Biden Is the Democratic Presidential Choice in King William

Former Vice President and current Democratic Presidential candidate Joe Biden swept the Democratic Presidential primary in King William on March 3rd as he garnered 61% (1,049) of the vote with Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders coming in a distant second with 19% (330) of the vote. Former New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg came in third with 10% (175) of the vote. King William County had 12,557 registered voters prior to March 3 but only 14% (1,731) voted. King William went the way of the state as Biden received 53% of the vote statewide and Sanders got 23%. Virginia will have an estimated 124 delegates comprised of 99 pledged delegates and 25 superdelegates at the Democratic National Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on July 13-16. Biden will have at least 51 of the pledged delegates (allotted according to percentages of the votes received) going into the Democratic National Convention. The superdelegates who are comprised of party leaders and elected officials are unpledged and can choose for themselves for whom they vote.

Delegate Scott Wyatt Speaks to Mattaponi Crime Solvers, Inc.

Delegate Scott Wyatt spoke to Mattaponi Crime Solvers, Inc. on Wednesday, March 11th at the King William Social Services Building. He is the newly elected delegate from parts of King William, Hanover, and New Kent serving his first term in the Virginia General Assembly.

He outlined some of the major changes, some popular and some controversial - coming from this General Assembly that will be effective July 1, 2020. They include: assault weapons not banned; local governments can determine firearm ordinances; possible legalizing of marijuana next year; lottery tickets can be sold over the computer; new voters can register on Election Day with no photo identification necessary; cigarette tax will increase 24 cents per pack to 54 cents per pack; a 10 cents per gallon increase on gas; monthly electric bills will increase 18 - 22% and casino gambling is coming to Virginia.

Delegate Wyatt stated, "Our state of Virginia will change after this term of the General Assembly."

Wittman Votes For COVID-19 Response Aid

WASHINGTON — Congressman Rob Wittman released this statement after voting in favor of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act:

This is a very serious public health threat to the people of the United States and I will continue working with my colleagues in Congress, the Administration, and state officials to ensure we continue to have an aggressive response to this outbreak."

SCHMITZ, Andrew James, USN, Fireman 1st Class, died protecting our freedom while serving on the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on December 7, 1941. The Defense POW/MIA Accounting



Agency (DPAA) announced last year that Navy Fireman 1st Class Andrew J. Schmitz, 26, killed during World War II, was accounted for September 18, 2019. Fireman First Class Schmitz was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Schmitz. Andrew was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart, American Defense Service Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal and the World

War II Victory Medal. He was born on November 25, 1915, in Richmond, Va. Surviving at the time of his death were his parents, Andrew I. Schmitz and Georgia Fowler Schmitz. Also surviving were his sisters, Alma, Eunice, Judith, Edna, Georgia Faye and Marguerite; and his brothers, Edward, Earl, John, Herman, Francis, Jesse and Harold. He leaves behind several nieces and nephews. Services with full military honors will be held at 12 noon on Friday, March 6, 2020, in the chapel at Virginia Veterans Cemetery at Amelia, 10300 Pridesville Rd., Amelia, Va. Rylee Hogge is a beautiful ten-year-old little girl who attends the fourth grade at Acquinton Middle School. Her parents are Ray and Crystal Hogge and sister Lacey. On October 30, ten-year-old Rylee began a “journey” into an unknown illness filled with pain and hospital and doctor visits.

According to her mother, Rylee came home on that date with what she described as a very bad headache. When Halloween came the next day, she said she couldn’t go out trick or treating. Crystal knew this was something more than just a headache because she had looked forward to Halloween for so long.

Crystal noticed the left pupil of her eye was dilated very large, and the complaint of pain was on the opposite side of her head. A trip to the pediatrician confirmed that this was something very emergent. They went to VCU Emergency Room and Rylee was evaluated. This would be the start of her “journey.”

Rylee was eventually diagnosed with a rare neurological condition in which her eyesight was deteriorating quickly. The pressure on her brain was very high and she needed a swift treatment plan.

During her stay at VCU Medical Center, she was placed on the seventh floor, the

“Child Life Unit.” This pediatric unit has sixty beds and stays full. It was there that they met the “Child Life Team” who came to offer support and guidance through Rylee’s scans and medical procedures.

She had five roommates during her stay and started to feel the sadness of what being “sick” really meant. Rylee put her feelings into action. She told her mother that when she got out of the hospital, she

wanted to start her own ministry to help the children on the Child Life floor.

On the way home from being discharged, they came up with the name “Rylee Smiles.” This name was chosen because every morning when the doctors would make their rounds, they would ask her how she felt and she would always smile and say “good.”

Throughout her sickness, the family’s church, Colosse Baptist Church, poured out their love and support for Rylee in many ways. A friend from church contacted Crystal about what could be done for Rylee. Rylee just wanted to help others so the church collected games for the kids on the seventh floor. This would be the first of many drop-offs of donations to the children at the VCU Medical Center.

Since beginning her ministry, Rylee has received many donations and so much support to be able to continue with the “Rylee Smiles” project. She knew how it felt being sick and afraid, and wanted to help another child while knowing that while being in the hospital is no fun, they



can be made to feel so much better when you feel the warmth and love of others.

Rylee’s health has improved but she has a long road ahead of her. The family’s faith in God has given them the strength to face each “obstacle” that has come Rylee’s way since being diagnosed. She has been blessed to have family, friends, church family, her school and the caring community’s support.

She will continue to “bless” those on the seventh floor. Currently, she is working on Easter baskets for all sixty children. From the words of Rylee, “If it makes another kid happy, then I know I’m doing what I should be doing. I don’t ever want to stop.”

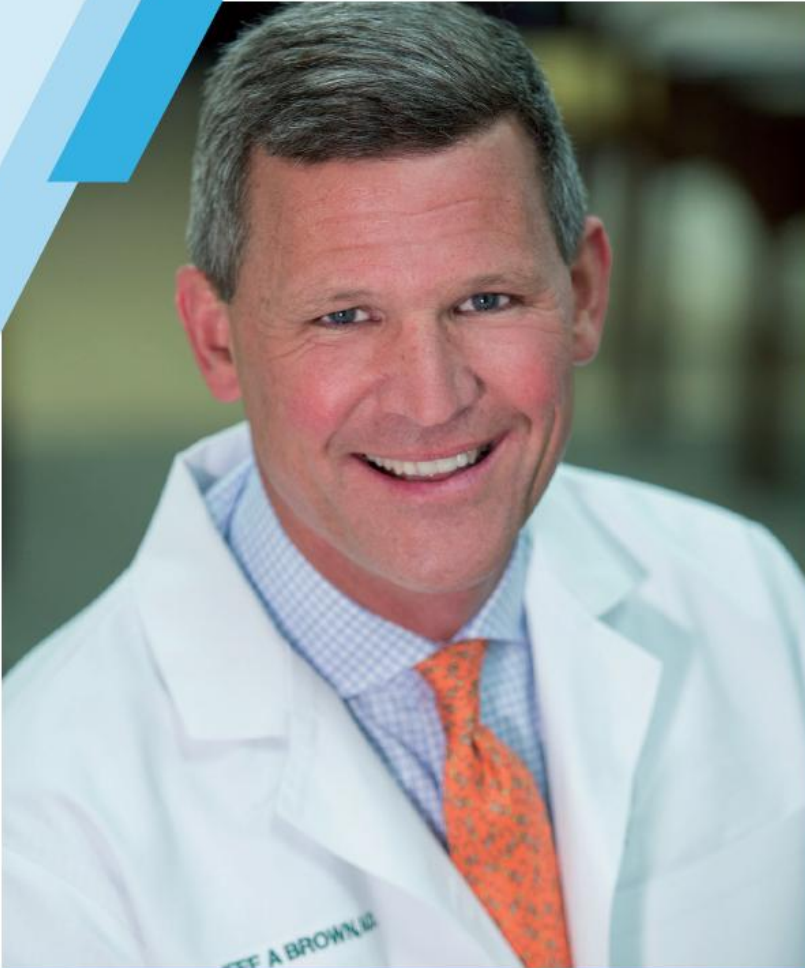
