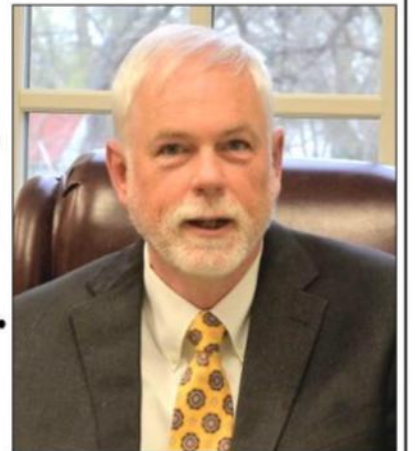

With temperatures warming up in the 70's, it looks like spring is here to stay. Everything is starting to green up and growing season has started. We have to be aware that the pastures that sat dormant all winter will green up overnight and become overflowing with nutrients that can cause a problem to some of our horses if they overeat. Some people limit the time their horses are allowed to graze on this new grass. They start them at a few hours a day grazing and over a few weeks work up to several hours. This new growth can have an effect in a horse called founder. Founder is a general term for an animal becoming ill from overeating rich food. They become lame and stumble. This is called laminitis. If you have a question or concern, you should contact your veterinarian.

Spring is also when the local farmers are planting all the wonderful vegetables that we get to enjoy in the summer and fall. I'm reminded of a story about a farmer that kept having problems with kids getting into his watermelon field at night and eating up his profits from a



few of his prized watermelons. He tried different things to discourage the kids, but didn't have much luck stopping them. So finally he puts up a sign that reads "WARNING! ONE OF THESE WATERMELONS CONTAINS CYANIDE!" He smiled to himself the next night as he watched the kids run off without eating any of his watermelons. The farmer returns to his watermelon patch a few days later to discover that none of his watermelons have been eaten, but finds another sign that reads "NOW THERE ARE TWO!"

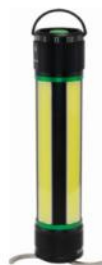

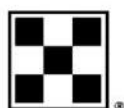

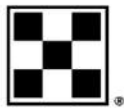

Proposed FY2019-2020 Budget Presented to the King William BOS



County Administrator Bobbie Tassinari presents proposed FY2019-2020 budget to the Supervisors

At the March 25th meeting of the King William Board of Supervisors, County Administrator Bobbie Tassinari presented a draft of her proposed FY2019-2020 budget. In the budget is a \$0.02 reduction in the real estate tax dropping the rate from the current \$0.88 per \$100 of assessed value to \$0.86 per \$100 of assessed value. The proposed budget totals \$25,575,137 and is approximately \$1.9 million less than the current year's budget.

In other matters:

1. The board approved by a 4 - 1 vote (Hansen dissenting) the transfer of the county's Comcast franchise to Atlantic Broadband.

2. Unanimously approved rezoning tax map Parcel 28-59D consisting of 1.85 acres

along Rt 30 across from King William High School from A-C to B-1. A Tractor Supply Store is proposed on this and two other lots at this location.

3. Tabled rezoning tax map parcel 28-38B5 consisting of 23.7 acres along Rt 360 from R-1 to B-2. The applicant is Kellum Homes, LLC.

4. Unanimously approved a resolution supporting Crime Victims' Rights Week.

A public hearing on the proposed budget and tax rate will be held Monday, April 1st at 7 pm at the Administrative Bldg. followed by a budget work session on April 8th and an all-day work session on April 12th. The final budget is scheduled to be presented for adoption at the regular BOS meeting on Monday, April 29th beginning at 7 pm.

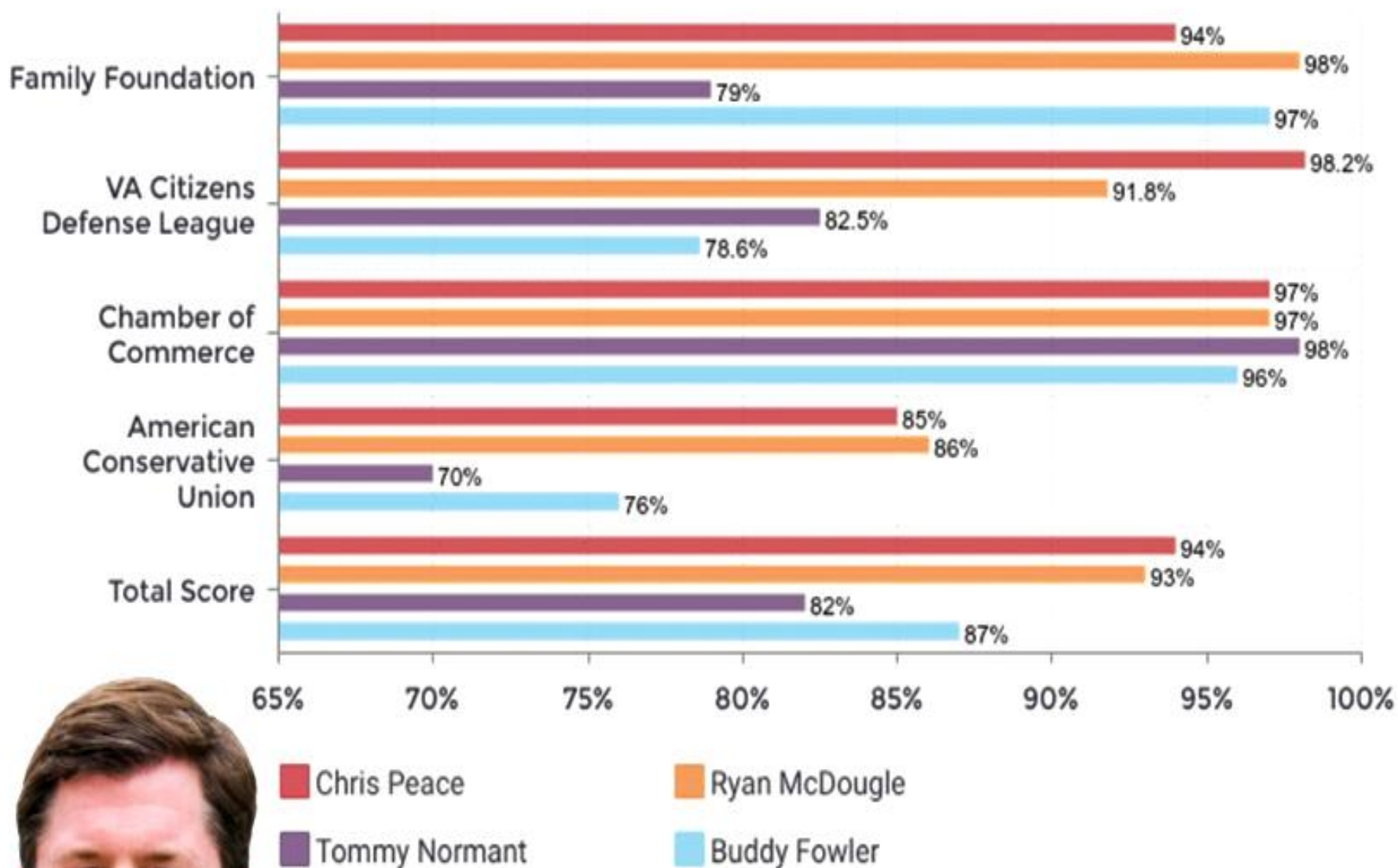

It started with the new County Administer (at that time) hiring the current Fire Chief. The supervisors were told they could not fire the chief without also letting the new County Administer go too. (Insanity- If true - this needs to be changed) The new chief said to the Board of Supervisors - he would not need a budget – just his salary.

This did not last long and History starts to repeat. The chief discovered he needed a fire vehicle he could use to get to the scene of the fires & accidents. (Solution - A new county purchased SUV with all the toys) Next he discovered the workload was more than expected and the solution was to hire assistants to help. Next he didn't have enough volunteers to answer calls and the solution more paid help.

On Jan 28 I attended the King William Board of Supervisor's Meeting at the King William County Administration Building (180 Horse Landing Road). The public comment period for our local citizens should have raised questions that demanded answers. King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue was in financial trouble and it seems to those present was "for sale". The Kitty Litter Plant offered a building that could house a Fire & Ems unit.

Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Chief Curtis Mason Jr. stated he had a check for over \$500,000 to fund & help run King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue and the county would not have to pay a cent. He was told "No".

The Solution was the county would pay over \$500,000.00 for the King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue's land, building, equipment and pay off its the past debts. The Kitty Litter plant's offer of a building was to be accepted and both the King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue's building and Kitty Litter plant building were to be manned. This raises the questions of how much will it cost to renovate the Kitty Litter building, where is the equipment coming from to fill both the Kitty Litter building, the King William Volunteer Fire & Rescue building and at what cost for all.

The solution always seems to be "There is no problem that cannot be solved with other people's money". A question for thought "As reported by the Tidewater Review" - Did the removal of the Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue from making runs in King William created the need for the Kitty Litter building and all the extra costs involved?

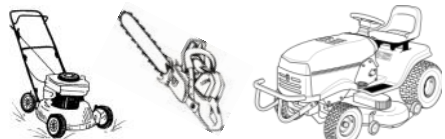

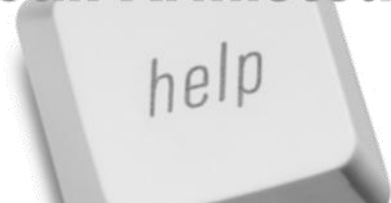

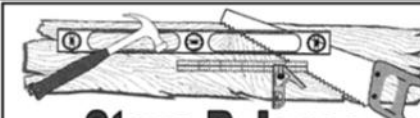
