



The article does not reflect the concerns and the truth about the assessments, including Errors, Higher than Current FMV assessments and Retail prices, questionable means of the assessments.

No onsite review was performed with the homeowner and the field inspector.

No county assessor was available to do a thorough assessment in 2019.
