


Dixon's open their business in King William 2011. Since then they've opened an additional shop in Ashland. Later this year they will be in their brand new King William facility once construction is completed..

An Ordinance to Update the Schedule for the **General Reassessment of Real Estate in King** William County to a four-year period starting on January 1, 2023

The Board of Supervisors of King William County, Virginia, will hold a Public Hearing on March 8, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the Board Meeting Room of the County Administration Building, 180 Horse Landing Road, King William, Virginia, via Zoom to receive public comment and to consider the ordinance included below:

Sec. 70-45. - Four-year assessment and equalization cycle.

There shall be a general reassessment and equalization of assessments of all real property in the county on a four-year cycle, with the next such general reassessment being effective on January 1, 2023, and with subsequent general reassessments being effective every fourth year thereafter.

Ordinance 9-20, effective on January 1, 2023, is hereby repealed and of no legal effect.

Ordinance 21-17, effective on January 1, 2021, is hereby repealed and of no legal effect.

All interested persons may appear and present their views at the above time and place. Attendance at this meeting is limited pursuant to the Governor's Executive Orders on COVID-19. If a member of the public cannot attend, comments may be submitted by mail to 180 Horse Landing Road #4, King William, VA 23086; by fax to (804) 769-4964, or by email to countyadmin@kingwilliamcounty.us. Comments received by 12:00 noon on the day of the hearing will be distributed to Board members and made a part of the public record. A complete copy of the proposed ordinance may be viewed in the Office of the County Administrator at 180 Horse Landing Road, King William, VA, during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or at www.kingwilliamcounty.us.
