Cav's defense stopping the Falcons

For the first time in twenty-one years, the King William Cavaliers Varsity football team is headed to the Group 2 State Championship football game. The last time they were in the state finals was in 2000 which they won. The Cavaliers (12 – 1) have been outscoring their opponents this season by an average of 30 points per game. MPRA Zoar Nature Walk

The Mattaponi and Pamunkey Rivers Association gathered at the Upshaw Road Zoar State Forest location Sunday, December 5th for a nature walk followed by hot apple cider and fellowship. Leading the walk, MPRA board member and Virginia State Forester Dave Slack educated the group on the history of the property and the foliage growing at the site. The property, which was previously owned by the Pollard family, is 378 acres and is made up of Upper Zoar on W. River Road and Lower Zoar on Upshaw Road. At the Lower Zoar location sits a Sears, Roebuck Co. kit home built circa 1900. Near the home, you can also see a single pear tree that still stands where the family's orchard was, as well as several pecan and walnut trees that remain on a hill behind the family cemetery. The home and property were owned by descendants of the Pollard family until it was donated by Albert H. Stoddard to the Commonwealth of Virginia in 1988 as a state forest.

Three Rivers SWCD Fall Banquet Recognizes Area Producers

Three Rivers SWCD was proud to celebrate outstanding producers in the area on November 16, 2021.

The Outstanding Stewardship Award is presented to stewards of the land who are conscious in their efforts to maintain and improve soil health and water quality. Mr. Thomas H. Fox, Jr. is the 2021 recipient of the Outstanding Stewardship Award for the Three Rivers district.

Mr. Fox joined his family's operation in 1976 with his father and became a fourth-generation farmer. The family operation dates back to 1905 and Thomas currently works just over 800 acres of land, 300 of which are located on the Mattaponi River in King William County. The Fox operation consists of crops such as corn, soybeans, barley, wheat, rye, sorghum, and hay.

Thomas also raises approximately 15-20 beef cattle.

Thomas has been instrumental in plot work including varietal and hybrid testing, as well as plot work researching the effectiveness of cover crops in row crop production with both the District and Virginia Cooperative Extension. Last fall, Thomas participated in plot work that explored the effectiveness of brassica cover crops such as canola and radishes before soybeans. He has also participated in plotwork studying ten different hybrids of early maturity corn and is currently participating in a plot consisting of twenty varieties of wheat. Thomas has proven to be a great cooperator and has donated a substantial amount of his time, energy, and equipment to plotwork.

Thomas participates in multiple best

management practices annually including winter cover crops and the use of no-till systems. Thomas's dedication and commitment to soil health and water quality has been superb, and we commend him for his ongoing efforts. Three Rivers SWCD was also pleased to recognize two operations in the district with Partnership Awards. The District appreciates the cooperation of area producers willing to partner and support our continued interest in evaluating the use of cover crops to improve soil health and crop production on some of

our sandy soil types. These farm operators are critical to the district carrying out its educational and outreach goals, as putting in test plots requires a significant time and equipment commitment. J.M. Newcomb & Sons were the cooperators on a plot evaluating the use of wheat cover crops in corn production in 2021. Results from this plot are still being evaluated, but show the value of small grain cover crops in corn production. The 2021 recipient of the Clean Water Farm Award is Ryan Ellis, a producer who goes to great lengths to identify the true meaning of conservation.

Ryan is a fourth-generation farmer who began his operation in 2011 with 25 acres of land. Ryan has now grown his operation to

approximately 1300 acres of land in Essex, Caroline, and King & Queen Counties. Ryan utilizes precision ag on all of his acreage, as well as numerous best management practices such as no-till and winter cover crops which help reduce runoff and erosion. Ryan's operation is located in the Rappahannock River Basin.

Ryan has also supported and contributed to agricultural research and advancement through the years and he works continuously with local stewards through corn and soybean hybrid variety trials. Additionally, Ryan has hosted numerous field days for area producers.

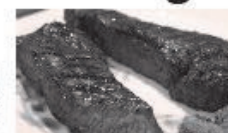

The Cavaliers were led by their star running back Demond Claiborne, the Tidewater District and Group 2A offensive player of the year. Claiborne who is a senior and a Wake Forest recruit has drawn the attention of many NCAA Division I schools including Penn State head coach James Franklin and an assistant UVA coach who were at the game. The Falcons (11 - 2) scored first with a field goal but with 16 seconds left in the first quarter the Cav's running back, Demond Claiborne scampered down the sidelines for a 66-yard touchdown run taking the lead 8 - 3. On the Falcon's first possession of the second quarter the Cav's wide receiver Kavontay Hayes intercepted a pass and two plays later Claiborne ran for a 65-yard touchdown to extend the Cavalier's lead to 16 - 3. Trailing by two scores the Falcons started going to their air game and connected for two touchdowns to tie the game 16 - 16 with 4 minutes left in the second quarter. On the Cavalier's next possession senior quarterback Jayveon Robinson hit wide receiver Harry Robinson for a 59-yard pass that set up a 15-yard touchdown run by Claiborne. The Cavaliers went into the locker room at the half leading 22 - 16.

The Falcons came out strong in the second half taking the ball 70 yards downfield and seemly ready to tie the

game. However, in a key defensive play of the game Cavalier senior linebacker Aiden Schools recovered a Falcon fumble at the 2-yard line. The Cavs then marched 98 yards downfield capping the drive with Claiborne scoring his fourth touchdown increasing the Cav's lead to 30 - 16. Trailing by two touchdowns at the beginning of the fourth quarter, the Falcons again went to their air game finding some success as they closed the gap to 30 - 23 but time was running out. With a little over two minutes left in the game, the Falcons tried an unsuccessful onside kick. Claiborne recovered it and on the next play, he went 52 yards to the Falcon's one-yard line. Quarterback Jayveon Robinson took the ball in for a 38 - 23 lead. It was pretty much all over at this point but the Falcons scored with 37 seconds left cutting the lead to the final score of 38 - 29. Claiborne who credits his success this year to his defense finished the game with 313 yards rushing on 21 carries and four touchdowns. The Cavaliers will play the Graham High School G-Men (13 - 0) of Bluefield for the state title at Salem City Stadium this Saturday, December 11th starting at noon. They defeated Appomattox County 42 - 28 in the other Group 2 semi-final.

This is a team where most of its members have played together in King William's

youth sports programs since they were old enough to carry a football. Their accomplishments speak volumes for the sports programs in King William. The coaches, coaching staff, and parents who spent countless hours and days instilling the values of hard work and sportsmanship deserve a LOT OF CREDIT and are to be commended for their efforts. Coach Scott

Moore and his staff have molded these 39 members of the football team into a championship team and we wish them ALL THE BEST in their quest for a state title. GO CAVS!!

2021 has been a Rough Year

Hopefully 2021 will be in the rear-view mirror soon for King William County. The year started with open positions for the Planning Director, the Commissioner of Revenue, and the Treasurer. The entire 2020 real estate reassessment was tossed when it was discovered there were numerous discrepancies in property categories and values. Soon after, the County Administrator resigned.

In the months following, the county saw even more turnovers – the Deputy Clerk, the Zoning Administrator, and key staff members in the Treasurer's office, Commissioner's office, and in Information Systems. Meanwhile, the county also transitioned to new computer systems for real estate, finance, and taxation. Many thanks to Steve Hudgins for stepping in to hold things together throughout this challenging year!

The Board of Equalization for the reassessment was also dissolved. However, most members continued to work together offering the county suggestions and assistance. Our group is diverse in backgrounds, knowledge, and experience, and wanted to help our county through these challenges. Key to the group's philosophy is recommending best practices exercised in large, successful, for-profit businesses. Our group unanimously agreed that strong leadership begets high performance and filling the County Administrator role with a proven leader should be the county's number one priority.

With interruptions in staffing, implementing new systems, and beginning another reassessment, our local government has been stretched to a breaking point. The Board realized we need an experienced County Administrator, not someone looking for a

promotion into a new role.

After months of trying to attract a new County Administrator, the Board saw that it would be nearly impossible to find a seasoned candidate willing to take on the challenges at the salary range of the former CA. They decided to increase the range, and the search continued. Our new County Administrator has 25 years of experience and will start this week. Our group fully supports this decision.

Some citizens and organizations have criticized, condemned, and belittled our government for this decision. It has been demoralizing to county staff, and does nothing to help the situation. The right improvements in county operations could significantly reduce spending and increase tax revenue without raising taxes, while also improving operations and service levels provided to King William taxpayers.

That being said, citizens paying for a "senior county administrator" should expect more than just someone running daily operations. We should expect a CA that has worked through challenges like those facing King William, and can drive a multi-year transformation agenda. If the Board has selected the right candidate, we should see improvements in the county's position in relatively short order. We fully expect to see this and support these changes. Given the current state of King William and all that has transpired over the past year, we feel the best thing we can do is support the new CA and not throw stones before he has even started!

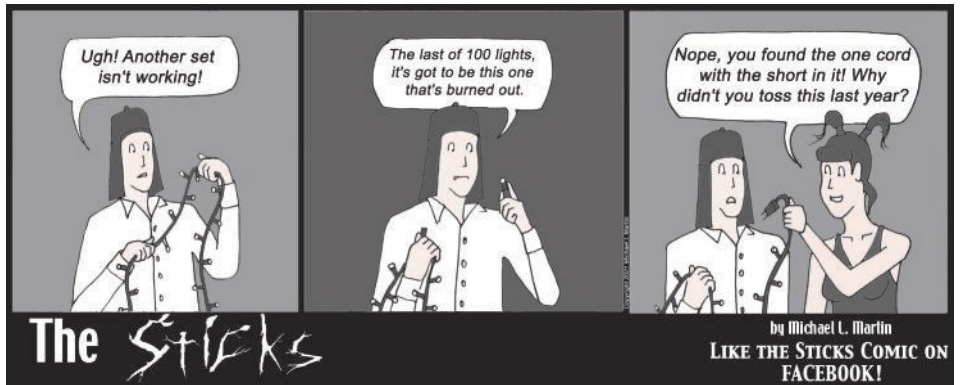

Wildlife Food Plot Competition

Three Rivers Soil & Water Conservation District sponsored two Wildlife Food Plot competitions this year for local students. The Junior Division consists of students 9 to 12 years of age while the Senior Division covers students 13 to 18 years of age. Each division is awarded a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winner. The program is not only used to attract wildlife but to provide an opportunity for the students to learn about conservation and wildlife while helping them to develop an appreciation for the world around them. Applications were submitted by September 30th and the

plots were judged on seed production, variety of seeds used, location of plot and bonus points were given for evidence of wildlife using the plots.

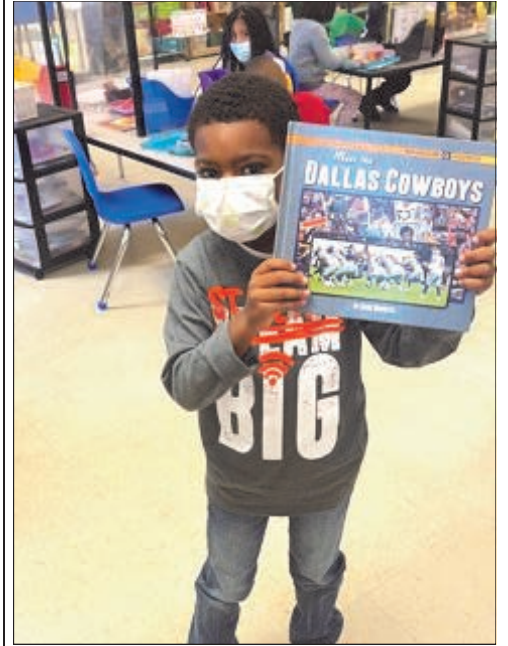
Tucker Townsend of Hamilton – Holmes Middle School was the single entry in the Junior Division. Tucker planted turnips and used a rototiller to prepare his seed bed, then broadcasted seed with a spreader. His plot had good uniform cover and was close to the woods for security. Evidence of deer and rabbits using his plot were found. Tucker Townsend won 1st place in the Junior

Division.

In the Senior Division, we had four entries from King William High School Ag Production Technology, Horticultural Science and FFA Classes. **Ashlee Powell, Trenton and Wylie Johnson, Patrick Upshaw and Kaleb Jimmo**. All four participants planted soybeans, buckwheat, rape, ryegrass, cowpea, sorghum and crimson clover. Ashlee prepared her plot by bush hogging and then disking. She broadcasted the seed by hand and ran a cultipacker over it. Evidence of quail and deer using her plot were found. Trenton and Wylie prepared their plot by chisel plowing and then turbo tilling. Evidence of deer using the plot was found. Patrick prepared his plot by bush hogging and tilling with a box tiller. He broadcasted the seed with a spreader pulled by a 4-wheeler and then lightly tilled over it. Evidence of deer using his plot were found. Kaleb prepared his plot by bush hogging and then tilled with a box tiller. He broadcasted his seed by hand and then covered the seeds with a harrow. Evidence of deer was found. All plots exhibited good uniform cover and were positioned close to the woods for security.

This year's winners of the Senior Division are 3rd place Kaleb Jimmo, 2nd place Trenton and Wylie Johnson and 1st place Ashlee Powell and Patrick Upshaw.

King and Queen County to be featured on *Real Virginia* program

This January, Virginia Farm Bureau's *Real Virginia* television program will highlight King and Queen County as part of its *County Close-up* segment.

Each month, the feature highlights a different Virginia county and provides an in-depth look at the area from an agricultural perspective. Burke Moeller, video producer for Farm Bureau, will interview local farmers and others to explore the role agriculture plays in the county, which sectors are most prevalent and how the industry is changing.

The most recent Census of Agriculture, conducted in 2017, found King and Queen had a total of 151 farms on 48,246 acres, and the market value of all agricultural products sold that year was more than \$18.3 million. Crops account for 76% of all farm income, with the major plantings being soybeans, corn and wheat. Commodities like livestock, poultry and other animal products make up the remaining 24%.

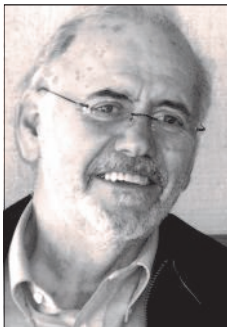

The program is designed to increase access to COVID-19 testing, especially among rural, remote, under-resourced communities, and other vulnerable populations.

"We are pleased to work with public libraries to provide another testing option for our community and to increase accessibility," said Dr. Laurie Forlano, DO MPH, Deputy Director, Office of Epidemiology. "Testing continues to be important to stop the spread of COVID-19, particularly as we enter the holiday season when people gather."

The at-home test kit uses the eMed digital

platform. You will need a mobile device or computer to create an account and to join a virtual testing session with an eMed assistant who will guide you through the testing process. Once the test has been completed, you will receive a test result within 15 minutes, and eMed will report the results to VDH.

You can request a free test kit from any of our ten branch libraries by following our guidelines at <https://tinyurl.com/prlcovidtest>. VDH recommends that tests be used within two weeks to avoid expiration.

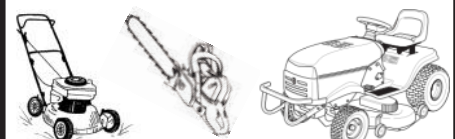

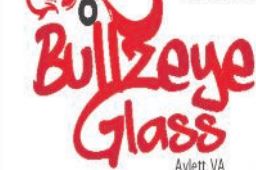

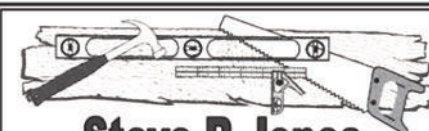
