The design and approval process was started last spring. The new shop's expected opening will be in the fall of 2021 and will be next door to their temporary location.

For those of you who remember "The Little Supermarket" in Manquin, you remember Tommy Chisholm. Tommy passed away on March 2nd at the age of 81. He started his career in the grocery business as an A&P store manager. He made his mark in the community running one of only two grocery stores in King William at the time. He later opened a grocery store in Bowling Green. Tommy never met a stranger and was always flashing that big broad smile while helping everyone with their food needs. He was a former member and past president of the King William Ruritan Club and also served on the King William County

Board of Zoning Appeals.

One of the best steaks I have ever put into my mouth was one of Tommy's marinated steaks at our Annual Ruritan Ladies Night Dinner at the river. In the 1990s the King William club always had the best hospitably room at the Annual Ruritan Chesapeake District convention in Williamsburg, largely because of Tommy. Tommy liked having a good time too and was one of the first on the dance floor at the district convention. Fellow Ruritan member Bryant Wilson said, "Tommy was the last of the kitchen gang" that was responsible for the club meals in the 1980s and '90s. Tommy, have one of your mouthwatering steaks ready for me when we meet again in heaven.

fun, Live on now, make me proud of what you become.



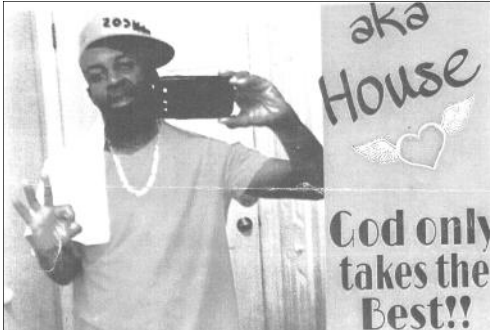

KW Planning Commission Talks of New Water Tower, New Planning and Zoning Ordinance

The King William Planning Commission held its monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 3rd. Topics on the agenda included the future location of the county's new water tower and the draft zoning ordinance.

The water tower in Central Garage has reached maximum usage calling for the need to have another tower constructed. Tax map parcel 29-8 on Kelley Lane had been proposed as the site for the new tower. During public comment, Steven Tupponce on behalf of the Upper Mattaponi Indian Tribe brought forth concerns around the location. The area is ancestral land to the tribe. Development on this land could result in uncovering artifacts or even burial sites. These findings could cause significant delays in project timelines. The commission agreed this should be considered and a motion was made to table the discussion.

The drafted planning and zoning ordinance are currently in the review and discussion stages. Chris Couch and Raymond Carter spoke in public comment on landowner's rights and lot sizes. As the draft stands now landowners would not be able to gift land to family within 5 years of purchasing it. Carter feels the landowner should have say in what they do and disagrees with having this stipulation in the ordinance. Both Carter and Couch advocated for adjusting the ordinance to allow for smaller residential lots in areas zoned as agricultural. They

feel this would better accommodate landownership for lower-income levels. Residents have been surveyed by mail and online for feedback on the draft. The commission plans to review the survey results and present them to the Board of Supervisors in their joint work session later this month.

Interim Planning Director Sherry Graham provided updates from the planning department. On Friday, March 5th they were scheduled to meet with Hill Studio to tour the county and discuss the updated county comprehensive plan that is being developed. On Tuesday, April 6th public hearings will be held for two conditional use permit applications the department has received. King William Sand and Gravel has applied to add approximately 100 acres to a conditional use permit they were granted in 2001. This would allow them to begin another phase on their gravel pit. The other application is for an accessory dwelling to be added to a private property located on Custis Millpond Rd.

The Planning Commission is adjourned until their joint work session with the Board of Supervisors on Wednesday, March 24th.

Demand Surges for Bay Transit's New Freedom Program Services

Program Manager Katherine Newman has seen increased demand for years (Urbanna, VA) – Bay Transit, the public transportation division of Bay Aging, has been in operation for nearly 25 years and residents across the Northern Neck and Middle Peninsula have long enjoyed the award-winning service. Now more than ever, Bay Transit's New Freedom Mobility Management program is also in high demand. A growing population of area residents that are sixty years old or older, as well as individuals with chronic illnesses, have contributed to increased demand for these critical transportation services.

New Freedom is a transportation service providing seniors and individuals with disabilities the ability to attend medical appointments, shop, work and attend social and recreational events even for travel outside of Bay Transit's service area and/or service hours. Participants pay a nominal fee for each round trip. For round trips of fifty miles or less, there is a five-dollar fare. For round trip journeys greater than fifty miles the fare is only ten dollars. As Katherine Newman, Bay Transit's New Freedom Program Manager, explains, "We even provide free transportation for anyone that needs to accompany the rider to assist them in and out of the vehicle or with their appointment."

Ms. Newman has been managing Bay Transit's New Freedom program since 2013 and is a passionate advocate for program participants. New Freedom is funded



through a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grant to serve all twelve counties in Bay Transit's service area. Because these federal funds are limited, program participation is limited to not more than two round trip rides per month. A partnership with the MedCarry Volunteer Transportation program supplements New Freedom to help address additional demand. "Individuals of any age with disabilities qualify to participate in New Freedom whether they have a short-term disability such as a broken leg or they are rehabilitating after surgery,"

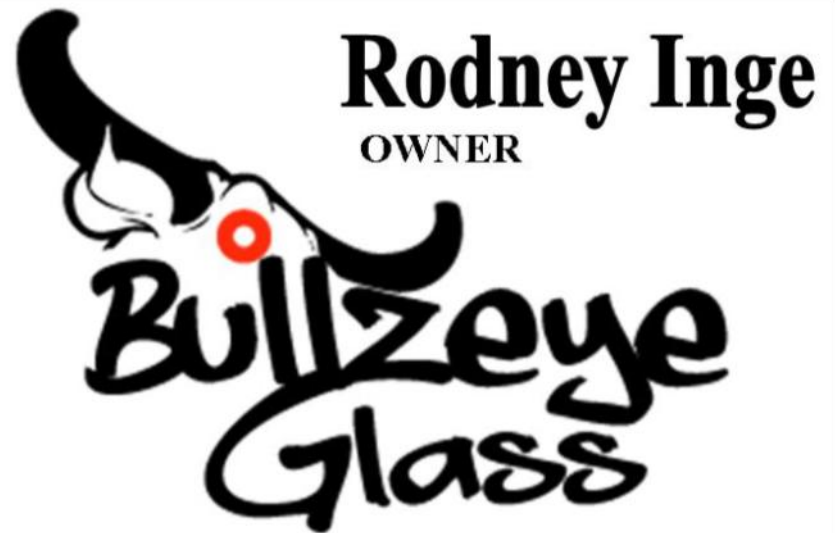

Newman said. "Those with long-term disabilities, mental health disabilities, with mobility issues or chronic health issues are also eligible to participate." About ninety percent of New Freedom trips are outside of Bay Transit's service area to typical destinations such as the VA Medical Centers in Richmond and Hampton, regional hospitals in Newport News and for medical services in Fredericksburg, Richmond, Williamsburg, and Norfolk.

"We ask people to contact the New Freedom office at least three business days before their scheduled appointment. Because of increased demand for New Freedom service, I always urge people to call us as soon as their appointment is made to give us as much time as possible to get their journey scheduled," Newman said. "If New Freedom cannot provide transportation at the time of your appointment, we'll make every effort to find another means of transportation for you. We have partnerships with seven local private transportation companies and the human services agencies in the area, so we'll do everything possible to find you a ride," she added. "The drivers provide curb-to-curb service and typically wait for you through the entire appointment."

Bay Transit currently employs three drivers dedicated to the New Freedom program, but more drivers are needed. "We need drivers for the West Point, New Kent and Charles City

areas immediately," Newman noted. "We also need MedCarry volunteer drivers throughout the entire twelve county service area. Like all volunteering opportunities available through Bay Aging, being a MedCarry volunteer is incredibly rewarding. We do provide the MedCarry volunteer drivers with a modest mileage reimbursement, but the biggest reward is cultivating relationships with the riders, some of whom are transportation disadvantaged and really count on us to get them to their medical appointments," she added.

"The New Freedom program provides transportation for a variety of purposes, not just for medical appointments," Newman noted. "During COVID-19, our focus has been on essential trips such as medical appointments, grocery and prescription fulfillment. Throughout the years we've transported individuals to family reunions, funerals, worship services, visits with family and friends outside Bay Transit's traditional service area, and much more. It's an awesome complement to Bay Transit's primary service area and normal business hours."

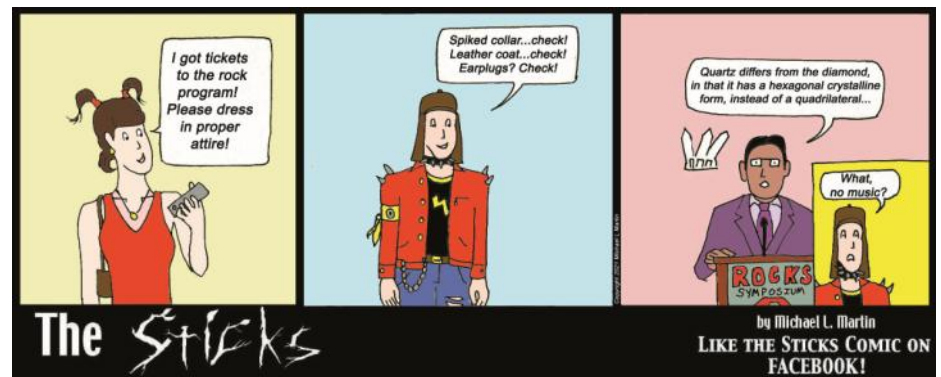
