Davenport Presents Proposed FY 2025-26 Budget With 3.5 Cent Tax Increase

During the March 24th King William County Board of Supervisors meeting, County Administrator Stacey Davenport presented a draft of the FY 2025-26 budget, which included a 3.5 cent increase in the real estate tax. If approved, this would increase the county's tax rate from the current \$.58 per \$100 assessed value to \$.615 per \$100 assessed value. Also included in the draft budget is a 3% salary increase for all full-time county employees. The draft budget outlines a total of \$53,663,150 in expenditures, reflecting a 7.8% increase compared to the FY 2024-25 budget. The 3.5 cent real estate tax increase is expected to generate an additional \$953,606 in revenue.

The King William School Division requested \$16.2 million in their budget proposal but received \$15.1 million (including debt service), which is \$1.1 million less than they requested and \$750,000 more than their FY 2024-25 budget. Additionally, outside agencies saw an increase in funding, receiving \$190,700 more than their previous year's budget.
