hit a hard drive to centerfield that was caught and thrown back to second base doubling Hollyn and ending the game. Ace pitcher Taylor Johnson allowed only two runs on four hits striking out 13 Knight batters in the process. Offensively the Lady Cavs were led by Jilliam Smith and Annabelle Townsend who each had two hits.

In a game that could have gone either way, these young Lady Cavs showed grit and determination as they immediately answered both times the Knights went one run up, only to fall short in a valiant attempt at the plate to tie the game in the bottom of the eighth inning. Every loyal Cavalier fan was on their feet when the dust started flying at home plate in the bottom of the eighth inning as Annabelle Townsend tried to tie the game. On Saturday May 20<sup>th</sup> the Pamunkey Reservation hosted MPRA for a paddle around the reservation. Twenty-seven MPRA members and friends traveled from as far as Arlington Virginia to paddle from the reservation Hatchery to Chief Powhatan's grave. This is a truly unique experience as permission from the tribe is required to visit either location.

Along the way paddlers spotted Bald Eagles, Osprey, a Great Blue Heron, plenty of turtle heads peeking up from below the water, and other wildlife native to the local ecosystem. They also enjoyed scenic views of the Pamunkey Reservation as well as of New Kent County across the river. Paddlers were also fortunate to spot

the Sebastian Marie, a 97 foot by 25 foot pontoon barge crafted in New Kent County by Ryland Fleet. Following the paddle, folks were able to visit the Pamunkey Indian Museum and Cultural Center which was open to the public.

Juneteenth is observed annually to commemorate June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1865. On this day Union Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston Texas to announce the end of legalized slavery to the final remaining Confederacy slave community. In 1980, Texas became the first state to recognize Juneteenth as a legal state holiday. On June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021 a bill passed by the US Senate and House of Representatives, receiving only 14 "nay" votes from the US House and passing the Senate unanimously, received President Biden's signature designating June 19<sup>th</sup> a federal

holiday. The Juneteenth event kicked off at 10 AM with the National Anthem, sung by Dorinda Mercer. Following the National Anthem, Reverend Dr. Wilbert D. Tally, Pastor of Third Union Baptist Church prayed over the ceremony. Tally prayed for God's "sustaining presence and direction" among those gathered to celebrate "a day with the proclamation of a promise delayed, of a freedom denied, and of a hope realized". Reverend Littycia Clay-Crawley, Pastor of New Life Community Church delivered a Statement of Purpose. Clay-

Crawley reflected on the joy, relief, and hope the slaves in Galveston must have felt upon receiving the news of their freedom. Dorinda Mercer of Amazing Grace, and a dance performance by the Henrico P.A.L.'s Dance Team prior to fellowshipping, visiting various vendor stands, checking out some amazing classic cars, and enjoying music provided by QSC Entertainment. It truly was a beautiful celebration of freedom, unity, and a community dedicated to lifting each other up and honoring the history, triumphs, and resilience of our African American brothers and sisters. The King and Queen chapter of the NAACP looks forward to hosting its first Juneteenth celebration in 2024.

# Prestley Farm – Almost a Century as the Gateway to King William

James L. Townsend, Sr. was a pioneer in the dairy industry and at one time his family operated five dairy farms in the county. There was a large house on the Prestley Farm when Mr. Townsend purchased the land in 1925 but it was torn down in 1927 to make way for Rt 360. Located just behind the big red barn is the “Old Virginia Barn.” It was built in the early 1800s to house livestock and store feed and grain.

In 2014 Carroll Lee Walker completed the restoration of both structures under the careful eye and knowledge of William Guy Townsend and his wife Emilie.

If Carroll Lee Walker was still living, he would be 78 years old on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. In honor of his birthday, I thought it appropriate to remember him for restoring structures and “saving history” in King William and King & Queen Counties. One such structure is Prestley Farm. Many of us each day pass by the beautiful red barn on Rt 360 as we enter King William from Hanover County. The land on which Prestley Farm sits can be traced back to a 1693 land grant from the English Monarchs King William III and Queen Mary II to the College of William and Mary. King William and King and Queen Counties are named for these two English Monarchs. In the late 1700s Major Walker Tomlin of Richmond County and his wife Sarah Fauntleroy owned a tract of land on the Pamunkey River in King William across

from the old town of New Castle on the Hanover side. Major Tomlin began acquiring farms along the Pamunkey River and by 1803 he had a total of 623 acres. In 1812 his son, John Walker Tomlin who attended the College of William and Mary in 1797 acquired 403 acres from the College which included Prestley Farm. The Tomlins had now amassed 1,026 acres of rich Pamunkey farmland. They also acquired property across the Pamunkey River in Hanover County. In addition to Prestley Farm or Warananoke Farm, as it is sometimes called, their holdings consisted of “Old Virginia Farm,” and “Eocene Farm.” Both of these farms are located on the Pamunkey River on the King William side.

John Walker Tomlin and his wife Margaret had six children. John died in 1815 and left each of his six young children (the oldest

was 10 years old and the youngest a few months old) a farm. His youngest child, Harrison Ball Tomlin, was given what he later named “Prestley Farm.” The farm remained in the Tomlin family till the late 1800s. In 1925 the Townsend family from North Carolina led by patriarch James L. Townsend, Sr. purchased Prestley Farm. Shortly after buying Prestley Farm, one of Mr. Townsend’s sons, Guy O. Townsend (father of William Guy Townsend) built the majestic red barn. Prestley Dairy Farm was an active dairy operation for more than 50 years. In 2025, just two years from now, the King William County landmark will reach the century-old milestone as the gateway to King William County.

The citizens of King William and King and Queen are very fortunate that William Guy, Emilie, and Carroll Lee Walker had the foresight to preserve history. Carroll Lee restored many structures in both King William and King & Queen Counties.

Descendants of James L Townsend live in the county today and operate farms, namely Queenfield, Manskin Lodge, and Riverside along the Pamunkey River. Riverside is the last remaining working dairy farm in King William County. I have known the Townsends all my life and they are hardworking, first-class people. They don’t come any finer.

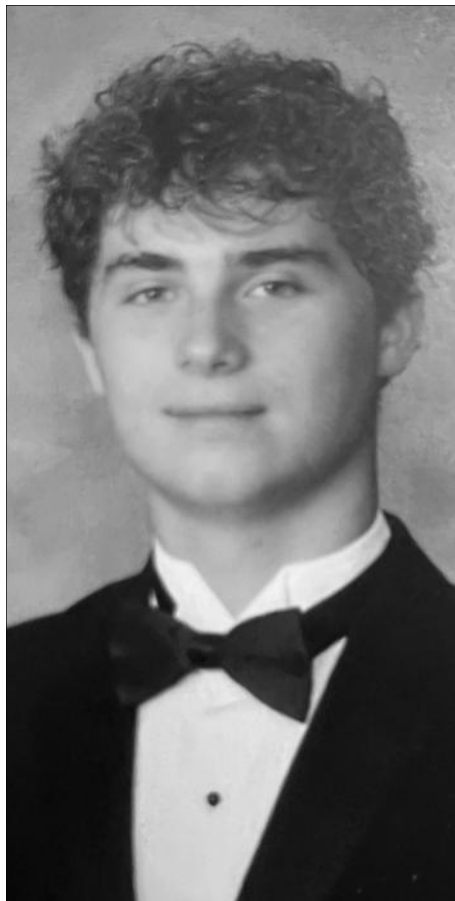

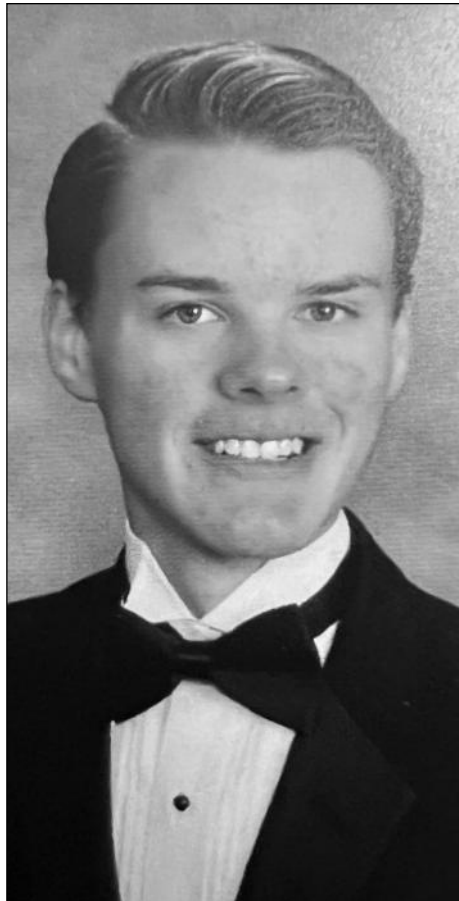
### King William High School 2023 Commencement

operating hours. In 2023, nearly \$10,000 in sponsorships were raised, increasing the scholarships awarded to \$2,500, increasing underwriting of the New Freedom program, and placing a copy of the first-place finisher's artwork on the side of a bus for the third year.

"This has been a wonderful community success story," said Ken Pollock, Director of Bay Transit. "Art in Transit has brought beautiful artwork into residents' lives, along with more exposure and a little extra money for our two organizations."

"I'm so proud of Art in Transit and receiving this award from our transit industry peers from across the state is definitely the icing on the cake," Pollock added. "We may be one of the smaller transit systems in Virginia, but our commitment to innovation, excellence, and community service have really distinguished Bay Transit as an industry leader."

## Kent's Store - SOLD

On Monday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, Kent's Store, the family-owned grocery store at King William Court House, was sold by Terry Taylor to Sarrinder Singh. Singh also owns stores in Mechanicsville, Doswell, Ladysmith, Manassas, and North Carolina.

The first little white country store was built in the early 40s by Temple and Gertie Kent on the corner of Powhatan Trail and Route 30 (known as White Shop). After that store burned in 1947, the couple built a new store at the present location at 20623 King William Road.

When Temple Kent died in 1966 his wife Gertie and her niece, Charlotte Taylor, started running the general merchandise store. In 1982 when Gertie died, her sister Julia Paul and her daughter Charlotte ran the store. Donna Peele, Charlotte's daughter, and Julia's grandchild, can remember she and her sisters riding to Richmond to Merchants Grocery with Charlotte and Julia in the 1978 Dodge Monaco station wagon to pick up groceries.

In later years bigger stores came to the area and Kent's Store became more of a convenience store. When Julia and Charlotte both died in 2016, Charlotte's son Terry bought the store. No changes were made to the store so the store could be maintained as a country store.

Terry Taylor talked to several local people about selling the store for about a year and found no buyers. A salesman from Merchants Grocery told Terry about Singh Sarrinder who owned several small grocery stores. Negotiations started with Mr. Sarrinder in April, and the store was purchased in May.

In talking to Mr. "Robin" Singh and his brother Sourob "Dinky" Singh, the store will be completely remodeled and upgraded. New slot machines will be added for the enjoyment of the community.

Mr. Taylor stated that he was sad to sell the store but said, "My family and I appreciate the patronage by the community over the years. I am retiring for the second time – from Dominion Energy after 31 ½ years and this store for 6 years." A faithful employee of all the owners of the store for 31 years, Charlotte Darlington, stated, "I came from a family who owned local stores and have thoroughly enjoyed working in retail sales with the different owners and the community." Robin Singh, the new owner, stated, "We are looking forward to meeting everyone."
