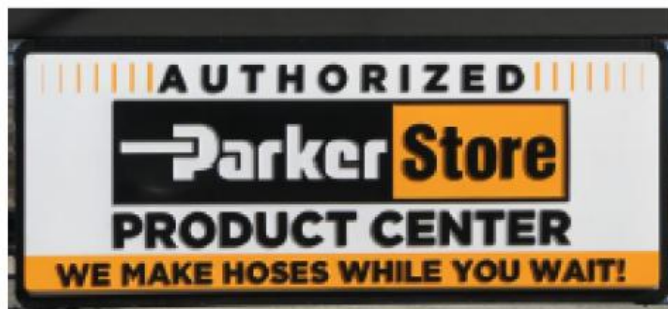

Horsemanship Terms

I've been thinking about some horsemanship words lately that don't make much sense to me. I'm not sure who came up with them. The first is a "crupper". That sounds like a chest cold, not something you put around a horse's tail to keep the saddle from sliding forward. Maybe the better word for it would be a wedgie because that is what it does to the horse if your saddle moves. How would that sound if someone said "Hey you better put that wedgie on your horse before you go riding in the mountains".

How about the word "britchin"? Is that like a half a pair of pants or britches? This thing is a strap just a few inches wide that goes from the saddle around the back of the horse's butt and keeps the saddle from moving forward. You hear people say to put a britchin on your animal before you go into rough country. I thought maybe it was to protect their legs from briars and such.

I remember the first time that I heard the word "saddle horn". I thought that was a pretty good idea for trail riding when you wanted to pass someone you could just hit it and they would



know to move over because they don't have any rear view mirrors to see who's behind them. But no matter how hard you slap on that thing it doesn't make any noise. It just sticks up on the front of your saddle for you to tie things to.

There's a place at the top of the tail that they call a "dock". To me that means a loading zone or something. Like the guys at the warehouses tell you to go pull up to the dock and they will get you loaded up. But on my animal, it's the dock where they unload everything. Maybe it should be called the undock instead.

Rock Spring Baptist Church Recognized on the Occasion of its 146th Anniversary

During their monthly meeting on October 25th, the King William County Board of Supervisors presented a resolution to members of Rock Spring Baptist Church in celebration of its 146th Anniversary. The Church which was organized in King William County on the third Sunday of March 1877 under the leadership of Rev. Washington Henry, has a rich history in the community. The first structure of Rock Spring Baptist Church was a log cabin built by brothers Lewis and Henry Tunket on Rt 605 (Manfield Road) just east of Enfield, Va. The log cabin also served as a school for black children in the area. As the congregation grew, a new structure was built in 1905 under the leadership of Pastor D J Stewart. This building still

stands today and serves as a testament to the church's enduring presence in the community.

Under the current leadership of Rev. Pagie Hancock, III, Rock Spring Baptist Church has achieved significant milestones. Rev. Hancock oversaw the ordination of the first female deacon, Carolyn Ford, as well as the first female trustee, Cassandra Johnston-Daniels. Rock Spring remains deeply involved in the community, actively participating in various community initiatives and providing spiritual guidance and support to its members. The church's long-standing presence and contributions have made a positive impact on the lives of many in the King William County area. Congratulations Rock Spring Baptist Church on your outstanding achievement.

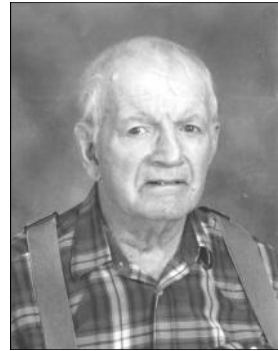

Supervisors Get Update from Historical Society

At the October 23rd meeting of the King William County Board of Supervisors, the King William Historical Society reported on the society's activities during the year. Debi Moren, Chair of the Museum Council, reported the Museum has seen 171 visitors thus far this year, some from as far away as Michigan. Open on weekends from March to November or by appointment, the Museum is located in the old clerk's office in the courthouse complex. In addition to tourists, approximately 300 students from nearby Acquinton Elementary School have toured the Museum this year.

Dave Brown, President of the King William Historical Society, gave an update on the archaeological dig just east of the old courthouse complex. The dig is in the vicinity of a tavern that once stood

during the 1700s. Last year the Fairfield Foundation for Archaeology began searching for the foundation of the tavern and other structures such as a hotel, store and stables that once thrived in the courthouse area. Twice a month (second and fourth Thursdays) the Foundation digs in the area of the tavern and have found artifacts from the Revolutionary War period and 1800s. The digs are open to the public. Brown reported the Fairfield Foundation has been given a grant through the Virginia 250 Commission to further their dig and analyze the artifacts they have found. The Museum has these artifacts on display as well as many other interesting artifacts from King William's storied history. For many years, the Peninsula Artillery held Civil War reenactments at the farm. However, for the past two years, "A Walk Through History" has been conducted by the Peninsula Artillery. This year I thought I was going to miss the event because of a previous engagement out of town. However, Jerry called me Friday morning and invited me to "walk through history" with some local students before leaving town.

As I arrived at Locust Grove, I was greeted by the sounds of children running along the paths of history at the edge of the farm's picturesque fields. Students from Acquinton Elementary School were bused over to experience this unique opportunity to step back in time. As the students walked along the paths, they were met by knowledgeable guides dressed in the era of history they represented. At each station along the winding path, the students paused to listen to the guides and explore various aspects of life during that particular era. From the First Peoples (Native Americans) to the Revolutionary War, Civil War, World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War, each stop provided insights into the challenges faced by people of that time. It gave the students respect for the struggles endured by others. In between

these historical stops, the students witnessed demonstrations on knot tying, furniture making, forging, candle and soap making, and more. Along the path, tables were set up displaying vintage school supplies, toys and games, and one table that particularly caught my attention was labeled "ye old photos." Adding to the fun and learning experience, students participated in a scavenger hunt of questions about the history they were hearing and reading signage along their walk.

Through events like this, history is brought back to life and our young people can truly get a sense of the sacrifices and achievements of those who came before us. We learn from history and develop a deeper appreciation for the rich history that surrounds us in King William and King & Queen Counties. The event was open to the public on Saturday.

Locust Grove has been in the Walker family for twelve generations spanning almost 360 years and is home to Fort Mattaponi (used by the Mattaponi Indians for protection against hostile tribes) which is on the National Register of Historic Places. EDA Holds Roundtable Discussions with Local Businesses



Deputy County Administrator Stephen Hudgins updates roundtable participants on new businesses coming to county

The King William Economic Development Authority (EDA) recently held its first roundtable discussion with local businesses on October 25th at the King William Parks and Recreation building in Aylett. The purpose of these meetings is to provide a platform for businesses to discuss and address the challenges and opportunities they face in the community. This initiative, developed by the EDA, aims to foster collaboration, share insights, and develop strategies to support the growth of local businesses and attract new businesses to the county.

The roundtable discussion was attended by representatives of ten local businesses, along with EDA members, county staff and Supervisors Ed Moren and Bill Hodges. The event was open to the public and began with a delicious meal provided by All Stewed Up catering, followed by an open and constructive dialogue among the participants. Deputy County Administrator Stephen Hudgins started the discussion by providing an update on new businesses coming into the county followed by an update on the expansion of county utilities. The participants then engaged in

wide-ranging conversations that covered topics such as promoting and marketing new businesses, retaining existing businesses, highlighting existing businesses, grants for startup businesses, streamlining the process of obtaining required licenses and cutting red tape. Participants also engaged in a discussion about the need for dedicated efforts to promote economic development and retain existing businesses in the county. All attendees agreed that having someone specifically focused on these tasks would be beneficial for the county. The EDA and county staff are currently in the process of interviewing candidates for the position of Business Development Specialist. This person would be responsible for actively promoting the county as a desirable location for businesses and provide support and guidance to existing businesses.

These roundtable discussions will continue on a bi-monthly schedule with the next one scheduled for December 13th. The EDA looks forward to continued collaboration and engagement with county officials and local businesses to promote, attract and retain businesses in King William County.

The new \$345,000 tanker will enhance the fire department's ability to respond effectively to emergencies and protect the community they serve. In this latest round of donations REC awarded \$101,340 to 24 grant applicants bringing the total this year to \$240,001 awarded to 53 applicants. Grants are awarded in April and October of each year. The next round of grants will open on December 10th and close February 10th. 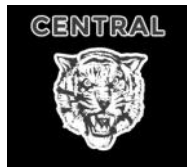

The Cavaliers were led on defense by Stewart, Braxton, LeMon Wallace, Carter Hamilton, and Nic Medlin. Kyle Jenkins and Braxton each had fumble recoveries, Hamilton and Derek Baker each recorded tackles for loss, and Hamilton, Walton, and Hunter Semones each recorded quarterback sacks.

The win improves King William's overall record to 4 - 5 while West Point's record stands at 6 - 3. King William leads the overall rivalry with 43 wins to West Point's 19. There have been two ties in the series. Since 1975, the Cavaliers hold a 41 to 3 win advantage with the 1976 game ending in a 14 - 14 tie. The Pointers last win came in 1998 by a score of 21 - 12.
