*Maggie and I had gone running after a rabbit and we ended up getting lost. Then, Maggie and I got in an argument about which direction would lead home and we ended up going separately trying to beat the other home. I came out of the woods onto that dreaded road and there was a man working at a foreclosed house, renovating it.*

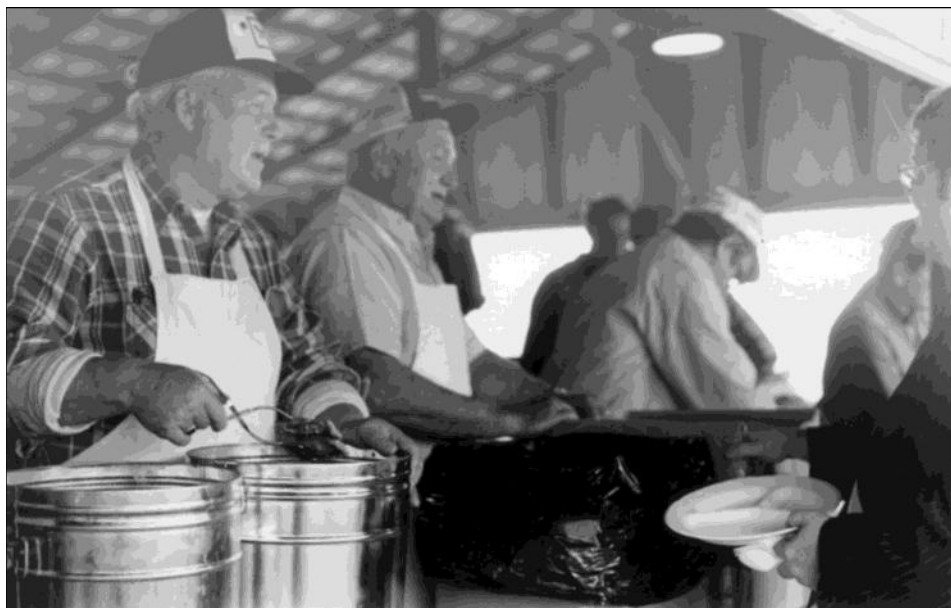


moments away from unconsciousness when to her great fortune the department store manager sees her and unplugs the ride.

## King William FY2022 Proposed Budget Public Hearing

The Board of Supervisors held their first public hearing for the FY2022 budget on Monday, April 5<sup>th</sup>. Interim County Administrator Steve Hudgins gave a brief presentation on the county's proposed budget. FY2022 budget priorities include adding six additional Sheriff's Deputies, three of which would be designated to court services.

13 full-time Firefighters/EMTs would also be added and fully funded for three years through the SAFER grant. Other items included building maintenance and renovations, paving projects, water utility projects, vehicle and radio replacements, Fire and EMS apparatus and equipment, and increased funding for the schools over the FY2021 budget.

Resident Yvonne Broadus, as well as school board members Terry Stone and Steven Tupponce spoke in favor of adopting the proposed King William County Public Schools budget as is. Raymond Carter commented that there needs to be more fiscal responsibility and better use of Federal and FEMA grants. Amanda Walker asked for more transparency during the budget process, stating the proposed budget was published online the day of the hearing, not allowing citizens adequate time for review. She also stated a line-by-line budget has not been provided from the schools. Christopher Couch advocated for hiring an in-house County Attorney citing research he pooled from 18 months of legal services invoices. Couch stated the county legal services workload averages 46 hours a month and by hiring an attorney we could increase those hours by 262% while decreasing the cost of the hours by 74%. He feels hiring a salaried in-house attorney would benefit the county by removing bias as well as any motivation to incur billable hours.

County tax rates will not be changing due to the recent property assessments being tossed. No public comments were made during the hearing for the proposed tax levies.

The Supervisors each spoke encouraging feedback from residents. They have asked that anyone with questions or concerns throughout the budget process contact them. The proposed budget can be viewed in person at 180 Horse Landing Road, King William, VA 23086 from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. It can also be viewed online at [kingwilliamcounty.us/223/Budget](http://kingwilliamcounty.us/223/Budget). Adoption of a final budget is expected to take place at the Regular BoS Meeting on April 26<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 pm. This meeting will be in person with a Zoom option as well.

*This is going to end very badly for K.W taxpayers*

Combing through a variety of Budget documents I came across a statement on two school expenses that caught my attention. Public Schools implemented some years back a O.P.E.B program (Other Post Employment Benefits) Initially it was intended as a supplemental retirement benefit for 1st tier school employees, Top administrative officials, principals, assistant principals, but like all government (or should I say taxpayer funded programs) the list of those eligible for this benefit was expanded. Politicians (school boards are politicians) can not resist handing out goodies each year, especially since it carries no immediate costs.

I am reminded that just 2 years ago the Richmond Times Dispatch newspaper did an expose on the nightmare in Chesterfield County that this program has created by going on for 20 years without any public recognition in their Fiscal accounting to pay for what was when discovered a staggering 100 million dollars in an unfunded liability that had been glossed over for 2 decades.

Here in King William County we have the very same program covering a considerable number of school employees that our group (K.W.T.P) pushed School Board Rep Steve Tupponce for some

answers on when this came to light. Let me be polite and say that Mr. Tupponce was evasive in the details we wanted to have more information on. Was KWCPs reserving for this future expense? If so then where is it in the school budget accounted for? According to documents this is now required to be "booked" as a liability and stands at some \$500,000.00.

## Three Rivers Health District Will Expand COVID-19 Vaccination to "Phase 2" Recipients

(Middlesex County, Va.) The Virginia Department of Health's Three Rivers Health District (TRHD) will begin to vaccinate anyone in Phase 2 beginning on April 12, 2021. Phase 2 includes anyone who requests a vaccination and is over 16 years old. Those age 16 and 17 will have to be accompanied by an adult.

TRHD will continue to prioritize vaccination for anyone in Phase 1a, 1b and 1c who registers to receive it.

While vaccine supply is increasing, it remains limited. Regardless of the phase you are in, you must have an appointment to receive a vaccination. Availability of appointments will vary dependent upon the supply of vaccine.

Phase 1a of vaccination includes health care personnel and those in long-term care facilities. Phase 1b includes those 65 and older, frontline essential workers and people age 16 to 64 with an underlying medical condition that puts them at increased risk of severe illness. Phase 1c includes other essential workers in energy, water, wastewater and waste removal, housing and construction, food service, transportation and logistics, institutions of higher learning, finance, information technology and communications, media, legal services, public safety and public health. Phase 2 includes the general public 16 years old and over. All phases are identified in detail at [www.vdh.virginia.gov/covid-19-vaccine/](http://www.vdh.virginia.gov/covid-19-vaccine/).

"We are excited about the progress we have made in vaccinations in our community so far", said Dr. Richard Williams, MD, MPH health director for Three Rivers Health District, "We look forward to expanding vaccination opportunities to the general public who have been waiting their turn."

Vaccines are available by appointment only. To pre-register, or to update your pre-registration record, visit [www.vaccinate.virginia.gov](http://www.vaccinate.virginia.gov) or call 1-877-VAX-IN-VA (1-877-829-4682). English- and Spanish-speaking operators are available. Translation services also are available, in more than 100 languages. For TTY, dial 7-1-1.

When you receive your appointment for a vaccine, please follow these guidelines at the vaccination site:

Please plan to arrive no earlier than 10 minutes prior to your appointment time. Too many people arriving too early causes backups.

Appointments are required at all locations for COVID-19 vaccination in our area. Walk-ins will not be accepted. Please pre-register to be contacted for an appointment.

Remember to continue masking and social distancing outside your household and wash your hands.

## An Even Better “Good to go!”

**Bay Transit installs premium cabin filtration systems and touchless hand sanitizers on buses**

(Urbanna, VA) – Last summer, Bay Transit, the public transportation division of Bay Aging, initiated a campaign promoting its commitment to customer service and safety in confronting COVID-19. Bay Transit’s ‘Good to go!’ campaign included advertising on the outside of several buses touting many of the safety protocols and best practices implemented to ensure drivers and riders safety. These measures included offering free rides on all Bay Transit buses to keep passengers and drivers from having to exchange money. “With plexiglass shields surrounding the driver’s seat on all buses, plexiglass partitions between passenger seats, limiting the number of riders for social distancing, daily cleaning and disinfecting of all buses, requiring drivers and riders to wear face masks, and even offering free hand sanitizer and face masks to any rider who needs them, we are employing best practices to ensure everyone’s safety,” said Ken Pollock, Bay Transit’s Director. “We continue to explore additional best practices that can be implemented to help keep everyone safe on Bay Transit’s buses,” he added. Two additional safety enhancements are being deployed now to help Bay Transit become even more ‘Good to go!’ Last week, David Fols, Bay Transit’s Fleet Manager, installed a Freudenberg Filtration premium cabin filter in a Bay Transit bus. The filter is capable of trapping particles as small as .05 microns, less than one thousandth the thickness of a human



hair. The Freudenberg filters are 99.9% effective at inactivating viruses. “We will make sure this style of filter doesn’t impact air flow and cooling capacity before moving ahead with installing them fleetwide,” Fols said. “Compared to HEPA filters, this design should minimally impact air flow in our buses while still providing industry leading air filtration.” Fols has also installed touchless hand sanitizers on eight of Bay Transit’s buses. “We want to test their durability first,” Fols said. “If they hold up well, we will install them in the rest of the buses. We currently have the hand sanitizer sitting in plastic brochure holders and they keep getting broken. ## Community Flood Preparedness Fund draft grant manual available for public review

RICHMOND — The Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation today announced the release of a draft grant manual for the Community Flood Preparedness Fund. DCR will be collecting public comment for the next 30 days (April 12 through May 12, 2021). The grant manual is available for public review at the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall.

Virginia's coastal and inland flood preparedness involves large-scale planning, data collection and analysis, and project design and implementation. In 2020, Governor Ralph Northam signed legislation creating the Virginia Community Flood Preparedness Fund, which authorizes a grant and loan program to assist Virginia communities impacted by recurrent flooding, sea level rise and severe weather events.

"The grant manual released today is the first step toward providing significant financial support to Virginia communities to address the devastating impacts of recurrent flooding, which is being exacerbated by climate change," said Secretary of Natural Resources and Chief Resilience Officer Matthew J. Strickler. "We look forward to reviewing the public comments on this draft, and opening our first grant round before summer."

The fund will be administered by DCR, the agency responsible for coordinating flood-protection activities, in cooperation with the Virginia Resources Authority.

It is capitalized by the sale of carbon emission allowances under the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI), which Virginia joined in January 2021. The fund will receive 45% of the proceeds from quarterly RGGI auctions.

The January 2021 auction generated approximately \$19.5 million for the fund. DCR is proposing an initial grant round of \$18 million. Unspent funds will be used for future grants.

"Following this public review, we will open a grant round in order to use these dollars to make Virginia safer and more resilient," DCR Director Clyde Cristman said. "This funding will help communities across the commonwealth with flood prevention and protection, capacity building, and planning."

The grant manual builds on the Guidelines for the Fund, created by DCR with public input in December 2020. Both documents prioritize projects that are in concert with local, state and federal floodplain management standards, local resilience plans and the Virginia Coastal Resilience Master Plan.

The fund is designed to improve resilience and flood protection across the commonwealth. In the coastal region, it will provide needed funding for the implementation of the Coastal Resilience Master Plan.

"A dedicated funding source to implement the Coastal Resilience Master Plan is a key component in ensuring Virginia can meet the growing challenges of increased flooding and severe storm risk," said Rear Admiral (Ret.) Ann Phillips, Special Assistant to the Governor for Coastal Adaptation and Protection.

This ordinance is no longer necessary.
