The King and Queen Department of Social Services, in collaboration with the King and Queen County Resource Council, hosted the fourth annual Yoots and Coots Fishing Event at Tucker's Beach on Saturday, August 17, 2019 from 9 a.m. – 1 p. m. This event provided children with special needs (YOOTS) and older adults (COOTS) the opportunity to fish together.

Over 40 children and families plus 30 – 40 volunteers came out to a day of fun and fishing. Eight to ten boats went out with three to four children in each boat and some who didn't want to go in a boat fished from the pier. All the children had plenty of adult help.

In years past King and Queen families attended the regional Wish-A-Fish event in Urbanna. This meant that in order to participate, the children had a long ride very early in the morning to arrive at the fishing event on time. In a meeting between the County Administrator and the Social Services


Publisher's Message






