Human Remains Found

The King William Sheriff's Office recovered human remains in a heavily wooded area on ElSassar Rd. Hunters came across the remains and contacted the Sheriff's Office. Sheriff J.S. Walton said in a press release, "Investigators believe the remains could be that of 55 year old Farran Braxton who was reported missing in late September. The remains, found approximately two miles away from where she went missing, have been sent to the Medical Examiners Office in Richmond for positive identification".



Making Conservation Resources More Accessible for All

Richmond, VA, Jan. 30, 2020 - When Longleaf Pine - Stand establishment and Calvin T. McGhee, Jr., began working with his son and namesake to re-establish McGhee Farms in Louisa County, Va., he National Water Quality Initiative knew they didn't want to continue down the same path the family had followed for generations. Both men had seen the negative impacts of cattle in the property's creeks and ponds and wanted to clear up those issues for themselves and their descendants. The McGhees received financial assistance N through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) to improve their pasture and grazing management and to install additional stream protection and waterers for their cattle and hay operation. "We can put livestock in places we couldn't put them before," says Calvin T. McGhee, III. "We have waterers in places that didn't originally have water. We put in divisional On-Farm Energy - Agricultural Energy fencing where we couldn't have divided them off at first. So, it [EQIP] helped to overcome those types of challenges and put in some conservation practices to do our Organic - Practices to help certified part to save the environment."

Historically underserved producers* like the McGhees can use the EQIP Advance Payment option to start their stewardship journeys and get higher payment rates for StrikeForce - Priority ranking for cropland, the practices they install. 

Human Remains Found

Braxton was last seen leaving her home on Union Hope Road on foot around 6:45 a.m. Friday, Sept. 20, officials said.

The search included ground teams on foot, K-9 teams, equine teams and aircraft.

Chris took over 12 hours to cleanup the 2.6 mile section he adopted with some of that time spent in the rain. Nine large orange bags were filled with trash. VDOT was scheduled to pick them up, but took so long that neighbors eventually took the bags to the dump. Cigarette butts were the most common item. The


Three Rivers Soil & Water Conservation **District Scholarship Opportunities**


