## King & Queen Commonwealth's Attorney Speaks to Mattaponi Crime Solvers



Meredith Adkins addresses Crime Solvers

Meredith Adkins, new King and Queen County Commonwealth's Attorney since January 2020, was the guest speaker at the August meeting of Mattaponi Crime Solvers. She has been a life-long resident of King and Queen County, graduated from the Naval Academy at Annapolis and was stationed at Bataan. Because of bad knees, she became a disabled veteran in 2009.

Ms. Adkins decided to be a lawyer, attended and graduated from T. C. Williams School of Law. She knew she wanted to be a prosecutor and has been for most of her career. When her dad, Charles Adkins retired as Commonwealth's Attorney in 2019, Ms. Adkins decided she would run for the job. In January 2020 she became the Commonwealth's Attorney of King and Queen County.

She told the group that about 75% of her cases are drug related – buying and selling drugs, stealing to buy drugs, and pass thru people going from one place to another. During the virus, the caseload was smaller because no one was traveling. Now

domestic violence cases are increasing.

She states, "I want to make sure the citizens are protected. My family lives here and I am passionate about keeping them safe. I care about the county and the citizens and I'm available for them to talk to me."

For LAW ENFORCEMENT - King William Sheriff Jeff Walton reported that in the early morning hours of Tuesday, August 5, during a power outage, several individuals cut the fencing at 360 Hardware and removed a 14 foot Holmes landscaping/utility trailer, a Toro walk behind mower, and a Woods box blade. A the same time two trailer license plates were taken from trailers at Virginia Outdoors. If anyone has any information on these incidents, please call the Sheriff's Office at 769-0999 (non-emergency) or Crime Solvers at 769-3000.

He also reported an increase in domestic violence injury cases. A new unmanned satellite office of the Sheriff's Department will be completed hopefully by the end of the year at the former dentist office on Route 360.

**An Ordinance to Update the Schedule for the General Reassessment  
of Real Estate in King William County from a Six Year Period  
to a Four-Year Period**

The Board of Supervisors of King William County, Virginia, will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, September 28, 2020 at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the Board Meeting Room of the County Administration Building, 180 Horse Landing Road, King William, Virginia, to receive public comment and to consider the ordinance captioned above.

Ordinance #09-20 will amend the effective date of the next general reassessment of real property in the county. The Board of Supervisors at the October 23, 2017 meeting extended the existing four-year schedule to a six-year schedule with the current reassessment to be effective January 1, 2021. With this Ordinance, the County would schedule reassessments to be effective every four years with the next reassessment scheduled for January 1, 2025.

All interested persons may appear and present their views at the above time and place. ## Bay Aging breaks ground on new 40-unit apartment building in Gloucester County

(Urbanna, VA) – Bay Aging recently broke ground on a new income-restricted senior apartment building in Gloucester County. The new 40-unit apartment complex will provide needed affordable



housing for seniors in Gloucester County and complement the ten existing Bay Aging senior rental housing communities across the region. "This effort has been years in the making," said Joshua Gemerek, Senior Vice President of Bay Aging's Housing Division. "Obviously, we would have liked to have held a big groundbreaking ceremony, but COVID-19 concerns kept us from doing so. Nevertheless, we are very excited to add to the affordable housing stock in the area."

Daffodil Gardens Phase II is being constructed adjacent to the original Daffodil Gardens; a 64-unit rental housing community built in Gloucester County in 2001. The human service campus also includes Bay Aging's Gloucester Adult Day Care Center and a Bay Transit facility, which provides residents with easy access to an array of services. Residents are only minutes away from Riverside Walter Reed Hospital, a Food Lion grocery store, pharmacy and other professional services and shops.

Parker General Contractors, which has completed several affordable housing projects for Bay Aging, is overseeing the construction of Daffodil Gardens Phase II. DBF Associates are the projects architects and Bay Design Group are providing civil engineering services. The facility will meet both universal design and sustainability standards. Daffodil Gardens Phase II will fill an important gap in the local Gloucester community. Daffodil Gardens, the existing apartment complex, remains at full capacity, highlighting the continuing need for affordable senior housing across the region. The new apartments will help residents live in a setting where they can easily access related services and support the community's long-term vitality. Half of the units will serve residents with incomes at or below 60 percent of the area median

income (AMI), while the other half will be reserved for residents whose incomes are at or below 50 percent AMI. "Daffodil Gardens II will help address a serious shortage of affordable housing for older residents not just in Gloucester County but across the entire region," said Kathy Vesley, President and CEO of Bay Aging. "We appreciate the tremendous support we received from a myriad of partners including Virginia Housing, Virginia Community Capital, Federal Home Loan Bank of Atlanta, Virginia Community Development Corporation, Southeast Rural Community Assistance Project, the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, and the Gloucester Economic Development Authority who all helped to make Daffodil Gardens II a reality," she added.

Established in 1978, Bay Aging is a premier provider of programs and services for residents in a mostly rural 2,600-square-mile region covering 10 counties on Virginia's Middle Peninsula and Northern Neck. Bay Aging delivers diverse programs through three divisions: Community Living, Bay Transit, and Bay Housing. 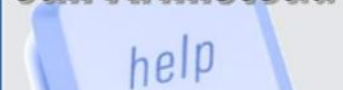

## Virginia to Launch Unmanned Aerial Systems Flight Information Exchange ~ Multi-agency collaboration to create pilot program that will help ensure Virginia has the safest and most open UAS airspace in the U.S.

RICHMOND—The Virginia Department of Aviation (DOAV) and Center for Innovative Technology (CIT) today announced the launch of the Virginia Flight Information Exchange pilot program, a tool that will allow state and local governments to share information among unmanned aerial systems (UAS) stakeholders and address key safety and policy concerns while keeping the airspace open, secure, and integrated with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) control of the national airspace. Virginia Flight Information Exchange will ensure the Commonwealth balances both the safest and most open UAS airspace in the country. The Virginia Flight Information Exchange is a platform for state and local government agencies to publish and share advisory information with each other, UAS Service Suppliers (USS), unmanned system operators, and the public to promote transparency and public safety. The pilot program will evaluate the benefits of information sharing, inform thoughtful regulation, and demonstrate a state-supported approach to UAS communications and coordination. The pilot program was developed through a public-private collaboration with the Virginia DOAV, CIT and its Virginia Unmanned Systems Center, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), and Advanced Technology Applications (ATA), a leading data science and engineering company in Northern Virginia. "Innovation plays a critical role in the continuous evolution of Virginia's multimodal transportation network," said Virginia Secretary of Transportation Shannon Valentine. "The development of the Virginia Flight Information Exchange demonstrates Virginia's commitment to collaborative solutions and the future of the emerging UAS industry sector." The Virginia Flight Information Exchange will be the first state-sponsored authoritative Supplemental Data Service Provider



(SDSP) to exist in the FAA's UAS Traffic Management (UTM), which is an ecosystem of infrastructure and protocols enabling the management of low altitude drone operations. "With one of the strongest technology workforces in the country, Virginia has been an aggressive early adopter of UAS, and the Flight Information Exchange furthers our Commonwealth's reputation as an industry leader," said Secretary of Commerce and Trade Brian Ball. "By working with Virginia industry leaders like ATA, we support the growth of unmanned aerial systems capabilities and opportunities throughout the Commonwealth. We're very proud that Virginia is playing a key role in UAS, and it's exciting to be part of this rapidly evolving industry." "It is great to be working with a team willing to collaborate, experiment, and share lessons learned," said Craig Parisot, Chief Executive Officer of ATA, LLC. "We are helping states and localities gain a necessary technical capability while setting an important example for how states can support the growth of UAS and commercial UTM solutions in a manner that best serves the public interest." 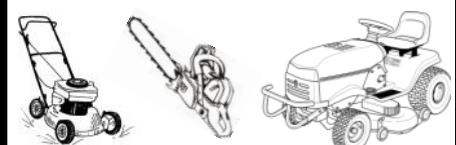

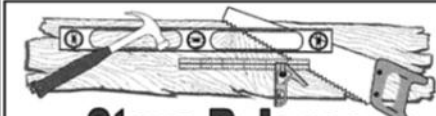
