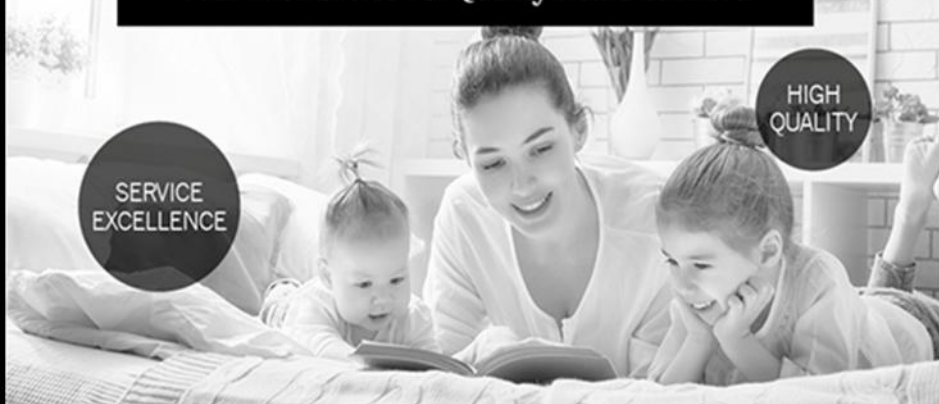
invaluable at the salt fish dinners because he knows exactly how many beverages he has poured and approximately how many more are left. Something about MVRS has helped Parker come out of his comfort zone. He sometimes is the first to raise his hand to help with any job at the building. Several months ago the Board at Mattaponi voted to have Parker serve as an honorary member. In December he was presented with his very own uniform and learned of his new roll. He takes his "job" very seriously and even carries a pocket mask to aid in CPR in case someone needs his help.

Mom Amanda states, "Thanks to the Mattaponi family, Parker is a completely different kid. He is more outgoing than ever, wants to approach people, talk to them, and doesn't run at the thought of being in a group. On January 28 I attended the King William Board of Supervisor's Meeting at the King William County Administration Building (180 Horse Landing Road). The public comment period for our local citizens should have raised questions that demanded answers.

When you have long term fire and EMS volunteers comment and say the county's new plan to reorganize and manage the KWV Fire and Rescue system will make the volunteer system suffer, all should take notice. The two problems I was able to hear were: one - creating a work place atmosphere where communication is one sided and two - volunteers and members being picked to support the county stations at the expense of the volunteer stations which will also get reduced funding.

Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Chief Curtis Mason Jr. stated he had a check for over \$500,000 to fund & help run King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue and the county would not have to pay a cent. He was told "No".

It would seem our new Fire Chief and at least three members of the board are more of the problem than the solution. The "Our Way or The Highway" Attitude when you have a viable solution that will keep tax payers from having to bite the bullet should not be lost.

The conservative Supervisors Hansen and Ehrhart showed the concerns, values and attention to budget issues they promised their constituents when they ran for their current positions back in 2015. The three progressive Supervisors and their allies seemed to be on a fast track to get the deal done - ASAP.

Do you remember the District One Supervisor saying that the proposed Station One Sell-off, is Budget Neutral? Only when the BoS drives a 'stake' through the heart of Mattaponi Rescue Squad. And you say that your tax money sitting in the un-Assigned Reserve Fund is there to be spent for this 'pet' project of our County Fire Chief e.g., 'RESOLUTION 19-05...AMENDMENT TO THE KING WILLIAM COUNTY FISCAL YEAR 2019 BUDGET...WHEREAS, the King William County Board of Supervisors wishes to appropriate funds from the 'Unassigned General Fund Balance' for the purchase of real property located at 7936 Richmond Tappahannock Hwy., Aylett, Virginia otherwise known as King William Volunteer Fire and Rescue Station One.'

Thankfully, the Monday BoS meeting was well attended by members of the County Volunteer Firefighters and EMT's. Several voiced their concerns over the County takeover of Station One and the funding of the proposed Nestles Station 4. I encourage you to go to the proposed location on Dunluce Rd. (CR613) to perhaps notice that the location is behind the Nestle 'SECURITY FENCE' next to the Nestles plant at 931 Dunluce, even though it is to be called the Dunluce Station perhaps a better name would be the Nestle station.

Item 10a... A brief synopsis of the budget amendment follows: Total Budget Amendment: \$290,000 (not to exceed); Transfer From: Unassigned General Fund Balance (100) \$290,000 (not to exceed); Transfer To: Capital Fund (310) \$290,000 (not to exceed)'

Please ask yourself.. what happened to the Work-Session Discussion about the County Administrator's and Chiefs' funding and plans for Station 4, that have been so openly discussed? Or is it 'Up-in-Smoke?' Do not worry, the Board will likely wait until we know the KWVFD representatives will not show up; and then pass it as a last minute addition to the Agenda, approved by the Chairperson, as we have often done in the past in similar issues.

I was surprised when the KWBoS Chairperson said that he gave our County Fire Chief three (3) months to come up with the volunteers needed to staff 'Station One,' from his current list of 40+; or else. Perhaps it would be good to ask... 'or else what?'

His second grade teacher, Heather Klakos, gave a short eulogy for Orlando. She stated, "Tonight we gather in honor of an amazing eight year old boy named Orlando, who had a smile that would light up a room and a personality that made you fall in love with him. Orlando was in my second grade class last year. He was part of my amazing group that quickly became a family and made an impact on everyone at school. Orlando was one of my favorite students I've ever had the pleasure of teaching. I called him my big teddy bear because he gave the best hugs and he had a heart of gold. Orlando was a smart, kind, hardworking eight year old with lots of friends. His smile was contagious and his dance moves were on point. Everyone loved to watch Orlando dance. We gather to remember our sweet Orlando and to remember the wonderful memories that will live on in us forever."

Orlando's father, Orlando Anderson, Sr., and his mother, Alexis Mines, were present. The father told the group his son recently asked him about death. He told his son all of us will die but we'll see each
