Honoring Donald Robertson's Colonial School

Mr. Peter Meyerhof, a historian, thought that it was important to commemorate Donald Robertson's school with a marker that explains its great importance. He read everything he could about Robertson and his school, including much material from the K&Q Historical Society library and archives. He conveyed that he mentioned his goal when he visited the Museum about two years ago. Meyerhof wrote the text for a highway marker that was approved by the Virginia Department of Historical Resources. He agreed to sponsor and fund the marker.

The marker was unveiled on Saturday, August 17 at the junction of Newtown Road (Rt. 721) and Sorghum Road (Rt. 660) near the location of the old Owenton post office (no longer standing).

The marker reads:

Donald Robertson's School

Donald Robertson (1717-1783), born and educated in Scotland, established a private boarding school on his farm two miles southwest of here by 1758. Among his students were James Madison, fourth president of the United States and "Father of the Constitution," and Brig. Gen. George Rogers Clark, militia commander in the Old Northwest during the Revolutionary War. Madison attended the school between the ages of 11 and 16 and later described Robertson as "a man of extensive learning, and a distinguished Teacher." Instructing both boys and girls, Robertson provided a classical education influenced by

the Scottish Enlightenment. He operated his highly respected school for at least 15 years.

The Museum website has an online exhibit on Donald Robertson's school and the K&Q Historical Society archaeological investigation that can be accessed at kingandqueenmuseum.org/donald-robertsons-school/.

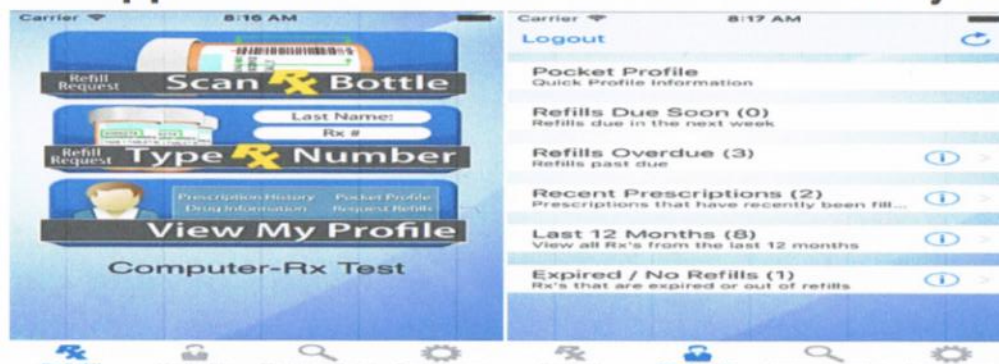

Back in the 1970's Allen Campbell and his father opened the store as NAPA and TruValue. Thirteen years ago Drew Stampley and his dad bought the business and the business was divided. 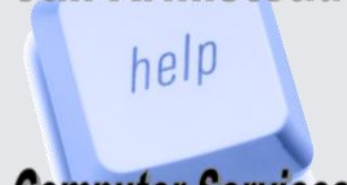

A group of family members and friends came together to support Brenda Vessels Taylor, who is battling stage 3 Multiple Myeloma Cancer, a blood cancer that affects plasma cells. She is a strong candidate for stem cell and awaiting the transplant procedure. Brenda is a native of King William, a graduate of King William High School Class of 1982, and is employed by the King William Count Judicial System as Clerk.

Sonja Vessels, a cousin, and a lifelong friend decided she wanted to do something to help Brenda with her medical expenses at The

Doorway's, which is a lodging facility for patients and loved ones while they are receiving treatments. The goal was to raise \$1,500. Who Won in King William County

I pitched my tent at the Mangohick Fire Station on Election Day. With his permission, I endorsed Bob Ehrhart for supervisor in the 5th district; he came in second. To my left was the tent where the winners stood. This congregation, according to Mr. Ehrhart, were steering voters who were walking into the Station away from him. Judging by their appearances these men were not thinking about the Economic Development Authority. This EDA, not elected, has a fund of \$2,000,000 of taxpayer money to work with. This group has asked the Board of Supervisors to give them control of all county property; Dave Hansen, 4th district, and Bob Ehrhart voted against

that proposal. The motion had one vote out of five and was defeated. If that vote were held today, I believe there would be two votes to give control of county property to the EDA. If one supervisor flips or one of the newly elected supervisors supports privatization, the Board of Supervisors can vote to give the Economic Development Authority control of county property. With two million in seed money and county property to kick around, the sky is the limit for the obligations the EDA can transfer to County taxpayers. Who won the election in King William County? The Economic Development Authority won the election.

I am concerned about his wanton disregard for The Constitution of The United States of America

Dear, Editor,

What kind of world are we leaving for future generations?

There is currently a proposed solar energy project in King William County, called Sweet Sue Solar. In supporting this project, we have the opportunity to leave our future generations a better environment. It would also have the capacity to produce 77 megawatts onto the Rappahannock grid to sustainably power more than 16,000 homes.

The land used as a solar farm will produce 1.8 million dollars in [new] county tax revenue over the next 15 years that will go to the county general fund and local schools. Left as corn and soybean fields, the tax dollars would be almost nil.

There would be no pollution from the solar panels. In the unlikely event of a tornado or wildfire, the parent company, Invenergy, would be responsible for the cleanup and or repairs.

The solar farm would be almost invisible with equipment not topping 15 feet, and vegetation will screen the panels. This is a much more attractive alternative to the current accepted practice of clear cutting and abandoning the desecrated property.

I have seen a lot of complaints online and

in the papers about the toxic materials in the panels and how they could cause toxic runoff. As a concerned resident myself, I met with a representative of Sweet Sue Solar. I was informed that the panels do not contain lead or carcinogenic cadmium, and instead only contain glass, aluminum and small amounts of conductive material of silver, copper, and silicon. I think it's important that I share that with the county.

As a King William County resident, a mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother, I fully support Sweet Sue. The future of energy must be renewable and include solar and wind.

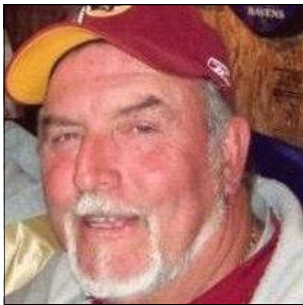

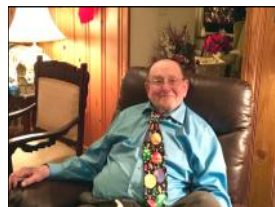

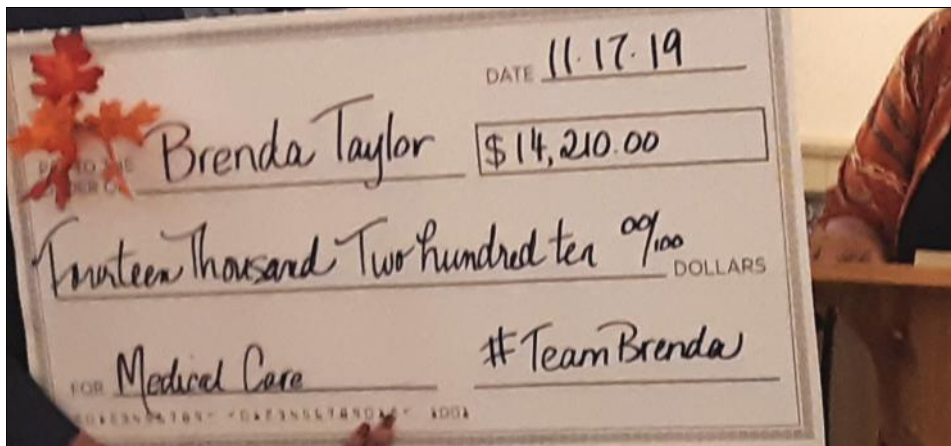

Miracles for Megan

Thursday, September 19, 2019, was a regular day for Megan Lee until she went to her OB visit for her 36th week checkup. She was in the exam room waiting for the nurse to return to the room to give her a flu shot. When the nurse returned, Megan was in cardiac arrest. The staff began CPR, 911 was called and the AED was used to shock twice. On the way to MCV the crew shocked Megan again. IT TOOK TWELVE (12) MINUTES TO REVIVE MEGAN FROM THE EXAM ROOM UNTIL SHE STARTED BREATHING ENROUTE.

Upon arrival at the hospital, Megan was put into an induced coma so she could be put into therapeutic hypothermia therapy (also known as cooling), which is a new procedure where the body's temperature is lowered to 93 – 94 degrees for at least 24 hours and then eight to ten hours to raise the body temperature. The purpose is to protect the heart and brain. The doctors at VCU had never cooled a pregnant woman before.

The doctors advised delivery of the baby after 8 hours of warming. Baby Caroline was delivered in perfect health on Saturday, September 21, at 9:17 a.m. weighing six pounds and measuring nineteen inches long. At 12:40 p.m. Megan regained full consciousness. Megan came home on September 28 and Caroline joined her family on October 2. Today baby Caroline is doing fine, and Megan has fully recovered from her life changing events.

Megan's mother, Rhonda Redman, says they are overwhelmed by the miracles God gave them and so very thankful for the many people He worked thru to save Megan and Caroline. Two main ones were: (1) Megan was in the doctor's office where there was staff and equipment to handle the situation: and (2) the decision was made by rescue personnel to divert from Regional

Memorial Hospital (next door) to MCV.
