King William Administrator Ashcraft Resigns



County Administrator Percy Ashcraft

King William County Administrator Percy Ashcraft tendered his resignation on August 19th, effective immediately. Ashcraft assumed the role in December 2021 after the departure of former county administrator Bobbie Tassinari in February 2021. Ashcraft, a seasoned administrator with over 40 years of experience in public administration, is a native of Clarksburg, West Virginia. He served four terms in the West Virginia House of Delegates and once pursued the governorship of West Virginia. Before his tenure in King William County, he held the county administrator position in Prince George County for a decade. He had previously served as Caroline County administrator for 11 years.

During Ashcraft's absence, Steve Hudgins, the deputy county administrator, will support the Board of Supervisors in ensuring a seamless transition until a new administrator is appointed.

\$10,000 Reward Offered by FBI in King & Queen County Murder Case

The following is a Press Release from FBI Richmond

The FBI Richmond Field Office and the King and Queen County Sheriff's Office announced a \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individual(s) responsible for James Edward "Scooter" Byrd's murder on the 8th anniversary of his death. Byrd was shot and killed when several people entered his home during the early morning hours of August 16, 2016. His younger brother, who was 13 at the time, was asleep down the hall, but was awoken when he heard the shots. He would later run to a neighbor's house to call 911. Due to advances in technology, evidence and digital data have been re-collected and analyzed.

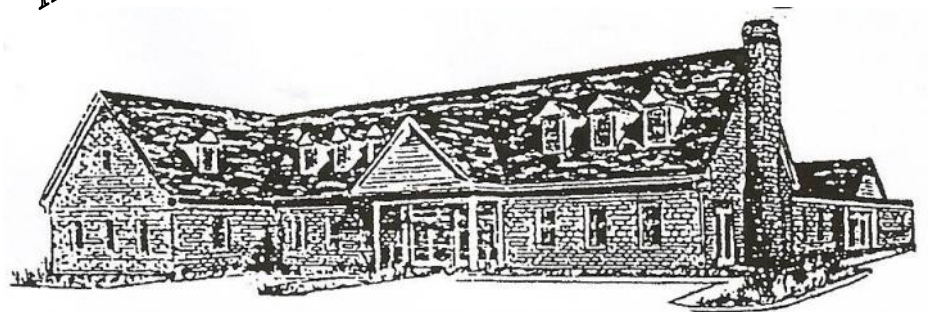

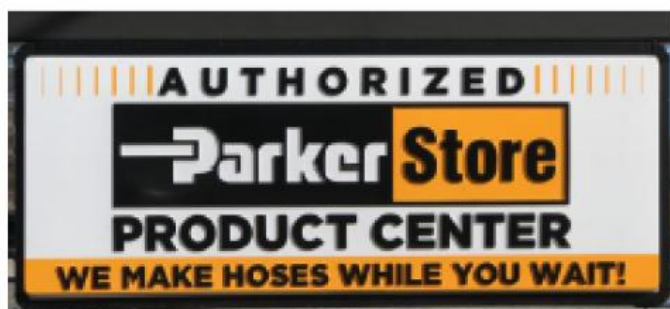

We would jump on the horses bareback and down through the woods we would ride hanging on to their mane until we fell off or got knocked off by a low hanging limb. Sometimes there would be 2 or 3 of us on one horse holding on to each other and the front one hanging on to the mane. We would be laughing and hollering and having a fun time until the horse got tired and dumped us off. I remember that they had a billy goat that would get out sometimes. Once when he got out, my sister started hollering for my uncle that the goat was out. Well that old billy goat didn't like all that noise and started chasing us. We took off towards the house running and yelling. Their farmhouse had a big front porch. When we came around the corner, I jumped up on the porch to safety. My sister and cousin ran on by and up the front steps with that goat in hot pursuit. They headed inside and slammed the screen door behind them thinking they were safe. That goat never slowed down.



He went right up the steps and through the screen door and into the house after them. Finally my Dad and Uncle caught the goat and got the screen off his horns and put him back in the pen outside. It took about an hour to clean and straighten the house up from everything that the goat tore up. The ride home that day was not much fun, but we still laugh about it today. Nowadays, I still like to have fun but I think about safety first. I guess that comes with age. Pip is pretty forgiving of me. If I do get caught up in the moment and mess up, she usually won't hold it against me or at least not for too long.

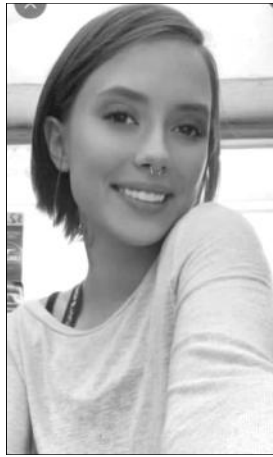
THORPE

there will be empty shelves...

I am a resident of King and Queen County and we have already been through the "restructuring of the library" process that your county is just starting. I have to warn you of what you have to look forward to and it's not a pleasant picture.

As far as what to expect, there will be empty shelves. I have about a dozen photos of what the current King and Queen Library looks like now. Rows and rows of empty shelves are what first stands out. The total number of books at our library is currently less than 3000, including books for all ages and in all genres. The reference section and periodical sections are virtually non-existent. There are two computers for public use in the restructured library and neither of them has Word. There is no such thing as an inter-library loan at the newly organized library because they have no affiliation with any library system. They are bare bones, barely meeting the patron's needs. Did you know that you cannot use your Pamunkey Library card any longer at all once the dissolution of the association with them is complete? I found that out the hard way when my holds on Libby via Pamunkey disappeared after June 30th. You can't use the computers there either, of course, since their use requires a valid local library card. I know that the choice is already out of

your hands, but my advice is to do whatever you have to do to force the supervisors to be honest about their decision. I suggest you visit the King and Queen library if you want to see what it has and what it lacks.

May Day! May Day!

This article serves as a recollection of memories rather than a call for help. Once again, social media has stoked memories of my childhood. Recent posts on the King William Memories Facebook page featuring old high school activities have rekindled recollections of a beloved tradition known as May Day. Held annually around the first of May at King William High School, May Day was a rite of spring that involved wrapping a maypole with white ribbon while joyfully dancing around it. I must have been around ten years old at the time. Both the high school and elementary students participated in the activities. I distinctly remember wearing a white shirt and white slacks. We would circle a pole erected in the school yard. Today, that pole would be located in the vicinity of the entrance to

the now existing high school. I miss that 'ole high school' which was located where the staff parking lot is now.

The event was a significant affair, drawing parents and community members to witness the celebration. This cherished tradition, popular throughout the 19th and 20th centuries, symbolized the arrival of spring. I remember waiting to enter the festivities, positioning ourselves in pairs, alternating between boys and girls, before starting the intricate routine of dancing and weaving the ribbon around the maypole. A King and Queen and their court would be on the high school steps viewing the ceremonies. I have a vivid memory of my mother sharing her own May Day experiences from her school days. The girls and boys would line up on opposite sides of the court, awaiting their pairing. As they entered the court, each girl would be matched with a boy. My mother, much

to her delight, saw she was going to be paired with the most handsome boy in school, her classmate Billy McGeorge. However, just as they were about to enter the court, another girl cut in line, disrupting the pairing. Needless to say, this

unexpected turn of events would always spark a hint of frustration in my mother's voice whenever she retold the tale. Old traditions sometimes fade into obscurity, yet they always remain etched in our minds forever!

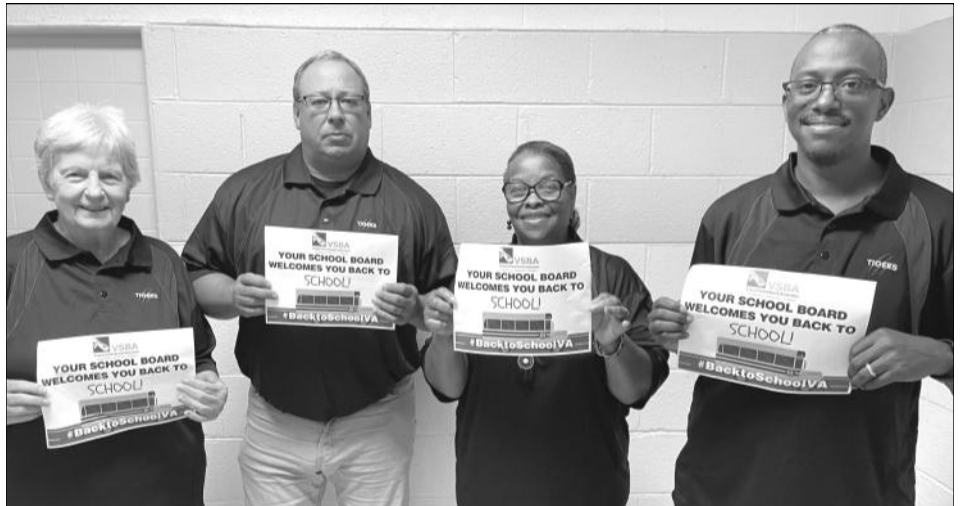

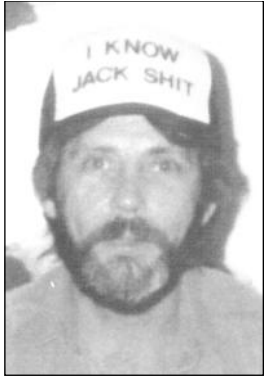

Fun and Safe Labor Day Holiday

Contributed by Farm Bureau —The odds of having a fantastic Labor Day weekend are in your favor, though the chances of becoming a traffic safety statistic are something to keep in mind. Virginia State Police stopped 4,475 speeders and 1,945 reckless drivers during 2023's four-day Labor Day weekend. State troopers also cited 491 seat belt violations and 150 child restraint violations during that time period. According to Virginia Traffic Crash Facts, 673 injuries resulted from 1,216 crashes throughout 2023's holiday weekend. Fourteen individuals died in 10 of those Virginia traffic crashes. Half of them involved motorcycles; seven motorcycle operators and passengers lost their lives.

The fatal crashes occurred in Virginia Beach, and Campbell, Hanover, James City, Montgomery, Nelson, Pittsylvania, Rockbridge, Scott and Wythe counties. Last year's 14 fatalities were up from 12 in 2022, and 10 in 2021. Transportation officials, law enforcement and outreach organizations like Drive Smart Virginia work to push the number of crashes and fatalities toward zero. But it can't be done without motorists who are free of distraction or impairment, said David Tenenbaum, senior actuarial manager at Virginia Farm Bureau Mutual Insurance

Co., who also serves as DSV treasurer. "No matter where you are in Virginia, or how you plan to celebrate this long holiday weekend, we all share the responsibility of roadway safety," he said. "Part of that responsibility is knowing traffic safety laws recently adopted in Virginia." In 2021, it became illegal in Virginia to hold a mobile device while driving. A "Do Not Disturb" app can block incoming correspondence while the vehicle is in motion. Otherwise, use your device's hands-free options carefully. Virginia's Move Over law for emergency vehicles was amended in 2023. Drivers must now change lanes when possible or slow down for any vehicle on the roadside flashing amber or hazard lights, triangles or flares. This includes utility, tow and roadside assistance trucks. The American Red Cross offers tips for safe Labor Day travel: Be well rested and alert, use your seatbelts, and observe speed limits. Clean your headlights, and turn them on as dusk approaches or in inclement weather. Don't drink and drive. Have a designated driver available. Give your full attention to the road. Use caution in work zones (Virginia's Move Over law does not apply in highway work zones). Don't follow other vehicles too closely.

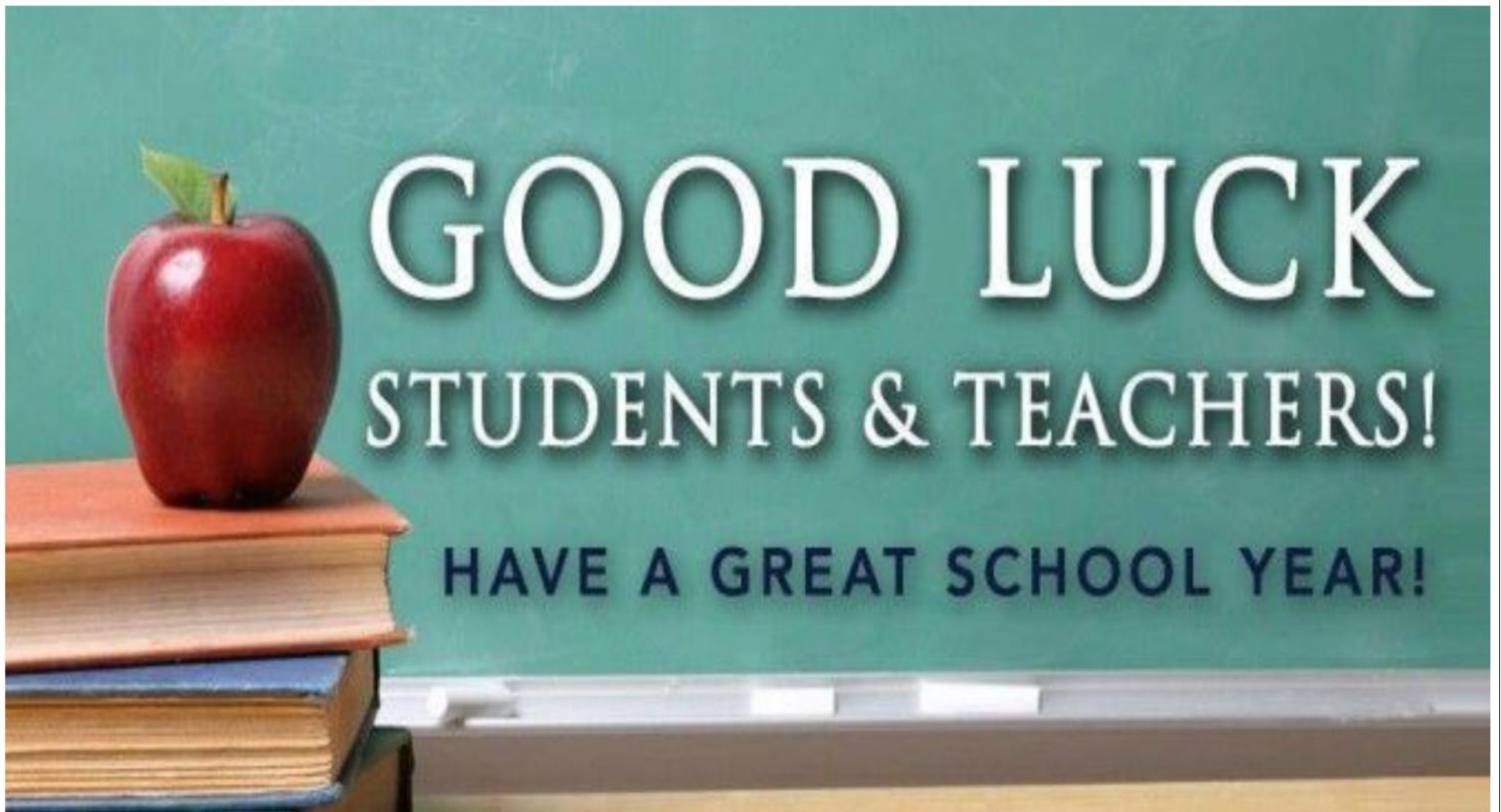
