Ownership of Seized Horses Granted to King William County

On Tuesday, February 12, 2019, ownership of 33 horses seized from the King William farm of Cassy Newell-Reed and Harry Reed III, was granted to King William County after a two seizure hearing.

Retired Richmond General District Court Judge Barbara Gaden decided that the Reeds had cruelly treated and neglected the horses: 22 of 33 horses were underweight; 18 of the horses had no access to food and needed farrier care; several horses had parasites; several horses had rain rot on their bodies; one horse had lice; two of the horses had no water; and several had tried to eat straw and manure which is a sign of systematic starvation.

Mrs. Reed testified local hay was not in good condition because of rainy weather; horses are

fed two or three times a day, once in the morning and another time not on a schedule; and hay is supplemented with mineral supplements, food pellets, mush and beet pulp.

Judge Baden ordered the ownership of the horses transferred to King William County, set an appeal bond of \$50,000 for the care of the horses for nine months, \$20 per day by county, as well as \$9,900 already accumulated for the care of the horses.

Mrs. Reed is banned from owning horses for five years due to previous cruelty charges and Mr. Reed is banned from owning horses for two years. She has 10 days to appeal the judge's decision and 30 days to pay the fine.

Commonwealth's Attorney Matthew Kite stated the horses are not in the local area but will be cared for and owned by the county.

Discussions centered on the KWIC and EDA efforts pursuing high speed internet for King William.

Local EMS Chief Announces Run for KW Supervisor Seat

Speaking to the King William TEA Party on Thursday evening, Curtis Mason, Chief of Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Service, publicly revealed his plan to run for Supervisor in District 2 (Courthouse and Sweet Hall) in November's election.

"I'm not a politician," Mason said, "I'm a man of the people and I promise to work in the best interests of all the citizens of King William."

Mason, a strong critic of plans by King William government to take over long-existing volunteer fire and emergency medical services in the county, noted that Travis Moskalski, current supervisor for the district, consistently supports the takeover and a number of other bad ideas.

"This will have a lot of negative consequences," Mason said, "particularly in reduced medical and fire emergency response times and higher rates for homeowners' insurance in many areas."

He also predicts that pushing out dedicated volunteers and the large costs for paid personnel, expensive vehicles, and facility upgrades will almost certainly mean higher taxes.

Asked why he decided to oppose

Moskalski, Mason criticized what he saw as a troubling attitude among the majority of the Board toward spending. "They say 'the money is there, the people have it so let's use it'."

"I'm for saving instead of spending."

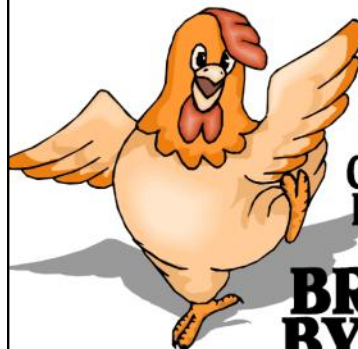

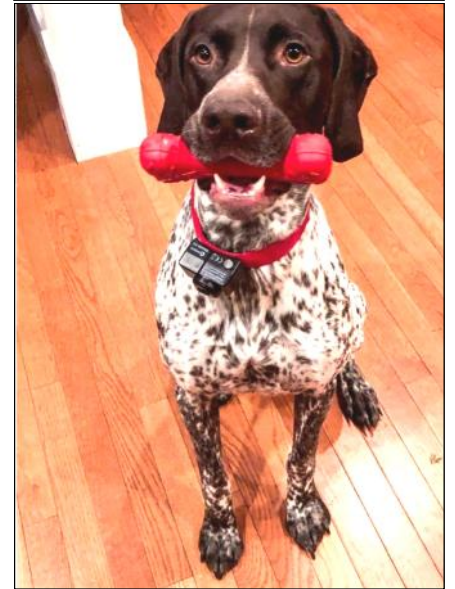


\$1000 REWARD Please Help us find Luke

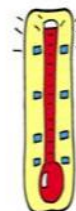

Twice over the last 2 years Fire Chief Andy Aigner has specifically mentioned the "possibility" of I.S.O ratings improving and then *potentially* lowering local home owners fire insurance premiums. In the interest of full disclosure perhaps Mr. Aigner might offer some more details. My research into the subject disclosed that local fire officials are often the source for information on the subject. Should Mr. Aigner be capable of detailing what if any impact moving both Squad 1 and equipment would have on home owners fire insurance costs-up or down, and in what areas of the county will be helped or hurt by the moves being contemplated. After all he is the Fire Chief and local citizens should be able to expect him to elaborate on this in more detail than he has to date.
