Youngkin Defeats McAuliffe - Sweeps King William

For the first time since 2009 Republicans will hold the top three offices (Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General) in the state of Virginia. In a first for Virginia, Republican Winsome Sears will become the first female lieutenant governor and the first woman of color to hold statewide office. Governor-elect Glenn Youngkin, Lt. Governor-elect Winsome Sears, and Attorney General-elect Jason Miyares each defeated their Democratic opponents by margins of approximately 51% to 49%. The voter turnout was the highest than any other gubernatorial election since 1997. Of the Commonwealth's 5.9 million registered voters just over 55% cast their ballots on or before election day. The Republicans also took back control of the House of Delegates. They now have 52 seats to the Democrats have 48 seats. None of Virginia's Senators were up for reelection. The Democrats hold a 21 seat to 19 seat edge in the Senate.

Conservation Corner

No Till

Non-point source pollution is caused when rainfall or snowmelt, moving over and through the ground, picks up and carries natural and humanmade pollutants, depositing them into lakes, rivers, wetlands, coastal waters and ground waters.

Continuous no-till systems reduce non-point source pollution by preventing soil erosion, reducing fertilizer use and limiting nutrient runoff-. Crop residues shield the earth from wind and rain, while fixing nitrogen in the soil so it is available to subsequent crops. Because they increase biomass, no-till systems yield the greatest economic benefits when they are applied to soils that are low in organic content. It's easier than ever to adopt no-till, because methods now have been developed for a variety of cropping systems.


