Native American Dugout Canoe Found in the Mattaponi River

Brothers Michael and Brian Foster came across an interesting find during a recent canoe trip on the Mattaponi. Several miles upriver from Zoar State Forest they saw a unique shaped piece of wood caught in a logjam. Upon closer inspection, they determined it to be a portion of a Native American dugout canoe.

The brothers contacted Upper Mattaponi Indian Tribal Administrator Reggie Tupponce to report their findings. Tupponce, along with Virginia Department of Historic Resources Underwater Archeologist Brendan Burke, and a Terrestrial Archeologist for the eastern region paddled up the river to have a look. Upon examination, they were able to determine the canoe is from the post-contact era and was crafted with metal tools.

On Saturday, October 16th nearly four dozen semi-trucks filled the KWSH student parking lot, lining up in memory of Mike Gault. Friends, family, and fellow truck drivers gathered, sharing stories, laughs, smiles, and tears in remembrance of Gault. At the front of the lot, sat two Donald W. Gibson Trucking semis he had previously owned.

Shawn Johnson credited Gault for giving him his start as a truck driver. Johnson said Gault helped him get his CDL and even paid extra for insurance so he could drive because he was so young at the time. Johnson's father, Ira Johnson, described Gault as a nice, easy-going guy to work for that was always honest with his customers about whether he would be able to finish a job. Pat Johnson shared how he always made you laugh, even when you didn't want to. Gault's brother,

Lyn Gault, shared the story about Mike's first semi, an old green Dodge that he changed all eighteen tires on in his mom's driveway when he bought it. Robbie Healey described it as the ugliest truck he ever saw but said it did make Gault some money. Mike was a truck driver for over 50 years and went into business for himself in 1980. His trucking family, with the escort of King William Sherriff's Office, formed a parade and drove down to Hamilton Holmes Middle School. They each slow down and honked in front of Gault's family home on route 30, where his own truck sat with a "Big Bertha" wreath on the front in his memory. His wife, Phyllis, said she knows he is looking down thinking, "here goes all those pretty trucks." It is truly evident Gault was well-loved and respected, and that his trucking community was also family.

Senator Mark Warner and Secretary of the Commonwealth Kelly Thomasson Tour Aylett Family Wellness

On Friday, October 15th Upper Mattaponi tribal leaders welcomed Senator Mark Warner and Secretary of the Commonwealth Kelly Thomasson for a tour of the Aylett Family Wellness facility. For two decades, Warner actively advocated for federal recognition of the Upper Mattaponi along with five other Virginia tribes. On January 29th, 2018, tribal members, and elected officials on both sides of the aisle celebrated the passage of the Thomasina E. Jordan Indian Tribes of Virginia Federal Recognition Act of 2017.

With federal recognition, the Upper Mattaponi tribe became eligible for federal funding and inherent rights as a sovereign nation. After receiving CARES funding and seeing a need in the community for more local family physicians, tribal leadership used the funds to purchase and fully renovate the building that now houses Aylett Family Wellness. The facility is open not only to tribal members but all members of the community with a goal of providing Medicaid and underprivileged patients the same level of care as those with private insurance companies.

After giving Warner and Thomasson a brief history of the late 1950's building, Practice Manager Brooke Purre, Chief Frank Adams, Tribal Administrator Reggie Tupponce, and Tribal Council

Member Steven Tupponce showed the representatives around the examination rooms, nurses' station, state-of-the-art lab, and pharmacy area. Warner, and Adams who also attended the final vote on the Federal Recognition bill, shared a moment of reflection on the overwhelming sense of accomplishment felt in the Senate Chamber that day. Following the tour, Warner shared his enthusiasm for the Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and his hopes that tribal investments through the Act will help provide for necessary infrastructure like broadband access, and further secure resiliency for the tribe.

Kevin Krigsvold

Kevin is the President and CEO of Pamunkey Indian Enterprises. He is also a 7-time Emmy award winning television producer, a proud member of the Pamunkey Indian Tribe, and has more than 24 years of experience in the federal/government contracting world.

Kevin graduated from King and Queen Central High School in 1987. While there, Kevin played baseball, basketball, and was the Captain of the Football team. He was also active in Forensics, student government, French Club, and was the captain of the Academic Challenge team. After graduating from Central, he first attended Rappahannock Community College, and then transferred to Old Dominion University, where he majored in Communication. Upon graduation, he initially worked at WAVY TV 10 and WTKR Channel 3 where he learned the craft of digital story telling. After a few years in TV news, he decided to go back to graduate school and accepted a NASA funded graduate school scholarship to Hampton University (HU). In addition to graduate school, he also accepted a job at NASA Langley Research Center as an associate producer for NASA Langley's budding television production team. As an associate producer, he was on the ground floor of the production of a NASA STEM-based television program entitled NASA CONNECT. This program earned numerous awards and the title of "Best Distance Learning Program in the Country". Based on this success, Kevin was promoted to Senior Producer and Program Manager where he eventually managed and

created numerous television and radio programs including NASA's Destination Tomorrow, NASA 360, The Discovery Now Radio Program, and NASA X. For his efforts, Kevin has been awarded more than 60 professional peer reviewed awards, including seven (7) Emmy awards. Kevin eventually took a short hiatus from Program Management and television production and accepted a job as the congressional lead for the Census Bureau for the Commonwealth of Virginia. In this position he regularly worked with congressional members, their staff, and with city and state government officials including the Governor. After much success in the federal world, Kevin was asked by the Chief and Council of his Tribe, The Pamunkey Indian Tribe, to take over a leadership position to build a tribally owned business that focuses on obtaining federal contracts. As the CEO for Pamunkey Indian Enterprises, and its affiliate companies, Pamunkey Indian Enterprises Professional Services (PIE-PS) and FedTribe LLC, Kevin is not leading the effort to build PIE into a job and revenue generator for the Pamunkey Tribe and for its partners. In less than two years, Kevin has won just under \$10 million dollars in federal contracts, but anticipates greater success in the future. In addition to his work with the Federal contracting businesses, Kevin is its efforts toward building the Headwaters Resort and Casino in Norfolk early next year. Kevin's greatest claim to fame is being a successful husband to his wife Sasha, and father to his beautiful children, Sabine and Roman.

Route 360 Medians Mowed – Finally!

After months of looking at overgrown grass and weeds, the Route 360 medians have been mowed by VDOT. Not only was it an area of concern for the safety of drivers pulling out of secondary roads, the unsightly picture it presented reflected negatively on the County's overall appearance to those traveling through King William as well as concerned local residents. Interim County Administrator Steve Hudgins reached out to VDOT to determine why our main roads hadn't been mowed in months. VDOT Residency Administrator Lee McKnight responded, "We are currently reviewing our mowing practices and we may adjust some things in the future". He added, "VDOT typically mows for safety and operational purposes" as their priority. Some citizens don't realize mowing is a VDOT responsibility – NOT the County's. When asked approximately how much it could cost per mowing, Mr. McKnight indicates it costs about \$11,700 per cycle which includes tractor mowing, weed-eating, and litter removal. Currently, VDOT budgets are established to conduct three primary mows per year plus plant growth regulator spraying in the springtime. I'm writing in response to Zachary Coyne's Letter to the Editor in the 10/14/21 edition. The letter suggested I was inaccurate, incomplete, and ill-conceived in my presentation to the BOS on 9/28/21 regarding the impact new residential development can have on the county operational budget.

I went to the KW Tea Party meeting the day following where I met Zachary. What I had suspected and confirmed is the letter was written not having been present for my presentation, nor reading the detailed document, nor watching the video replay of the presentation.

Rather, with help and support from the KW Tea Party, the basis of his assertions was derived from a single paragraph summary in an article, not the 45 minute / 10 page presentation itself.

Further, he wasn't aware that I run an agribusiness in the county, nor the 2 year Meals Tax battle with King William that has been resolved in my favor, nor the county's wasteful use of ~\$50k of our tax dollars to an outsourced Richmond Law Firm, nor that I regularly speak at the BoS Public Comment period about the wasteful tax dollars still being incurred for outsourced legal services, providing factual examples from the invoices I receive by FOIA each month.

What was called in the letter to be a "preposterous claim" was arrived at using

basic math, national benchmarks, and transparent assumptions - all clearly laid out in the presentation.

Furthermore, on page 3 it states "Results are indicative of the impact and should not be positioned or used as actual 'set in stone' values. Even if the analysis is off by 15-25% the net result is still meaningful." This is a common approach to understanding financial impact to facilitate a discussion on a complex topic.

While at the Tea Party meeting last week, I tried to make light of the issue and misconceptions about my presentation however was not permitted to speak because I wasn't on the agenda. I was however invited to present the material at their next meeting on 10/28. I encourage any and all citizens of KW to attend if they have interest to hear more on the topic.

They were unable to locate the rest of the canoe nearby, indicating it had floated from somewhere else to the location it sits now. They did locate a piece of wood nearby that had broken off the canoe and retrieved it for testing. Tupponce said they had not heard anything back yet regarding what, if anything, could be determined from it.

The process to stabilize the canoe for retrieval from the river would have an

estimated cost of around \$30,000. If retrieved, the canoe would also need to be stored in a climate-controlled environment to keep it from deteriorating. It was determined retrieval of the canoe would be cost-prohibitive, so it was tagged as a historical find and submerged in the vicinity to help preserve it in place. The archeologists also found old cedar bridge pillars in the area.
