Mattaponi Tribe Hosts 25th Annual Pow Wow









For the fourth consecutive year, Bay Transit, the public transportation division of Bay Aging, has been recognized with an award from the Virginia Transit Association (VTA). Kent's Store - SOLD

On Monday, May 15th, Kent's Store, the family-owned grocery store at King William Court House, was sold by Terry Taylor to Sarrinder Singh. Singh also owns stores in Mechanicsville, Doswell, Ladysmith, Manassas, and North Carolina.

The first little white country store was built in the early 40s by Temple and Gertie Kent on the corner of Powhatan Trail and Route 30 (known as White Shop). After that store burned in 1947, the couple built a new store at the present location at 20623 King William Road.

When Temple Kent died in 1966 his wife Gertie and her niece, Charlotte Taylor, started running the general merchandise store. In 1982 when Gertie died, her sister Julia Paul and her daughter Charlotte ran the store. 




