King William Residents Hold Zoning and Subdivision Ordinance Town Hall

A citizen committee made up of district 5 residents hosted Board of Supervisors Vice Chair Ed Moren, Planning Commission Chairman John Breeden, Interim Planning Director Sherry Graham, and event moderator Reverend Kim Bullock in a Town Hall meeting on Thursday, June 10th. The three representative panel answered questions and listened to input from citizens about the draft Zoning and Subdivision Ordinance.

While discussing Agricultural-Conservation (AC) lot sizes, Breeden said he expects the minimum acreage to remain at five acres in the new ordinance, down from the proposed ten. Resident Darrell Kellum shared concerns over having a ten-acre minimum, expressing that it could impact residents planning to sell off acreage to fund things like retirement or college tuition for their children. Regarding smaller or non-conforming lots in AC zones, Graham explained that grandfathered lots and uses would remain in place and non-grandfathered setbacks can go through the variance process to request exceptions. Setbacks currently listed in the draft ordinance for the AC district include 25' of side yard and 50' of rear yard for the main building. Setbacks from roads are required to be 100' from primary roads, 75' feet from secondary roads, and 50' from subdivision streets. The variance application fee is \$1,000, plus \$500 for advertising. When asked where he stands on

the draft ordinance, Supervisor Moren said it is too early to say because he wants to look at all sides. Moren asserted the ordinances are built for everyone and asked that residents always reach out.

The Planning Commission, Board of Supervisors, and The Berkeley Group will hold a Joint Work Session on July 19th at 7:00 PM. The Work Session will be held in person at 180 Horse Landing Road, and online via Zoom. Visit kingwilliamcounty.us/calendar to find meeting information and Zoom meeting IDs and passcodes.

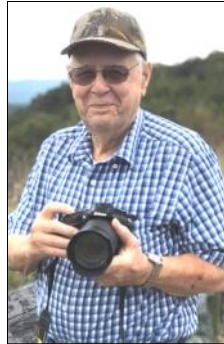

In April 2020, 'The CornerStone Community Development Center' was designated as one of the emergency food agencies in Virginia. This meant that food operations needed to be stepped up to cope with the sudden increase in the number of families and also due to the closure of several smaller food agencies. There were several challenges but food distribution to families remained uninterrupted.

One big challenge was the need for another vehicle to pick up additional food. The need for a second van presented itself very quickly since store donations escalated after April 2020. Twenty volunteers were kept busy bringing in food for distribution from nine stores, seven days a week resulting in over 300,000 pounds of food donated by stores just in 2020. This is no small feat! Gerry Gravitt and Stephen Lang leave at 6.30 a.m. and have done this three times a week for almost twelve months. On the road in 2020 and according to weekly schedule, John and Betty Jensen, Norm and Connie Dauphinee, Tom and June Howard, Henry and Nancy Keeton, Jim Milan, Robert Chappell, Ed Fuller, Bob Murray and James Williams share the load of picking up donations from nine different stores. Roger Volk, Jerome Garlick have recently joined this team. Helen Gulasky, Sharon SunEagle, Francis and Bonnie Sears, Pat Shackelfords, Forest and Dottie Hall are also a part of the team that help pick up food from stores.

Enabled by a grant from FeedMore, a generous donation from St. Paul's Church, Millers Tavern and thoughtful donations from a few individuals, a new van was purchased. Bill Talley Ford Inc., Mechanicsville could not have made the buying experience any better. Their outstanding customer service and prompt attention to detail resulted in a smooth transaction.

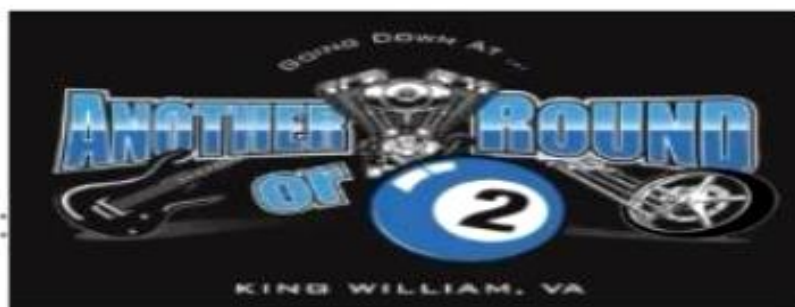

King William BOS Talks with VPPSA

Executive Director of Virginia Peninsulas Public Service Authority Dave Magnant joined the Board of Supervisors for their June Work Session. VPPSA is the organization contracted by King William County to handle solid waste services. The supervisors listed concerns brought to them by constituents about the Epworth and Central Garage dump sites. Concerns included overflow of trash and recycling, the sites taking in outside trash due to not checking IDs, and traffic at the sites. They also asked if the limit of tires residents can drop off could be increased. Magnant and the board discussed ideas like adding a compactor and tire bin to the Epworth site as well as potentially standing up curbside service for neighborhoods in the Central Garage area. Magnant said he would like to work with the county to meet their needs and would like to discuss the issues further.

Mary Sue Bancroft gave an update from the Treasurer's office. She is currently focused on collecting personal property taxes from 2016 before the window closes on being able to collect them. Bancroft implemented a new process of mailing real estate tax bills out to each resident this year. While this caused some confusion among residents, it helped bring to light the fact that sales and transfers had not been updated since August of 2020. This helped get tax bills to the correct parties. She expressed to the board she would like to change the due date for real estate taxes or offer monthly ACH transfers so residents

aren't getting hit with the bills being due in December.

Interim County Administrator Steve Hudgins submitted Resolution 21-40 to the board "Honoring and Congratulating the King William High School Class of 2021 Graduates and the West Point High School Class of 2021 Graduates". The board will vote on the resolution at their June 28th Regular Meeting. Hudgins also received permission from the board in a 3-2 vote to hire a Director of Operations. Greenwood and Garber voted against the request. Hudgins has been filling the role as well as the role of Interim County Administrator since Bobbie Tassanari resigned in February.

"It's hard to imagine that this budget growth rate is sustainable without

significantly higher growth in the tax base, the population or much higher property taxes in the future," Shannon said.

"\$451,000 approved in May for Radio/Communication equipment is also concerning," he noted. "In a county excluding West Point (which has its own Law Enforcement/Fire Rescue) we only have around 15,000 citizens to spread this cost."
