Solar Farm Approved in King William

The King William County Board of Supervisors has given the green light to New Energy Equity, a Maryland based solar company, to operate a small-scale solar facility known as King William Solar 1, LLC. Situated in the 3600 block of King William Road in the Second District, just off Rt 30 below Jim Hall's Store in lower King William. The 5-megawatt community solar facility will cover approximately 30 acres of farmland and is anticipated to take three to six months to complete. The power generated by the project will be supplied to Dominion Energy. The conditional use permit (CUP-02-2024) was granted by the board with the stipulation that sheep be utilized to maintain the grass within the facility, which will be enclosed by an 8-foot-high security fence. Supervisors Robinson and Catlett dissented in the 3-2 decision.

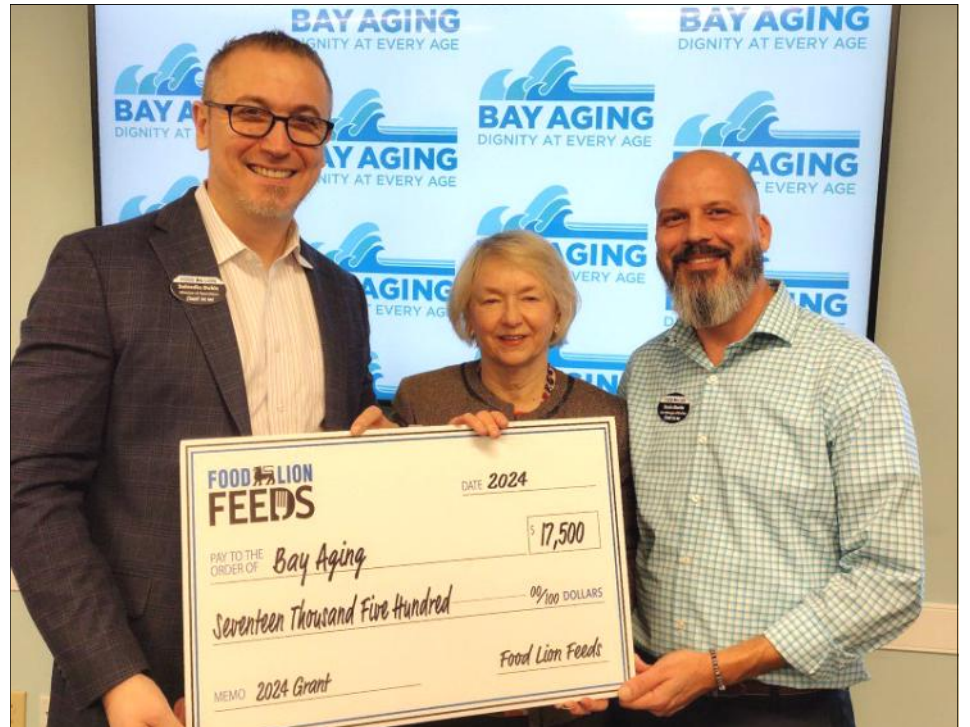
Fire Chief Ron Brown presented a proposal to the board for the establishment

of an EMS Captain position within the King William County Fire and EMS department. The EMS Captain will work with the Fire Chief, and take on highly skilled tasks, ensuring the efficient daily operation of the department. The position will involve both office work and field operations. Chief Brown was advised by Finance Director David Wilson, the current budget can sustain the position.

In other matters, the King William 250 Committee made a presentation to the board requesting funding for the upcoming 300th Anniversary Celebration of the King William County Courthouse, scheduled for Saturday, April 12th at the courthouse complex. While the committee is seeking contributions from the public and local businesses, additional funding is required for expenses such as advertising, banners, permits, security, and entertainment among other things.

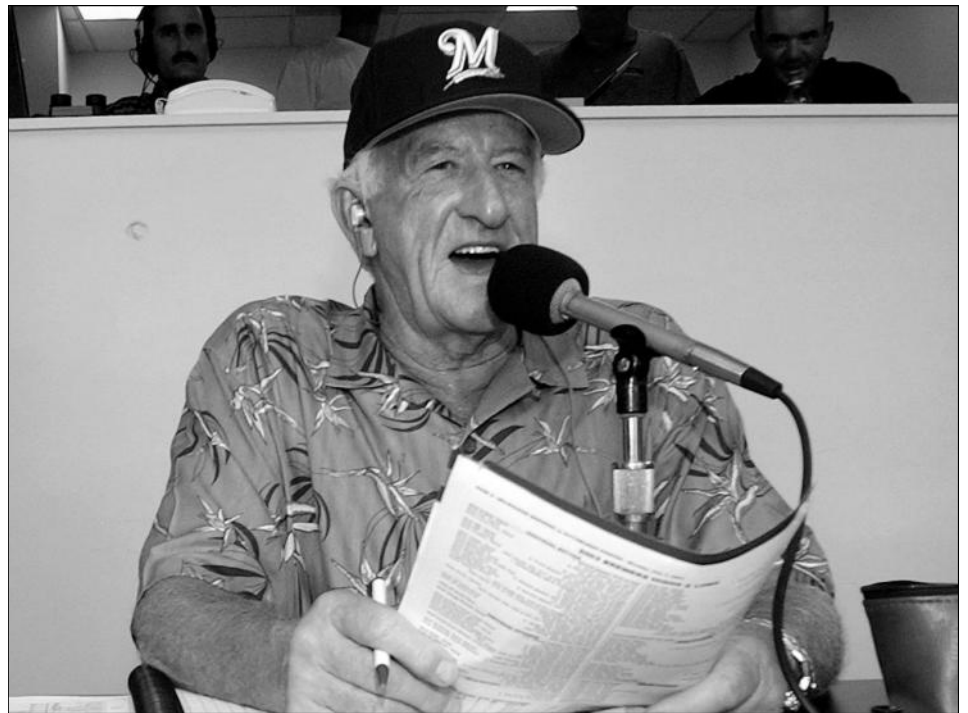

Program to Explore Black-Owned Businesses in Middlesex County

Join the Middlesex Museum Black Business Committee on Sunday, February 23, at 3:00 PM as they pay homage to Black entrepreneurship by highlighting 20th century Black-owned businesses in Middlesex County. A slide show, curatorial talk, and roundtable discussion at the Historic Courthouse, 865 General Puller Highway, Saluda, will explore objects and themes that are included in "Enterprising Spirits: African American Entrepreneurs in Middlesex County," an exhibition on display at the Middlesex County Museum and Historical Society. Attendees will be encouraged to share their recollections of 20th century Black businesses.

In the face of the challenges of Reconstruction and Jim Crow, African Americans created economic opportunities by establishing their own businesses. These businesses ran the gamut from retail to the building trades, from personal services to the professions, and beyond. Black-owned businesses provided goods, services, and employment that were often not otherwise available to the Black community. They served as sites of social interaction and provided courteous and capable services to Black and white citizens alike. The exhibition includes artifacts and

documents from a wide variety of businesses throughout Middlesex County. There will be an opportunity to view the exhibition at the museum (777 General Puller Highway, Saluda) on February 23 from 1:00 to 3:00 PM, and again after the program. Light refreshments will be served at the museum following the program. The exhibition can also be viewed during regular museum hours from 1:00 to 5:00 PM on Wednesdays and Fridays, and from 1:00 to 3:00 PM on Sundays. The exhibition is sponsored by the Middlesex County Museum and Historical Society, Inc. with support from River Counties Community Foundation. Seven Springs A Historic Home Unlike Any Other



Seven Springs circa 1725

Growing up, there was a home near me that always intrigued me. Hidden from view from the road, Seven Springs seemed like a mysterious place, its name conjuring images of a house surrounded by flowing springs. It wasn't until my teenage years that I finally laid eyes on this remarkable home, and what a sight it was. Seven Springs was built between 1725 and 1740, with its exact construction date shrouded in mystery due to fires at the county clerk's office destroying records. The house is unlike any other in colonial-era homes in Virginia. The house features a striking central chimney plan, a rarity in Tidewater domestic architecture of the time, showcasing brick laid in Flemish bond with glazed headers above the beveled water table and in English bond below it.

Situated less than a mile from Enfield on Dabney's Mill Road, Seven Springs was constructed by the Dabney family, led by Captain George Dabney. Dabney was a prominent figure in the early history of King William County. He served as a member of the County Court or Justices of the Court, the ruling body of the newly formed King William County, and also served as the county's first sheriff. Interestingly, there was a personal connection to the Dabney family, as George Dabney had established a home on land along the Pamunkey River known as Dabney's Ferry or Greenville, property that later became one of my father's farms. The Dabney family operated a ferry that landed on the Hanover side of the river near Hanover town.







Seven Springs was sold to the A B Pullen family in the early nineteenth century and descended through the Pullen and Atkinson families into the twentieth century. After having been vacant from 1940 to 1967, it was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Harry D. Moffett. They started a restoration process and it was during their ownership I first laid eyes on this unique home. In 1982 Midwest businessman Harry Coons and his wife purchased Seven Springs from the Moffett's and began an extensive restoration of his own adding several outbuildings that still stand today. When Harry passed, he bequeathed it to the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation which owned it till another Moffett family, Ken and Sue Moffett (no relation to Harry Moffett) from Texas bought it in 2012. The Moffett's attended my Church, McKendree Methodist Church, and they hosted many Church functions at the home. In 2015 the Hunnicutt family of Richmond purchased the property and expanded the property into a wedding venue and corporate retreat.

As the King William 250 Committee gears up for the 300th Anniversary of our beloved King William Courthouse and the following year for the 250th celebration of the founding our nation, residents of King William County can proudly say they live and work where our fore fathers shaped our nation into the great country it is today. We are reminded of the importance of honoring their legacy and preserving the values that have shaped this great nation.

Kids Outdoor Zone at Broadus

Broadus Church — Hebron Campus started a mentoring program for boys & young men called “Kids Outdoor Zone” in the Summer of 2024. This ministry of the church uses the Kids Outdoor Zone (a nationwide program) curriculum to accomplish two primary goals within the community they serve: the first is to mentor boys & young men into becoming Godly young men and the second is to encourage these boys & young men to more intentionally engage the great outdoors.

Breakfast, which is regularly provided for everyone present, is usually prepared on a

griddle under the direction of one or more of the adult leaders. KOZ has taken their participants fishing (twice), kayaking, archery shooting (twice), and are currently engaged in teaching them proper gun safety with plans to take them target shooting in the near future.

One of the moms of a KOZ participant said this of the KOZ program at Hebron Campus, “As a parent I like the fact that my son enjoys it. He looks forward to it and can’t wait to go every time. It also gets him outdoors and active with guidance from male figures he can look up to who also teaches him values that will teach him to do better and be better in everyday life.” She also shared her son, Liam’s, favorite activity thus far was the archery that the boys had learned.

Pastor Jeff Poythress said, “We have been looking for a program to help mentor boys from the community for two years. In 2024 the timing was right, we had a solid group of men who wanted to mentor boys, we had a good group who loved the outdoors and this ministry seemed like a great fit for us. We have seen a huge growth in both the men and the boys. It amazes me how quickly the boys have bonded with each other. They call themselves the wolf pack and it brings a huge smile to the men’s face when they howl together.”
