





Before King William There was Pamunkey Neck

When I travel and meet people from across the country, I always tell them I live just two miles from the oldest courthouse still in continuous use in the United States. King William County celebrated its 321st birthday on April 11th Have you ever wondered what King William County was like before it became a county? In 1702 a bill passed a few months earlier by the General Assembly became law creating King William County, making it the 24th county in Virginia. Formed from King and Queen County, King William County was named for the reigning monarch of England at the time, King William. Several weeks prior to April 11th, 1702, the King died from injuries he sustained while riding his favorite horse, Sorrell.
