The 5th District Mangohick

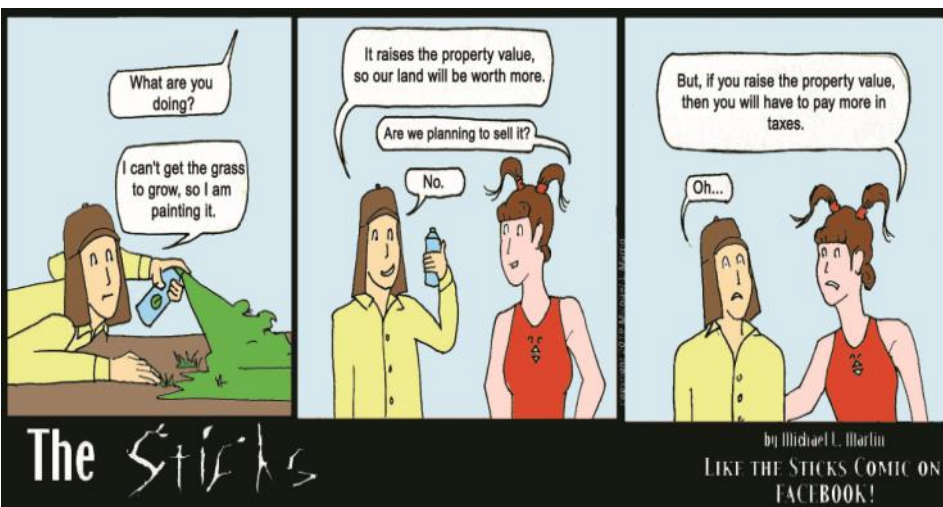

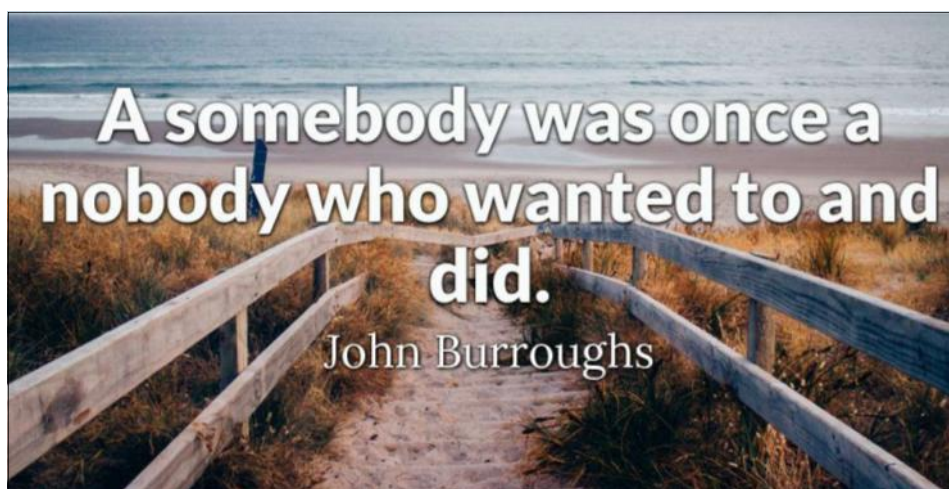

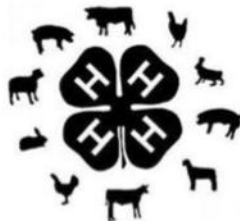

Anne M. Mitchell, Director of King William Social Services, said Stanley's Shop was one of the first area businesses to reach out to offer support to her organization. The hurdles facing King William residents vary, but periodically transportation is a crucial obstacle, so Stanley's Shop now offers complimentary and heavily discounted services to help these individuals eliminate any transportation barriers they may have. The VIEW program also places its participants in non-paid volunteer positions where they can learn new skills and in turn, contribute to the area's businesses. Ms. Mitchell stated, "Individuals and families who come to us for assistance are in great need by the time they cross our threshold. My staff uses resources available and known to the agency to find solutions, whether available through our programs or community or regional resources. The resources that William has offered through Stanley's Shop add to our toolbox."

William is as proud to be a part of King William as the community is to have him. Anne Mitchell went on to say, "William is a young and motivated entrepreneur who has a passion for helping the community. I have been very impressed with his passion and concern for the area and his professional manner in this whole process." Local premieres first movie

People Don't Die in the Comics Anymore, a movie written and directed by Austin Lewis, will premiere at The Byrd movie theater in Richmond Saturday August 10 at 1:30 pm. Austin grew up in Bruington in King and Queen county, the son of Dr. A. W. Lewis and Elizabeth Christeller. After graduating from Washington College in Chestertown, Md. with a degree in Art/Art History and Theater, Austin decided to pursue a career in filmmaking. He completed a filmmaking certificate at John Tyler Community College and started Remember Tommy Productions, LLC. He began writing and filming small projects - a documentary, a sitcom series and a spaghetti western series.

For 18 months, Austin wrote, fundraised for and directed the film People Don't Die in the Comics Anymore and hired local Richmond talent. He says of the premise "About five years ago I lost a friend to suicide. I felt a lot of pain and anxiety from that. I think my frustration manifested itself in the original concept of

the film, and grew from there into something much larger.'

The film contains science fiction elements and, as the name suggests, is a play on the superhero genre. In it, a filmmaker works to create a documentary about a device that allows users to end their lives while, at the same time, he is dealing with his own personal loss and self-destructive tendencies. "My hope for this film is that it can help others in this community who are dealing with loss feel comforted by showing that grief is a messy process" says Lewis. The movie is for adult audiences due to adult themes and language.

After the premiere, Austin will pursue a Masters of Fine Art in filmmaking at Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore.

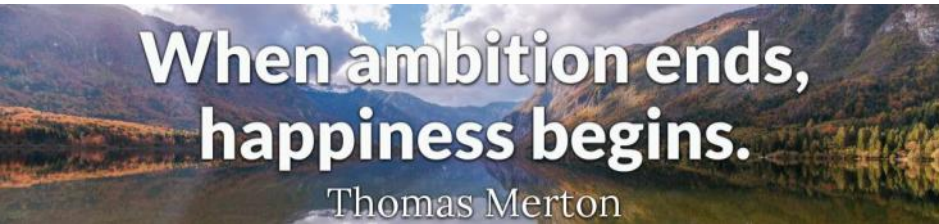

With a vote of 4-1 (Supervisor Hansen dissenting) the agreement gives Atlantic Broadband a 15 year franchise to upgrade former Comcast analog cable TV customers to digital cable, provide video services and ultimately provide broadband internet and phone services to certain parts of the county where it makes good business sense. The KWIC subcommittee under the EDA will continue to work with Atlantic Broadband and other service providers to bring broadband to other areas of the county as well.

In other matters the board:

1. Heard concerns from several residents about conditions and the safety of several roads in the county. VDOT Assistant Administrator Ron Peaks addressed and assured the board they will look at these concerns and address them.
2. Recognized Mandy Trainum for her years of service on the Social Services Board.
3. Received the HEARTSAFE Community Designation Award from Kevin Dillard, President of the Rappahannock EMS Council. The HEARTSAFE designation is awarded to communities that have met critical criteria promoting survival from sudden out-of-hospital cardiac arrests.
4. Approved a request from Twin Porch Properties LLC to rezone tax map parcel 28-49 on Sharon Road from R-1 (Suburban Residential) to B-2 (General Business).
5. Deputy Clerk of the Board Olivia Schools advised the board as of July 1, 2019 all local elected officials are required to complete training on the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act.

The next meeting of the Board is a work session scheduled for August 12th at the Administration Building beginning at 7pm.

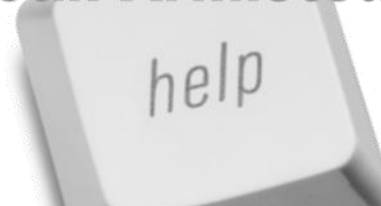

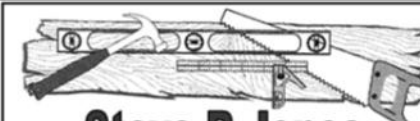

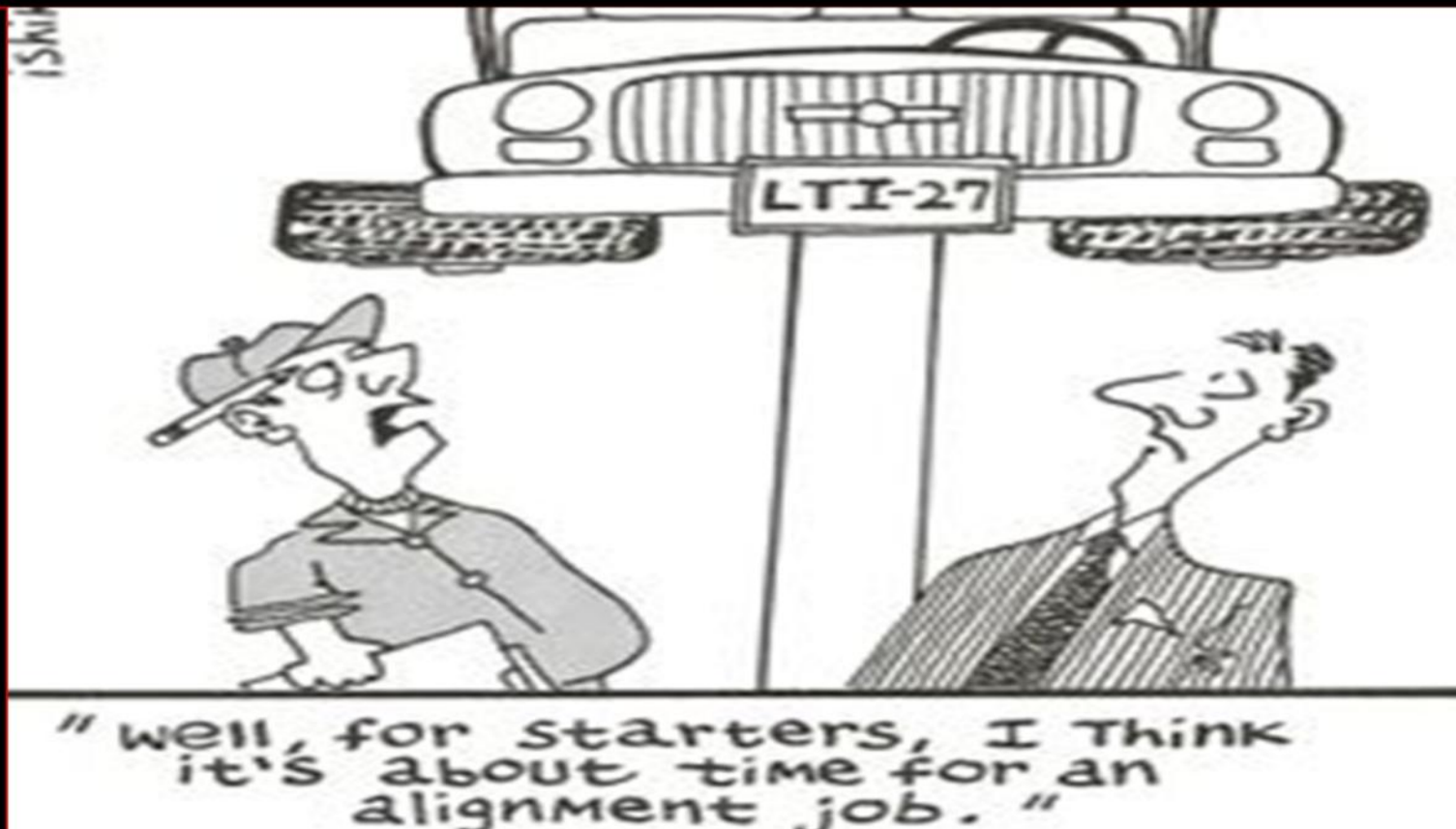
