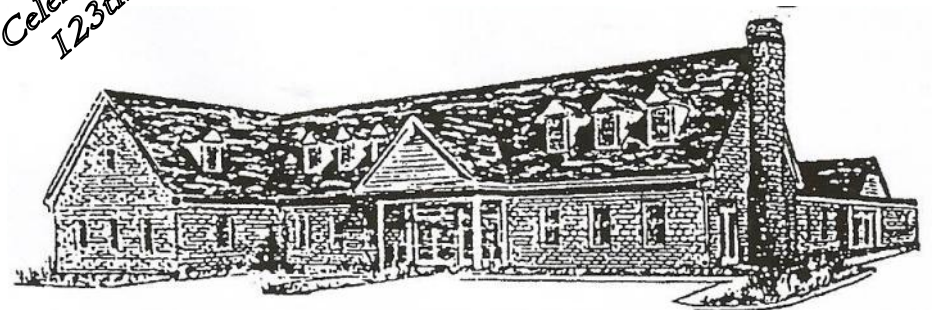

Dealing with animals always has an element of risk that we need to be aware of. When we were growing up, I hardly ever thought about safety. We would go visit my cousins who had a big farm and a bunch of animals. We would jump on the horses bareback and down through the woods we would ride hanging on to their mane until we fell off or got knocked off by a low hanging limb. Sometimes there would be 2 or 3 of us on one horse holding on to each other and the front one hanging on to the mane.

We would be laughing and hollering and having a fun time until the horse got tired and dumped us off. I remember that they had a billy goat that would get out sometimes. Once when he got out, my sister started hollering for my uncle that the goat was out. Well that old billy goat didn't like all that noise and started chasing us. We took off towards the house running and yelling. Their farmhouse had a big front porch. When we came around the corner, I jumped up on the porch to safety. My sister and cousin ran on by and up the front steps with that goat in hot pursuit. They headed inside and slammed the screen door behind them thinking they were safe.



That goat never slowed down. He went right through the screen door and into the house after them. Finally my Dad and Uncle caught the goat and got the screen off his horns and put him back in the pen outside. It took about an hour to clean and straighten the house up from everything that the goat tore up. The ride home that day was not much fun, but we still laugh about it today.

Nowadays, I still like to have fun but I think about safety first. I guess that comes with age. Pip is pretty forgiving of me. If I do get caught up in the moment and mess up, she usually won't hold it against me or at least not for too long.

MPRA Holds Annual Meeting, Reminisces on the Life and Legacy of former President Eugene Rivara

The Mattaponi and Pamunkey Rivers Association held its annual meeting on Friday, June 4th. President Dawn Shank, Vice President Dave Slack, Secretary Audrey Mitchell, Treasurer Steve Mitchell, and board members Mary Shipman, April Hill Deacy, Ethan Davis, Adele & Bob Smith, Elizabeth Christeller, Mike Greenwood, Christina Ruszyk-Murray, Armistead Saffer, and Amanda Walker were elected to serve another term. Kitty Cox, Kayla Huffman, Dan Rabago, and Tom Tupponce were nominated and elected to the board as well.

MPRA honored former President Eugene Rivara, who passed away in a tragic accident in September of 2020. President Shank shared fond memories of stewarding for the Middle Peninsula watershed alongside Rivara. Although Rivara seldomly missed an MPRA river paddle, Shank recalled how he would visit when he did, honking at members while driving over the Walkerton Bridge. When he would catch up to the paddlers at the boat landing, he would exclaim, "Oh! I forgot it was today!". Holding back tears, Shank read "A Prayer of Healing" from a United Nations Environmental Sabbath Service Program publication titled "Only One Earth", in his memory. MPRA members shared a meal and swapped stories of Rivara and his many selfless contributions to his community, church, and the Middle Peninsula region.

Rivara served MPRA as President for four years and for nearly 30 years he served as Chairman of the Legislative/River Issues Committee and Walking Crew Coordinator for

the annual river clean-ups. He passionately spent over 20 years protesting the King William Reservoir project. Nominated by MPRA, Rivara was recognized last month for one of two inaugural Lifetime Achievement awards issued by the York River and Small Coastal Basin Roundtable. The Roundtable will be planting a tree in Rivara's honor.

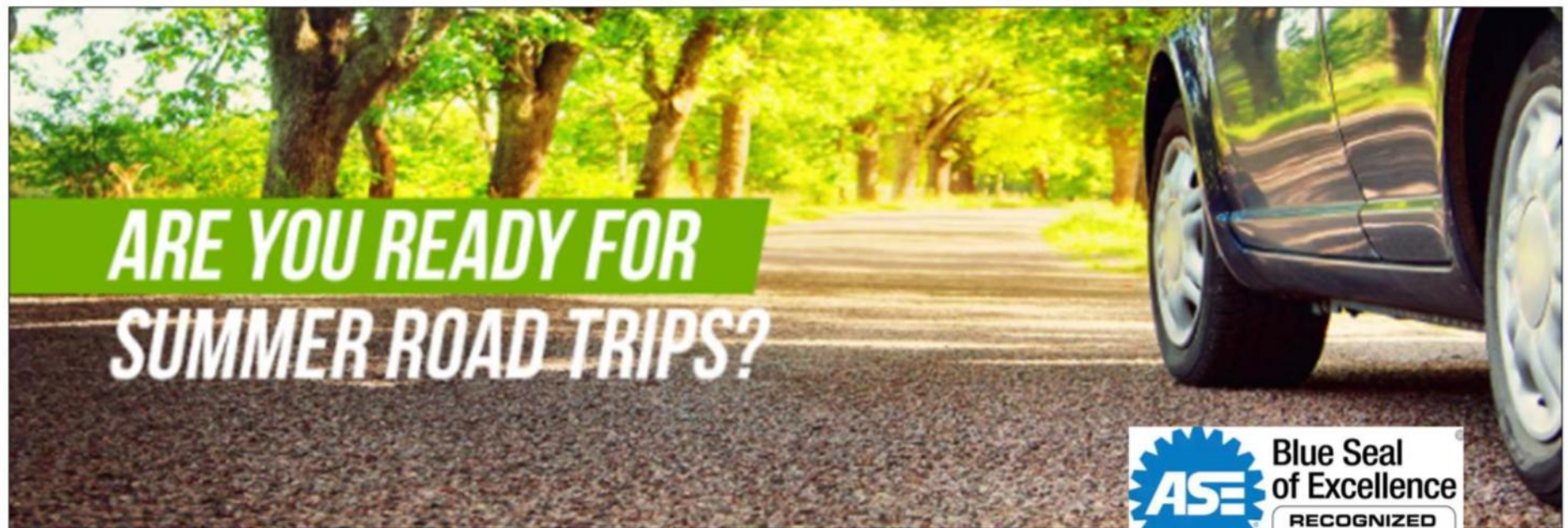

King William Blueprint 2041, Planning Commission Representation gets an Update

King William residents joined Hill Studio on Wednesday, May 26th for the Blueprint 2041 - Comprehensive Plan Community Kick-Off. Evie Slone gave residents an overview of what a comprehensive plan is, shared statistics about King William, and received feedback from residents on the kind of growth and development folks would like to see in the county. Hill Studio has also published a survey online to seek community input for the Blueprint 2041 project. As of the Kick-Off, they had only received about 50 responses. They have requested that all residents please fill out the survey. To find the survey, visit kingwilliamcounty.us/documentcenter/view/797. The link is near the bottom of the document.

At the May 24th Board of Supervisors Regular Meeting the board moved forward in modifying the Planning Commission to have members appointed from each district. Chairman Janie Rhodes is one of the two Planning Commission members from district 5. The BoS has voted that she will depart the board when her term expires on June 30th. Matt Sluder was appointed to the open seat to bring in representation for district 4. After a heated exchange, the Planning Commission elected John Breeden as the new Chairman in their June 1st meeting. Vice-Chairman Stephen Greenwood asserted

that officer vacancies could not be voted on until a vacancy exists. Greenwood voted "nay" on the motion to elect Breeden, saying it was out of order. Prior to the Planning Commission meeting, Greenwood expressed his concerns to Planning Director Sherry Graham, and she had removed the election item from the agenda. The commissioners voted to add the item back during adoption of the agenda. Following the election, Commissioner Don Wagner requested Greenwood be reprimanded by the commission for directing a county employee. He stated it is in the BoS bylaws, where Greenwood also serves as Vice-Chair, that a BoS member cannot direct the actions of a county employee. Chairman Rhodes declined to reprimand Greenwood but stated for the record she was not pleased and would have preferred to be contacted beforehand to discuss the matter.

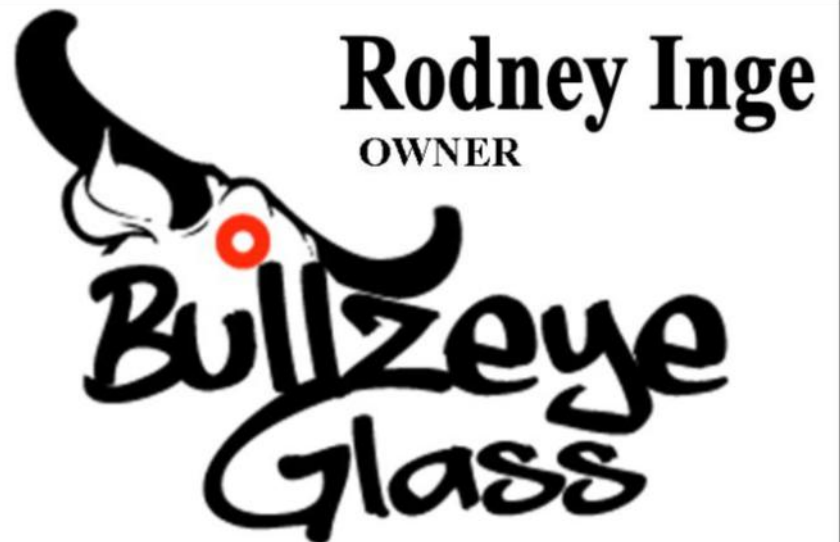

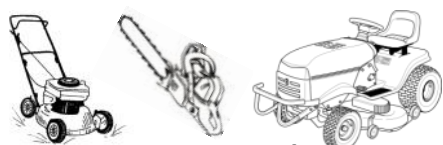

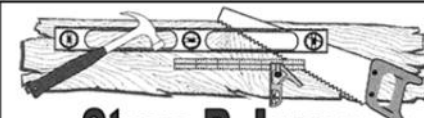
