On June 3rd the King and Queen Country planning commission heard all aspects of an application made by Open Roads Renewables, and Walnut Solar. Dominion Energy may be a possible partner. If approved a 1,774 acre solar farm will be located in the Buena Vista District. South of Lewis B. Puller Memorial Highway, east of Pear Tree Avenue and east of York River Road. There will be more public hearings in the fall in the General District Courthouse. The board of supervisors will have the final approval. There was a large turnout at the June 3rd public hearing. Donna E. Sprouse assistant zoning Administrator said, "The community wants information about this project as it moves forward."

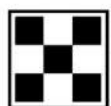

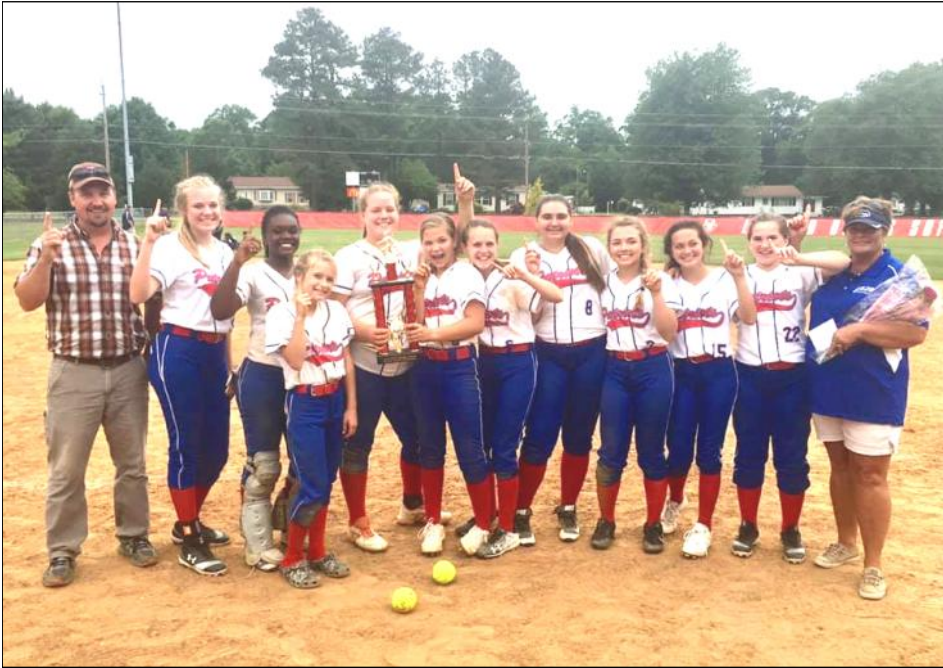

## Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

*King William County Schools - A Money Pit?*

Citizens want good public schools, all of us do. What is becoming more clear with the details emerging is the poor decision making of our School Board, the Superintendent and the Board of Supervisors. They should be ashamed of themselves for their selfishness and greed exhibited by the vast sums of their fellow citizens hard earned tax dollars being wasted.

At the last Board of Supervisors meeting Dr. White, K.W. County School Superintendent gave the B.O.S. an update on the renovation work at Hamilton -Holmes school. I inquired with Supervisors Hansen and Ehrhart (the only two that seemed concerned with the runaway costs) and could not get a specific number as to how much this project to date has went over budget. You may recall the original estimate was around 12.5 million. Ehrhart shared that the "roof work" has turned out to be much more expensive. In the very same news article in this last edition of the Country Courier a study from ABM (facility management firm) cites some \$4,900,000 is needed to address what is cited as a "critical maintenance needs at the 4 schools".

For some backdrop I contacted Dr. White to confirm budget numbers I wanted to cite from the years of 2012 and 2019-20. Actual expenditures (minus debt service) for those two budget years were respectively \$20,969,520 (2012) and \$25,076,701 in the current year. Over the last 10 years (by the schools own admission) the change in Student Count is

ZERO. I confirmed the accuracy of the information I use. The first question is the obvious one. How with no additional students does a school budget climb over \$4,000,000 in such a short period of time? But I digress, let's get back to the current spending on the Hamilton Holmes renovation, the.. "new call for another \$4,900,000. to address the critical maintenance needs .

Cost overruns at Hamilton-Holmes aside, lets address the arranging of misplaced priorities , a sole responsibility at the feet of the School Board Members and the Supervisors that approve this nonsense. How many of you out there who had a roof leaking, or a foundation crumbling would opt instead to spend your own money adding aesthetics before fixing the roof or the foundation?

If 15% of the Hamilton -Holmes cost were aesthetic niceities (some \$2,000,000) that should have been spent on the critical maintenance needs that are now why they are coming back to ask for another \$4,900,000

Only in the public sector do you have this kind of financial travesty go on.

## ARREST MADE IN THEFT OF GUNS/ AUTOMOBILES

King William Sheriff's Investigators have arrested and charged 19 year old Dylan Wayne Hall in connection with stolen guns and two vehicles from King William between May 25 and May 28. Hall has been charged at this time with two felony theft of firearms and one misdemeanor of stealing less than \$500 in cash. During the investigation numerous tips of information came in aiding in the recovery of two stolen vehicles from King William and one stolen vehicle from Richmond. Investigators identified Hall as a suspect after posting a photo of the suspect at the crime scene by a home video monitoring system on social

media. Hall was quickly identified as the person in the photo and Investigators confirmed that through various pieces of information that came in. Investigation into the whereabouts of Hall led them to Amelia County where with the assistance of the Amelia Sheriff's Office, Hall was found and arrested without incident.

This investigation is still ongoing and more charges are expected in the near future. Hall appeared before the King William General District Court this morning (6-6-19) and on a motion by the Commonwealth's Attorney, is being held without bond until preliminary hearing date of July 25<sup>th</sup>.

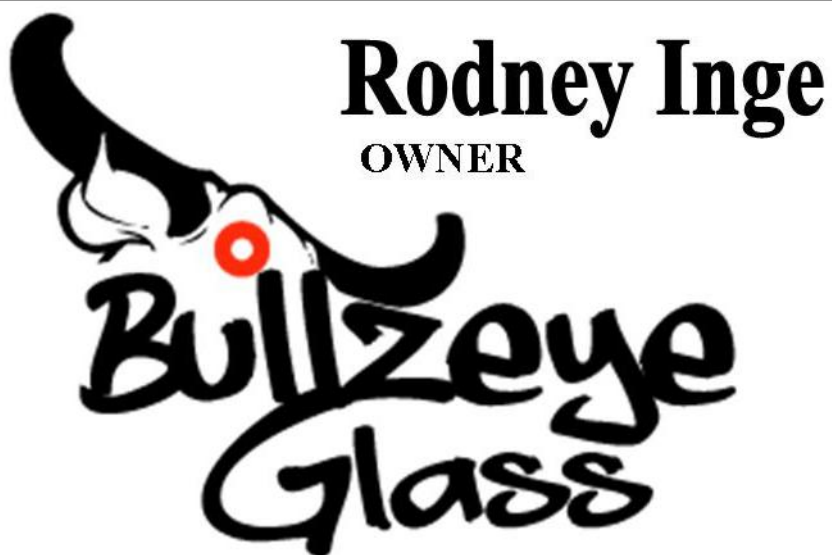

### GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include: (1) Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.

(2) Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming. (3) Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agricultural, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses. (4) Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are byproducts of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems. (5) Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the results of oil and gas production and mining activities. To ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations, which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health.

### DEFINITIONS

Contaminants in your drinking water are routinely monitored according to Federal and State regulations. The table shows the results of our monitoring for calendar year 2018. In the tables and elsewhere in this report you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. The following definitions are provided to help you better understand these terms:

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000. Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000. Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) - picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water. Action Level (AL) - the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow. Maximum Contaminant Level, or MCL - the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. We constantly monitor for various contaminants in the water supply to meet all regulatory requirements. The table lists only those contaminants that had some level of detection. Many other contaminants have been analyzed but were not present or were below the detection limits of the lab equipment.

The state allows us to monitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. Some of our data, though accurate, is more than one year old.

Other drinking water constituents you may be interested in are as follows:

The sodium concentration from the Kennington well from a sample collected on June 14, 2017 was 68.6 mg/l. The sodium concentration from the McCauley Park well from a sample collected on March 8, 2016 was 67 mg/l. The recommended maximum contaminant level is 20 mg/l for persons on a "strict" sodium diet.

MCL's are set at very stringent levels by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. In developing the standards EPA assumes that the average adult drinks 2 liters of water each day throughout a 70-year life span. EPA generally sets MCLs at levels that will result in no adverse health effects for some contaminants or a one-in-ten-thousand to one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect for other contaminants.

## Peace is Landslide Victor in Firehouse Primary

The heated contest between incumbent Chris Peace and challenger Hanover Supervisor Scott Wyatt to be the Republican Party nominee in the 97th Legislative District (consisting of New Kent, and parts of Hanover and King William Counties) of the House of Delegates has been anything but normal. Peace won the recent June 1 party canvass (or firehouse primary) gathering 93% of the 2,448 votes cast and claimed the nomination. In King William Peace defeated Wyatt by a vote of 321 to 35.

The process of selecting a Republican nominee in the 97th District has been embroiled in controversy from the beginning. A Legislative District Committee (LDC) composed of a representative from each county oversees the selection of a nominee. A party convention was scheduled for May 4th to select the nominee but was canceled on May 1st at an LDC committee meeting due to logistic problems at the proposed convention site Hanover High School. The LDC voted to hold a June 1st party canvass or firehouse primary instead at this meeting. The Wyatt

campaign proceeded with the May 4th convention in which Wyatt claimed victory. Since then the Wyatt campaign has filed an appeal challenging the LDC committee's decision to cancel the May 4th convention and hold a June 1st firehouse primary.

At this point, it appears the courts may have to decide who the nominee will be. Stay tuned.....as Yogi Berra would say, "it ain't over till it's over."

Built in New Kent, she is designed to be dissembled for transport. The vessel was reassembled and launched in Piney Point in September 2018.  
The vessel is 97 feet in overall length, 25 feet wide, with a draft of 26". She weighs 85,000 pounds dry. Fuel capacity is 900 gallons, giving a range of 2,400 miles. There are 240 gallons of fresh water on board. She is satellite guided with autopilot. Human waste is incinerated rather than conventional storage/treatment and discharge. She is powered by an 85 horsepower turbocharged diesel engine consuming 2.3 gallons of fuel per hour and has a top speed of 8mph. The tent on the forward deck and landing ramp provides insulated guest quarters and an outdoor kitchen. The camper aboard is a Casita, similar to an Airstream, but fiberglass constructed.  
“This vessel was designed and built for the sole purpose of amusing me.” Stated Fleet. “I’m getting used to Capt. Ryland Fleet and enjoying that title partly out of respect for Capt. Henry Fleete, my ancestor.” The Sebastian Marie’s home is on the Pamunkey River in New Kent County. Ryland, accompanied by his wife Monika and dog Blitzen, plans to cruise the rivers and Intracoastal Waterway and enjoy the stark beauty of those places.
