Dylan DeHart is from Radford, VA where he was a 4 sport letterman and later an assistant coach. While at Radford, DeHart was a 3 time all-state wrestler while earning all district and region honors in football. DeHart went on to Emory & Henry College where he played 2 years of football and earned a degree in Social Science. DeHart spent 9 years working in King William County serving as a teacher and a coach. DeHart won the team's first wrestling district title in 20 years and took the team to #2 in the region. Later DeHart took over as head football coach, posting a record of 56-24 and earning multiple trips to the region championship. Last school year, DeHart came to King & Queen county as a history teacher and football coach. The football team had one of the best seasons in school history going undefeated in the regular season before falling in the region title game. DeHart is a member of the Richmond Touchdown Club and was named Coach of the Year for A,AA, and private schools for the 2020-2021 season. King and Queen is excited to have Coach DeHart as our new Athletic Director and Head Varsity football coach.

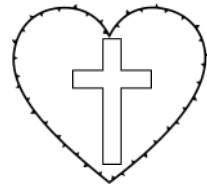

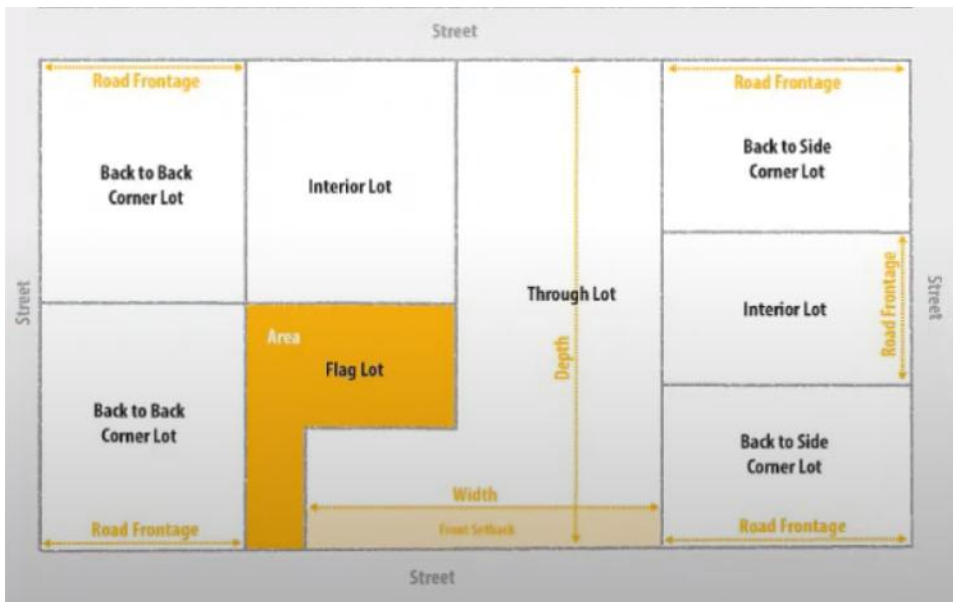

KW Draft Zoning Ordinance Moves on to the Board of Supervisors

After nearly two years, the draft Zoning Ordinance is being presented to the Board of Supervisors for review and adoption. The purpose of the new ordinance is to keep the county up to date with the desires of the community and to encourage business friendliness by addressing new uses. New uses that will be covered in the ordinance include short-term rentals, food trucks, personal services, and agritourism. Some changes that would go into effect with the ordinance include reducing the

family subdivision lot size from five acres to three acres with “family” being expanded to include nieces and nephews, requiring landscaping buffers between commercial or industrial lots and family developments, and requiring screening for dumpsters and mechanical equipment. In their final Public Hearing on the ordinance, the Planning Commission heard from residents Angela Vessels, Vic Einarsson, and Charles Snead.

An Ordinance to Amend King William County Code § 70-3 (a) - Penalties for Delinquent Payments of Property Taxes to provide some relief to citizens by establishing a due date for the tax or levy of Tangible Personal Property, as defined in the Code of King William County, Virginia Chapter 70 Article III, different than the due dates for the tax or levy of Real Property by amending King William County Code 70-3 (a) to read as follows:

Sec. 70-3. - Penalties for delinquent payments of property taxes.

(a) Any person, business, firm, corporation or other taxpayer failing to pay any county property taxes for levies on or before June 25 and December 5 shall incur a penalty thereon of ten percent of the tax past due, which the treasurer shall add to the amount of tax or levy due from such taxpayer, and the treasurer shall, in addition, assess interest on any such delinquent taxes or levies remaining unpaid commencing on the day following such day as the taxes are due at the rate of ten percent per annum on the delinquent taxes or levies and penalties, such interest to commence on the dates set forth in this section June 26 and on December 6 of the year in which the taxes or levies are due. **Provided, however, that penalties and interest shall accrue as provided herein if Tangible Personal Property taxes are not paid on or before January 15 of the year following the year for which the tax was assessed.**

“Visiting the State Fair is a long-standing tradition for so many families,” said Marlene Jolliffe, the fair’s executive director. “We’re excited to return after last year’s hiatus, and offer the classic State Fair experience that Virginians know and love. Planning ahead can help fairgoers save money and have a more enjoyable visit.”

This year’s fair footprint will be adjusted as needed regarding COVID-19 precautions. Find details online at StateFairVa.org.

Tickets- Buy tickets in advance to cash in on savings. Advance tickets are on sale through Sept. 23 at StateFairVa.org at \$11.50 for 5 years of age and older. They can be used any day during the fair. Children 4 and younger will be admitted free with a paid adult admission. Season passes can be purchased online through Sept. 17 for \$67, and can be used throughout the fair’s 10-day run.

Vessels who was a facilitator for the District 5 Town Hall on the ordinance, informed the Commissioners she and other residents are primarily concerned with any recommended changes to minimum lot sizes, minimum setbacks required on primary and secondary roads, and any changes to family subdivisions. Einarsson addressed the board stressing the importance of enforcing the ordinances that are passed. Snead shared concerns with the Commissioners about the ordinance implementing a five-bedroom limit on bed and breakfast establishments. Snead, who stated he owns the only bed and breakfast in the county, advocated for removing the limit and leaving it up to health department restrictions which are dependent on how many individuals site utilities can support. Snead feels this is restrictive to the growing industry, and not in line with the county’s vision to support agritourism citing wedding and event venues in the county having a shortage of lodging options to support them. Two other residents asked for clarification on minimum lot sizes in the A-C zone which will be three acres for family subdivisions, and five otherwise if the ordinance passes as is.

The Planning Commissioners addressed attendees encouraging them to share feedback not only now, but also once the new ordinance is in place. The ordinance is a living, breathing document that can be updated at any time to address the needs of the community. The final Public Hearing for the ordinance is scheduled for September 27th at 7:00 pm in the County Administration Building Board Room at the Board of Supervisors Regular Meeting.

Three Rivers Conservation Corner

The Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act

The Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act, better known as the *Bay Act*, was passed by the General Assembly in 1988. This Act requires local governments in the Tidewater Region to improve their land use plans and ordinances to meet the new state standards for the protection of water quality. The regulations set forth by the Bay Act requires land used for agricultural purposes, including feedlots and dairy, to have an approved soil and water conservation plan.

Water runs off land and carries with it substances that are harmful to the Bay and its tributaries. These “non-point source” pollutants are the major contributor to the Bay’s declining condition. Nutrients such as nitrogen and phosphorous, from fertilizers and animal waste, contribute to the excess growth of algae and rob the water of oxygen. Oxygen is necessary to support aquatic life and maintain water quality.



For this reason, landowners are required to establish and maintain a vegetative buffer adjacent to any stream, pond, or wetland connected by surface flow. This buffer strip can include trees, shrubs, honeysuckle, grasses, and other vegetation that will be effective in slowing runoff, preventing erosion, and filtering non-point source pollution runoff. The goal of the Act is not to further restrict fertilizer and pesticide use, but to keep them from entering waterways.

Investigation Leads To Arrest

King William – Investigation leads to the arrest of two individuals involved in the armed robbery of Dick’s Country Store that occurred on Saturday, December 12, 2020. Subsequent to an Investigation, Guadalupe Blanco Villeda Jr, age 21 of Essex County and Brandon Lee Anderson age 28 of King William County were arrested and charged with robbery, use of

a firearm in commission of a felony and conspiracy to commit robbery. The initial investigation revealed that the owners of the store were approached by an unknown male armed with a shotgun at the close of business. The male demanded money and after obtaining an undisclosed amount, left the store area on foot.

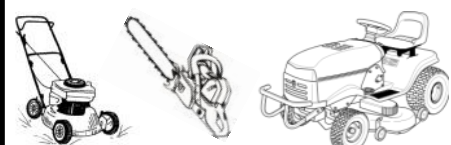

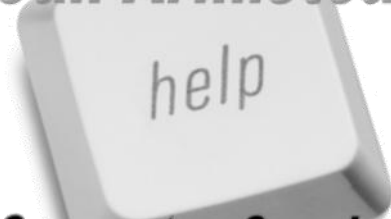

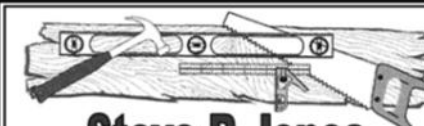
