He was a founding member of the Mangohick Volunteer Fire Department, served as an EMT with the Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Squad; and a member of the King William Republican Party, the King William Ruritan Club, and Moose Lodge. He also served on the King William County Board of Supervisors and King William County Economic Development Authority. Cecil also liked to 'party'. He celebrated his birthdays and retirement in style. I can see him now with his "Let's Party" hat, greeting his friends with his signature smile.

Cecil's son Larry beautifully eulogized his father this past Saturday recalling many fond memories. Larry told everyone about the time Cecil was at the fire station in the early days of the Mangohick Fire Department and a fire call came in. There was a fire in a trailer just around the corner from the fire station. Being the only one at the station at the time and knowing time was of the essence, Cecil answered the call and found a recliner chair smoldering inside the trailer.

William Gwathmey Celebrates 100th Birthday

On Wednesday, May 5th, 2021, William Brooke Gwathmey of Walkerton celebrated his 100th birthday quietly with a small family get-together and lots of calls, texts, and birthday cards. Mr. Gwathmey requested that the day of his birthday be quiet but he would like the family of four children, nine grandchildren, and thirteen great-grandchildren to come together at a family timeshare in July or August. Last year he celebrated his 99th birthday by having a drive-thru birthday party.

In talking with Mr. Gwathmey, he recounted special events in his long eventful life. As a child, he lived at Canterbury in Walkerton with his father, mother, sister Caroline and twin brother Richard. Before rural electricity was brought to the area, Mr. Gwathmey remembers having electricity with a generator that pulled water from the mill located on the property and furnished 32 volts of electricity. In 1933 electricity came to Walkerton.

At age 12 he loved to play in the mill house that stored grain. On a particular day, people were shooting at ducks on the river and scared Mr. Gwathmey. He fell into the basement and broke both arms. Since his parents weren't home, Richard went next door to Latane Trice's house to get help. The doctor was called and came to Canterbury to set the broken arms. Since the arms were not set properly, the arms had to be rebroken and set again.

Regional Animal Shelter Saves Lives Every Day

The Regional Animal Shelter (RAS) is dedicated to sheltering displaced animals as one of its many services to King William and King and Queen Counties. An open admission shelter that accepts all dogs and cats, stray or surrendered, RAS opened in September 2009 with Lauri Betts as Manager.

"Our mission," said Betts, "is to support responsible pet guardianship which results in humane treatment of animals. We work to promote the safety and welfare of citizens and animals and maintain a Shelter where animals are properly and humanely cared for according to statute, ordinance and regulation."

In matching homeless pets with adoptive guardians, RAS arranges for a free veterinary exam and low-cost spay and neuter. RAS also works to reunite lost pets with their families. They emphasize that the best way to reunite a lost pet is to make sure the pet has a collar with easily visible contact information.

A few of the special programs offered by RAS are: PALS - Pets Adopting Loving Seniors, matches senior pets with senior citizens. Pet Food Pantry- helps pet guardians needing temporary help to feed their pet. Working CAT - helps place healthy feral or under-socialized cats into barns, stables or other agricultural properties.

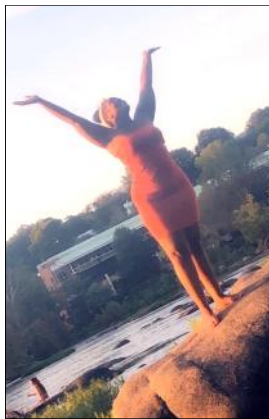

King William BoS Adopts FY2022 Budget, County Ordinance Updates

The Board of Supervisors adopted the FY2022 Budget in their April 26th Regular Meeting. The county was able to fully fund the budget based on current tax levies. While the tax levies saw no change, residents may see an increase in personal property tax bills for used vehicles over last year. Due to manufacturer closures from Covid-19, used vehicle values are on the rise. Vehicles are taxed based on their current NADA Clean Trade values.

The original budget proposal for 2022 Capital Improvements came in at 9.2 million dollars. The county was able to reduce the request by .4 million by replacing three Sheriff's office vehicles via a lease to purchase program versus purchasing them outright. They also pulled out the paving requests for the 360 complex and budgeted for gravel at \$35,000, 10% of the original request. Under the adopted budget, areas of the courthouse will be outfitted with new audio/video equipment at a cost of \$22,309.57. The equipment will run from the courtrooms to the new wing for public viewing of jury trials as required by law. Because of social distancing guidelines, the courtrooms are currently able to house only the jurors and personnel required to be present for jury trials. Going forward, the Sheriff's office will be able to use the equipment for trainings.

The board also approved ordinance changes and a resolution previously submitted by Commissioner of Revenue, Karena Funkhouser. One ordinance update did away with the \$30 vehicle license fee for one vehicle registered to a 100% service-disabled veteran. Another resolution added "meals tax" to the list of items that must be in good standing for business owners to be issued their business licenses. The board also granted the CoR authority to issue refunds up to \$2500, requiring no action from the BoS or County Attorney. Funkhouser also submitted a rewrite of the meals tax ordinance which was tabled for further review.

LMES Second Graders Waste Not, Want Not

"We had a great conversation about always picking up your trash because it doesn't go away and could hurt the planet and other animals," said Hardy.

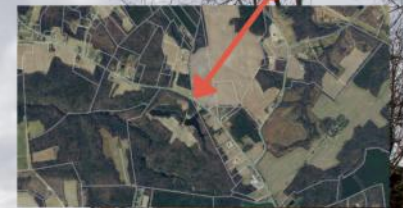

Virginia Republicans Waiting on Results of Saturday's Drive-Thru Convention

The Virginia Republican Party held their nominating convention to pick their candidates to run for Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this past Saturday. It was a convention like none other. Due to the pandemic, the Party held what was called an "unassembled convention" with delegates casting their votes at 39 locations across the state. It was single, ranked-choice voting where you rank your choices on the ballot for each office. The winner must secure a majority of the votes cast. Ballots will be counted over and over with the low vote-getter dropping off after each round. When a voter's choice is eliminated their second choice gets counted. This will continue till a candidate gets a majority of votes cast. King William's contingent of delegates voted at the Meadow Event Park in Doswell, driving through a series of tents, one to pick up their ballot and the other to cast their ballot, without getting out their vehicle. From 9 am to 4 pm a steady stream of cars was seen snaking their way through the parking lot next to the Southern States Pavilion. Party officials expected a

turnout of 53,000 across the state with 2,300 delegates expected to cast their choices at the Meadow Event Park. Shortly after 4 pm all ballots cast were put into a sealed box and taken to the Marriott Hotel in Richmond where they started counting them by hand at 1 pm the next day Sunday, May 9th. As of this writing, Jason Miyares of Virginia Beach won the Attorney General nomination. Results of the other two spots on the ticket have not yet been determined. The Democrats will pick their nominees in a June 8th primary. The general election is slated for Tuesday, November 2nd.

In addition, RAS works with 58 community and private rescue organizations to place animals for adoption. "Every adoption is rewarding and memorable to the team, said Betts. "We receive pets that are skinny, scared and sick with parasites. During their stay, they are treated gently, fed properly and given medication as needed." King William Animal Control Officer Brandy Colgin and King and Queen Chief Deputy W.R. Balderson both play important roles with RAS. Balderson said, "These animals deserve a second chance with a forever home right here in our community. Plus you know that once that animal has come into care with RAS, they have been given the best care possible for a successful adoption."

Amy Koch, Animal Care Technician, recalls when "we got a large number of malnourished dogs in, and over the course of a few weeks they all gained weight, had their medical issues remedied, and all were placed in rescue and foster homes until a forever home was found."

Cat Technician Melody Deshaies said, "One day a litter of kittens came in, one of the kittens was very scared and extremely non-social. I worked with her continuously so that by the time she was adopted, she was loving, purring and wasn't afraid of human contact."

Hayley Pace, Animal Care Technician, said, "I really enjoy helping animals feel comfortable and safe during a confusing time of their life." She added, "I am also grateful to have the opportunity to educate the community about things like heartworm prevention and the importance of spaying and neutering pets to help prevent overpopulation in shelters." Pace cited four ways that citizens can help reduce the numbers of displaced animals: Share information about RAS Low-Cost Spay/Neuter Clinic on social media and with family and friends.

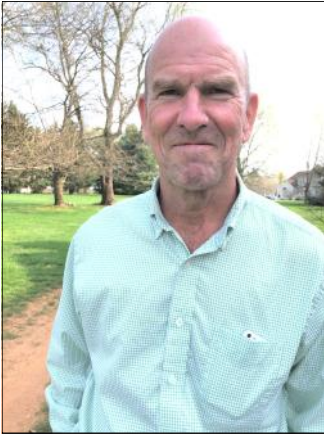

As far as remembering cars, Mr. Rosemount had been built in 1762 and Gwathmey’s father had an Overland car. In seeing pictures of the car, it looked like a glorified stagecoach on wheels. Later the family got a Model T Ford.

He was educated in a one-room school in Walkerton that housed grades one to four. In the fourth grade, his teacher was Mary Clare Mitchell, a young Walkerton woman who was beginning her teaching career. Then he went to Marriott School until it burned. Stated Mr. Gwathmey, “That was one of the happiest days of my life when the school bus came in the driveway and the school had burned.” His class was the first to graduate from the new Marriott School in 1938.

After high school, Mr. Gwathmey graduated from Virginia Tech and was sent to Officer Candidate School. During World War II Second Lieutenant Gwathmey was stationed in Belgium as a platoon leader over 38 soldiers. During the Battle of the Bulge (from 1944 into January 1945) over 85,000 Americans and 100,000 Germans died. One moonlit night Mr. Gwathmey went to check on his unit. As he was walking in the middle of the road, a German fighter plane started shooting ammunition towards him. He dived into a snowbank. While he lay there he felt a peace come over him – a peace that he had never felt before – a sense that everything was going to be okay.

After coming home, Mr. Gwathmey and his wife lived for a few years at his parents’ home, Canterbury. After four children, Ellen, Ann, Susan, and Brooke came along, the couple bought an abandoned farm nearby.

Mr. Rosemount had been built in 1762 and another addition added in 1852. It had been vacant for years and had badly deteriorated. Slowly over the years, the family renovated the abandoned house into a beautiful home for the family.

Mr. Gwathmey joined the family church, Bruington Baptist Church, when he was 10. The four children were raised in the church. Both Jean and Mr. Gwathmey were very active in the church’s life. After both retired they went on several mission trips from the church.

After returning home from service, he became a farmer and taught vocational education for 27 years in King and Queen County. All four children graduated from college and have careers from pastor to doctor. In 1999 Jean, his wife of 50 years, was tragically killed one Saturday afternoon when a tree fell on the pickup.

Daughter Ann stated, “We are blessed to have had this wonderful man to be our father for this length of time. Mr. Gwathmey says, “My children are spoiling me and they take that quality from their mother who spoiled me, too. I AM LOVING IT.”

The point of this article is to say, ‘People need to look at their lives and realize how God has been with them all along.’
