Central High School SmartPass

Central High School initiated an electronic hall pass for students the week of April 22, 2024. The new SmartPass program provides a platform for students to create a pass to the office, restroom, counselor or water fountain just to name a few of the many places a student may travel during the school day. This platform lets staff affiliated with the students such as counselors, teachers, administrators and para-professionals know what students are out of class and their destination. Passes are limited to 12 at a time across the school building. Giving all teachers and administrators the ability to see who is out in the halls and where they should be headed. This information is not only an additional safety measure, but it allows us to collect important data on bathroom and hallway use, specifically the time spent out of classrooms. This information will help the school identify high traffic areas and any adjustments that we may be able to make in procedures. This additional information gives teachers the ability to provide parents a clear picture of their students activities throughout the school day. Students appreciate being able to create their own passes on their smart devices. Teachers say, "At this point it has saved the time from stopping instruction to address students' requests to leave the classroom." "The SmartPass makes students responsible for the amount of time they are out of the room and where they are going in the building (the passes are limited to five minutes)." CHS has access to the program for three years and will use the data to reflect on practices and make adjustments where needed to make the school day run as smoothly as possible.

Captain John Smith and King William County

For those who attended King William schools, the name Captain John Smith likely first crossed your path in Mrs. Greenwood's fourth-grade classroom. Known as an explorer and adventurer, Smith played a pivotal role in the success of Jamestown, the first permanent English settlement in North America. Legend has it that he was saved from death by the kind intervention of Pocahontas, daughter of the powerful Chief Powhatan.

Upon his arrival at Jamestown in 1607, Captain John Smith wasted no time in setting out on explorations in shallops (small boats about 30 feet long) to map the waters of the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Along his journey, Smith left his mark in the form of Maltese crosses scattered about, marking the locations he ventured to.

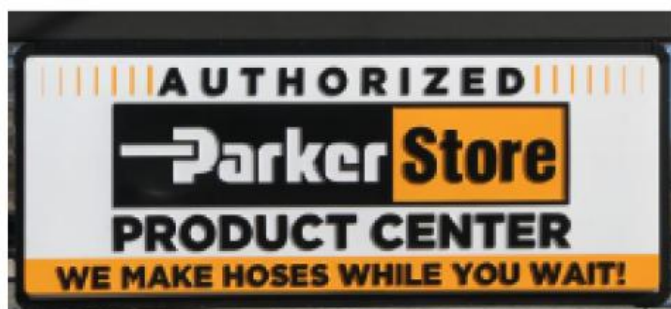

These crosses were carved into trees or marked by holes, serving as a sign to fellow future Englishmen that he had passed through. On one of these trips, he engaged two Native Americans to guide him and his two fellow Englishmen upstream by canoe. After twenty miles, the two Native Americans killed his two crew members and marched him to Opechancanough, the brother of Chief Powhatan. His capture occurred in the vicinity of Bottoms Bridge and the route to Opechancanough is outlined by the three crosses in King William.

In total, there are 27 Maltese crosses scattered across the Chesapeake Bay region, with three of these significant markers residing in King William County. Yes, indeed, Captain John Smith trod upon the very soil we walk upon today, a significant portion of King William County in his quest for discovery. The Cross Project, spearheaded by Smith

historian Ed Haile, aims to restore these historic cross sites with granite markers placed where Smith originally left his marks. Recently, my fellow colleagues from the King William Virginia 250 committee and I set out to locate one of these three granite markers within the county. We discovered the one on Monquin Creek, near the intersection of Mt. Pleasant Road and Acquinton Church Road. The other two await discovery near the Mattaponi and Pamunkey Rivers, one near Zoar Park in Aylett and the other close to my home place, The Grove, near the Pamunkey River. The notion that Captain John Smith once walked the very grounds we transverse daily is nothing short of fascinating. It serves as a poignant reminder that history surrounds us at every turn, we need only to open our eyes and hearts to pay attention to the stories that lie beneath our feet.

MPRA Holds Annual Meeting

The Mattaponi and Pamunkey Rivers Association (MPRA) held its annual meeting on Friday, April 26th at the Campbell's pavilion on the Mattaponi River. Members enjoyed great food and fellowship, even though it was a bit chilly on the river. President Audrey Mitchell reviewed the past year's accomplishments including co-hosting a "Fight the Flood" program, a River Day for King and Queen 6th graders, adding information to & cleaning up boat-landing river kiosks, and active participating in the York River Small Coastal Basin Roundtable. Volunteers were trained to monitor water quality at sites on the rivers. MPRA led paddles at Walkerton, the Pamunkey Reservation, from Zoar to Aylett and at Garnett's Creek.

In January, several members met with Delegate Hodges and Senator Stuart at the Virginia General Assembly and discussed concerns about inter-basin water transfer from the Rappahannock to the Mattaponi, and plans for future discharge of water into Pole Cat Creek, a tributary of the Mattaponi River. A group also attended a public meeting about the plans in Caroline County. Other river issues MPRA is focusing on are Scenic River Designation for a section of the Mattaponi and public river access.

Officers were elected at the meeting. Audrey Mitchell was elected president, Dave Slack, vice-president (VA Dept. of

Board members are Elizabeth Christeller, Dawn Shank (past president), Mike Greenwood, Josh Rellick, Amanda Walker, Christina Murray (VA Cooperative Extension), Tommy Tupponce (Upper Mattaponi Tribe), April Deacy (Pamunkey Tribe), Nate Davis (student representative), Heather Stother (Mattaponi River Keeper), and Kyla Huffman (King William Parks and Recreation). New board members Matt Venable (Mattaponi Tribe) & Tammy Heath (Mattaponi Tribe), Harry Looney (representing the Lake Anna Civic Association), and David Nunnally were elected.



INTRODUCTION

This Annual Drinking Water Quality Report for calendar year **2023** is designed to inform you about your drinking water quality. Our goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water, and we want you to understand the efforts we make to protect your water supply. The quality of your drinking water must meet state and federal requirements administered by the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791). Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include: (1) Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife. (2) Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming. (3) Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agricultural, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses. (4) Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are byproducts of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems. (5) Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the results of oil and gas production and mining activities. To ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations, which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health.

This waterworks system is serviced by two groundwater wells located in the McCauley Park and Kennington Subdivisions.

The water is treated with chlorine to prevent bacteriological growth in the distribution system.

The Virginia Department of Health conducted a source water assessment of our system during 2019. Both wells received a low rating of susceptibility to contamination, using criteria developed by the State in its EPA-approved Source Water Assessment Program. The assessment report consists of maps showing the source water assessment area, an inventory of known land use activities of concern, and documentation of any known contamination within the last 5 years from the date of the assessment. The report is available by contacting Mr. Sluder at the phone number or address given elsewhere in this drinking water quality report.

DEFINITIONS

Contaminants in your drinking water are routinely monitored according to Federal and State regulations. The table on the next few pages shows the results of our monitoring for calendar year 2023. In the tables and elsewhere in this report you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. The following definitions are provided to help you better understand these terms:

- Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000. Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000. Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) - picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.*
- Action Level (AL) - the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.*
- Maximum Contaminant Level, or MCL - the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.*
- Maximum Contaminant Level Goal, or MCLG - the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.*
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.*
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of Disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.*

We constantly monitor for various contaminants in the water supply to meet all regulatory requirements. The table lists only those contaminants that had some level of detection. Many other contaminants have been analyzed but were not present or were below the detection limits of the lab equipment.

The state follows us to monitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. Some of our data, though accurate, is more than one year old. Other drinking water constituents you may be interested in are as follows:

The sodium concentration from the Kennington well from a sample collected on May 9, 2023 was 67 mg/l. The sodium concentration from the McCauley Park well from a sample collected on March 8, 2022 was 72.2 mg/l. The recommended maximum contaminant level is 20 mg/l for persons on a "strict" sodium diet.

MCL's are set at very stringent levels by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. In developing the standards EPA assumes that the average adult drinks 2 liters of water each day throughout a 70-year life span. EPA generally sets MCLs at levels that will result in no adverse health effects for some contaminants or a one-in-ten-thousand to one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect for other contaminants.
