Moren and Garber IN Ehrhart and Hansen OUT

There will be two new faces at the board table when the King William County Board of Supervisors meet in January. Ed Moren defeated incumbent Supervisor Bob Ehrhart and challenger Otto Williams in the fifth district. Stewart Garber defeated incumbent Supervisor David Hansen and challengers Ben Shumaker and Andy Aigner in the fourth district. Third District Supervisor Stephen Greenwood defeated challenger Forrist Jewell. First District Supervisor Bill Hodges and Second District Supervisor Travis Moskalski ran unopposed and were re-elected. In the two contested Constitutional Officer races Commonwealth Attorney Matthew Kite defeated challenger Samantha Bohannon

and Commissioner of Revenue Sally Pearson survived a write-in challenge from Chris Couch. In the only contested School Board race Mark Lee defeated Tara Roane to represent the Fifth District. All other local races were uncontested.

In the 97th District of the Virginia House of Delegates Republican Scott Wyatt defeated Democratic challenger Kevin Washington. A write-in campaign mounted by supporters of incumbent Republican Delegate Chris Peace came up short. In the Virginia Senate 3rd District incumbent Republican Senator Tommy Norment defeated Democratic challenger Herb Jones.

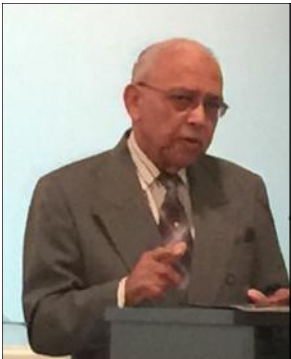

Virginia Women In History Exhibit at the King & Queen Library

The King & Queen and King William branches of the Pamunkey Regional Library are sponsoring an exhibition of *Virginia Women In History* from the Library of Virginia.



This exhibit opened at the King & Queen Library on Monday, November 4th and will be there through Saturday, December 7.



King William native and educator Dr. Alvin Lomax spoke at the opening about the importance of education and its development in our rural counties.

This annual program recognizes and celebrates women's accomplishments in all walks of life, honoring women who developed new approaches to old problems, strove for excellence based on the courage of their convictions, and initiated changes in their communities, state, and nation that continue to effect our lives today. Eight women are celebrated, ranging from the eighteenth century to the twenty-first century. Included is Miss India Hamilton, a native of King & Queen County who became a revered and influential educator in King William County and the Commonwealth of Virginia during the first half of the twentieth century.

As a young man he knew Miss Hamilton and related her humble beginnings, her drive to receive a college degree, and her significant contributions to the development of strong communities throughout her life. Hamilton-Holmes School in King William bears her name. Some of her relatives traveled a long distance to attend the event.

The King & Queen library is open Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Take a few minutes to stop by the library at 396 Newtown Road, St. Stephens Church, VA (just off Rt. 360) and experience this informative and interesting exhibit.

St. David's Episcopal Church in Aylett Celebrates 160th Anniversary

On Saturday, November 9th, St. David's Episcopal Church, the little white church at 11291 West River Road in Aylett, had a service of celebration and Thanksgiving for its 160th anniversary.

The program started with the Presentation of Colors by Scout Troop 303 followed by a welcome by the church's Pastor, Fr. T. Gustavo Mansella. Songs and readings from the Bible were followed by the Homily given by former Pastor, The Rev. Jeffrey "Rock" Higgins.

This small church is active in working with the King William Social Services to fulfill The Christmas Dreams of over 400 children. On an ongoing project the church supports King William Fire and Rescue Department. For the 160th anniversary, the membership decided to raise funds to benefit Mangohick Fire Department. The church had decided to buy high visibility jackets for the department.

Special music was provided by The Churchmen, a Bluegrass Gospel group based in Collinsville, Virginia. The group was formed in 1989 when they began singing in local churches. They have recorded several CD's and their latest releases were in 2015 and 2017 – "Crown of Thorns" and "God Holds Tomorrow". The fast moving music was the kind of music that you tap your

fingers or your toes.

In 1859 St. David's Church was built in Aylett and consecrated on November 9th of that year. Although modern conveniences have gradually been added, the sanctuary remains an example of the architectural style of The Protestant Episcopal Church in the mid-19th century, one of the few buildings in Aylett to escape destruction during the Civil War.

The graveyard of St. David's reflects the history of King William County and Virginia. The earliest burial reflects the tragedy of war. Dr. William Pollard, CSA doctor, was killed at the Battle of Sharpsburg in 1862. A survivor of Pickett's Charge, vestryman of the parish and generous donor to St. David's, Colonel William Roane Aylett rests beneath the trees with many of his family members. The last interment was in early 2019.

The church's motto is "To Know Christ Jesus and to Make Jesus Known"

Who are Masons – Men from All Walks of Life

Who are Masons? There are over two million Masons who are men of good character, who strive to improve themselves and make the world a better place. Most men go about their jobs and professions with no hint they are Freemasons except for the way they lead their lives. Many are recognizable by name, face, or accomplishment. George Washington and thirteen other Presidents, eight Vice Presidents and forty - two Justices of the Supreme Court have been Masons. Other notable masons were: John Wayne, Gene Autry, Davy Crockett Jack Dempsey, Benjamin Franklin, Clark Gable, John Glenn, Charles Lindbergh, Arnold Palmer, J. C. Penney, Will Rogers, Red Skelton, Danny Thomas, and John Philip Sousa.

Masons from King and Queen, King William and Essex counties gather at Arlington Masonic Lodge #102 at Millers Tavern. This lodge is celebrating its 150th anniversary since its start in Walkerton in January in 1869 - January 1870. The organization returned to this building in September 1887 and remained there until it moved to its present home in March 1891 at Millers Tavern.

The Masons donate \$2,000,000 every day to charitable causes. Most of the assistance goes to people who are not Masons. The Shrine Masons (Shriners) operate the 22 Shriner hospitals throughout the United States for burned



and orthopedically impaired children in the country, and there is never a fee for the treatment.

The local Masons started fundraising in 2012 to give a yearly scholarship to a student from Essex, the next year to a King and Queen student and the next year to a student from King William. Their fundraising ways of making money include a salt fish breakfast in March, Brunswick stew sold at Locust Grove in December, a pancake breakfast at the Urbanna Masonic Lodge the first Saturday in November for the Oyster Festival, and selling barbecue in April.

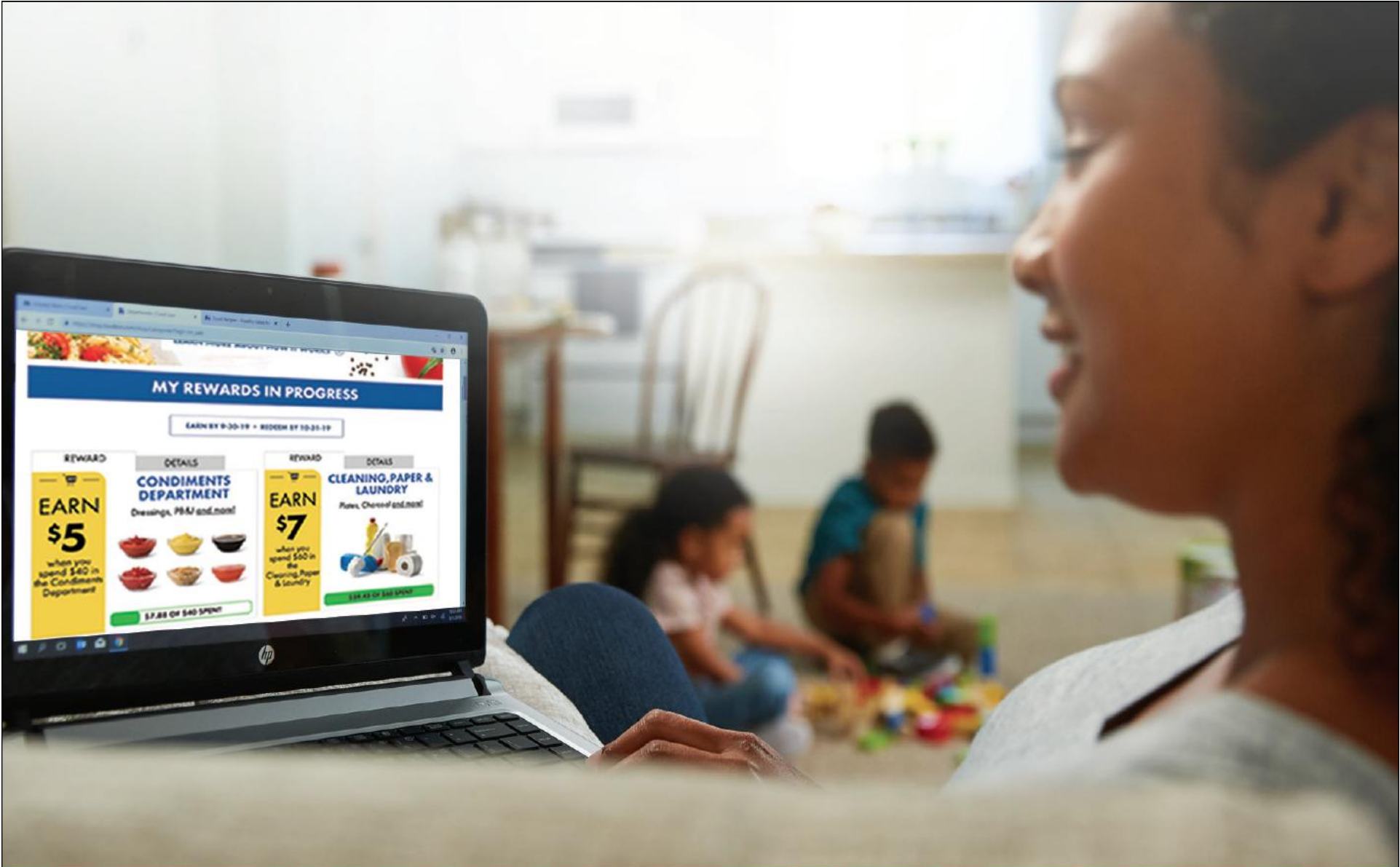

Pursuant to Section 15.2-2204 of the Code of Virginia, on Monday, December 2, 2019, at 6:00 p.m., the King & Queen County Planning Commission will hold a public hearing in the King & Queen Courts and Administration Building, King & Queen Court House, Virginia, to consider the following:

A. RZ19-01 – Rezoning – 1623-165X-783, Walter C. Via Enterprises, Inc., C/o Walter & Judy Via

Rezoning of a 4.526 acre parcel from Agricultural/Residential Single-Family to General Business 2. The parcel is located adjacent to 6574 Lewis B Puller Memorial Highway, in the Buena Vista Magisterial District, in the Economic Development Corridor.

B. ZA19-05 – Zoning Text Amendment – Article 21, Section 3 -496, Fees

Requesting to amend Article 21, Section 3-496, Fees, to include an after the fact erosion and sediment control fee, an erosion and sediment control re-inspection fee and to establish a monthly land disturbance permit fee for large scale projects. This does not apply to projects exempt by law such as mining, timber harvesting/silviculture and farming.

C. ZA19-06 – Zoning Text Amendment – Article 4, Table 4.1, Permitted Use Table

Zoning Text Amendment amending Article 4, Table 4.1 Permitted Use Table by removing Energy Generation Facility (by Natural Resources) in the Agricultural zoning district by approved Conditional Use Permit and setting additional restrictions on such proposals. Note this does not apply to single-family residences as allowed by state code.

D. 15.2-2232(H) - Legal status of plan – Walnut Solar I, LLC

A solar facility subject to subsection A shall be deemed to be substantially in accord with the comprehensive plan if (i) such proposed solar facility is located in a zoning district that allows such solar facilities by right or (ii) such proposed solar facility is designed to serve the electricity or thermal needs of the property upon which such facility is located, or will be owned or operated by an eligible customer-generator or eligible agricultural customer-generator under § 56-594 or by a small agricultural generator under § 56-594.2. All other solar facilities shall be reviewed for substantial accord with the comprehensive plan in accordance with this section. However, a locality may allow for a substantial accord review for such solar facilities to be advertised and approved concurrently in a public hearing process with a rezoning, special exception, or other approval process.

E. CUP18-01 and SP18-04 – Open Road Renewables - Walnut Solar I, LLC

Requesting approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP18-01) and Level 3 Preliminary Site Plan (SP18-04) for a 110 MW utility scale solar energy facility. The subject properties are located south of Lewis B Puller Memorial Highway, north of Taylorsville Road, east of Pear Tree Avenue, and east of York River Road, consisting of approximately of 1,698 acres, in the Buena Vista Magisterial District, County Tax Map Numbers 1623-134R-650, 1623-134R-650D, 1623-134R-199, 1623-65L-2221623-134R-653, 1623-134R-637A, 1623-134R-637C, 1623-134R-653A, 1623-134R-637B, 1623-134R-637, 1623-134R-638, 1623-134R-639, 1623-134R-649, 1623-134R-649A1, 1623-134R-183C, 1623-134R-454, 1623-134L-454B, 1623-134R-649A, 1623-134R-637D.

Dear Editor,

Is King William Trading Prime Farm Land for a Solar City?

As Virginia's energy policies steer the state toward renewable energy ventures like wind and solar, our agricultural industry is finding itself at a crossroads. Amid the declining and uncertain commodity prices, recent tariffs and threats against abolishing land use exemptions, it's no surprise that landowners consider the tempting lucrative lease options dangled like a carrot from the solar industry. There is an old saying amongst farmers "that they are cash poor and land rich" --to some, the option of leasing is viewed as a means to provide stability and financial security for their families, however there is a cost.

According to the 2017 USDA Census of Agriculture, there are 90 farms in King William County, which has dropped 33% since 2012. 58% of these 90 farms are in crop production and/or pastureland, with the remaining 42% in woodlands and other agricultural use. A total of 47,456 acres of King William County land is in farm use, with 12,000 acres of that land considered by the USDA as "Prime Farmland." "Prime farmland, as defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, is land that has the best combination of physical and chemical characteristics for producing food, feed, forage and fiber and oil seed and is available for these uses." This land is of major importance in meeting the nation's short-term and long range needs for food and fiber. You may be asking yourself, how is this relevant to the issue at hand? Well, the site designated to house the proposed Sweet Sue Solar Center project is considered by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service as "Prime Farmland," with the exception of the 33,000 linear feet of non-tidal wetlands. What rationale is behind placing industry in agriculturally zoned areas with the best combination of physical and chemical characteristics for producing the food we eat?

I have been following discussions across states such as Oregon, Michigan, Pennsylvania, North Carolina and Maryland that like the state of Virginia, are also struggling to find a balance between the growth of solar and the protection of

precious farmland. Prime agricultural land should be the last option for development. Industrial projects should be considered on marginal or industrial-zoned land. While the current zoning ordinance does allow for a Conditional Use Permit for this type of industry in this area, the question to our county planning staff and government officials is WHY? Why is our county so eager to decimate the most productive farm land in the county and where does it stop? What are the real motivations behind the project?

Page five of the King William County Comprehensive Plan states, "the (Comp Plan) serves as a guiding document to help balance new residential, commercial, and industrial growth, **while preserving the rural landscape, as well as agricultural, historical, and natural resources, for future generations.**" What precedent is our county setting by allowing this type of utility-scale industrial project to be built in an agricultural zoned area surrounded by residential properties? Such a project will undoubtedly open the door for future companies to view King William County as a target for solar growth, and could potentially rebrand our quaint, rural community as a "solar city." What will our county look like in five or even fifteen years from now? Will cornfields and cattle be replaced by rows of ugly metallic structures?

As I have stated before, I, along with other neighbors, am not anti-solar. The placement and zoning for these facilities should be carefully scrutinized. Solar panels belong on roof tops of big box stores, colleges, schools, government buildings, and the like and the state can incentivize the installation of such facilities. As a new Board of Supervisors prepares to take office in January, we must voice our concerns and explore other viable options for solar placement rather than replace King William County's rural landscape with unsightly solar arrays.
