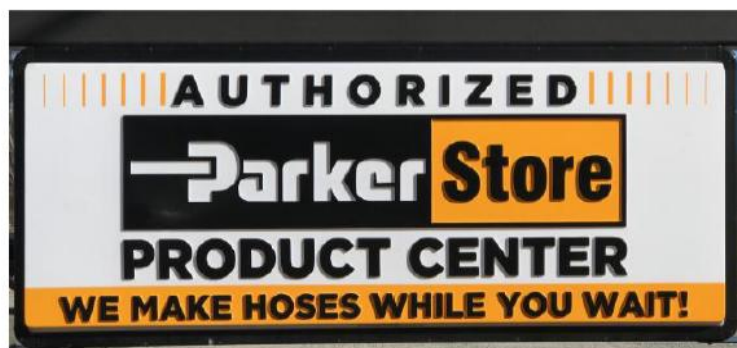

Over 100 families attended the regional

event, receiving one to two months supply of diapers and wipes. Over 30 safety car seats were distributed to families through Three Rivers Healthy Families participation in the VDH car seat distribution program.

In addition, the event high lighted April as Child Abuse and Prevention Month with goodie bags full of fun items for the children including pinwheels, blue ribbons and books. The greatest impact of this event may be the statistic that one in three families is affected by diaper needs, regardless of age, race, or income. Families are making choices between diapers and other necessities when they can't afford both.

Cascades Bear Island Plant Celebrates 2nd Anniversary

Ashland, VA, May 2, 2025 – Cascades Inc. (TSX: CAS) is proud to celebrate the 2nd anniversary of the start-up of its Bear Island mill, located in Ashland, Virginia. Two years ago today, the Bear Island mill produced its first roll of 100% recycled containerboard, following a conversion project that transformed it into a state-of-the-art mill. Today, thanks to the talent and efforts of its 200 employees, the mill produces in-demand lightweight, high-quality, 100% recycled containerboard. Cascades Bear Island is equipped with modern assets to perform in the top quartile of its industry. When fully ramped up, this mill will have an annual production capacity of 465,000 short tons of recycled containerboard with basis weights as low as 18 lb, among the lowest on the market, well positioned to serve the e-commerce market.

This 2nd anniversary commemorates the successful start-up of the mill on May 2, 2023, which marked the culmination of an 18-month construction phase. This project involved over 1,000 workers daily and more than 2.5 million construction hours. Cascades has undertaken significant upgrades to modernize the plant, including the installation of state-of-the-art equipment to ensure a long-term vision for the mill. The cost of the project was


approximately US\$525 million. The 819-acre site was acquired by Cascades in 2018, and construction began in early 2022. The mill was built in 1979 and was originally a newsprint facility with a capacity of 650 short tons per day.

“Cascades is pleased to have been operating in Virginia for the past two years and to continue to grow with its partners and employees. With its state-of-the-art equipment and lightweight 100% recycled containerboard, our Bear Island mill is committed to being a partner of choice to its customers and a socially responsible company to its community,” said Jean-David Tardif, Executive Vice-President, Packaging, at Cascades.

For 60 years, Cascades has been recognized for its social and environmental responsibility, and the Bear Island site is no exception. Ensuring the health and safety of our employees is always a top priority. The plant has achieved its ambitious water and energy consumption targets in the first few months of operation. It recycles 31,000 tons of fibre every month, mainly from Virginia and surrounding east coast states.

The Garden Club of the Middle Peninsula (GCMP), which includes King & Queen, King William, Essex, and Middlesex Counties, recently awarded grants for two exciting local projects in King & Queen and King William Counties.

The first project is funding for the new Learning Garden being developed by the King & Queen Public Library, onsite and next to a Community Outdoor Learning Center, being built soon. The Learning Garden will offer the community a space to learn and apply valuable gardening practices. Related skills workshops, including such things as garden planning, canning, and preserving, are also in the works. Four garden beds will incorporate sustainable and regenerative gardening practices, and include pollinators, native plants and a composting bin. The GCMP, a charitable and educational group always seeking to stimulate the knowledge and love of gardening, is delighted to partner with the library in this way. First in the process will be the Groundbreaking, a program on regenerative gardening and garden planning, with hands-on work in the garden. The second project is a grant to provide support for the very detailed and arduous Living Shoreline Restoration project occurring on the Mattaponi Indian Reservation in King William. The Mattaponi Indian Tribe and Reservation is actively working to restore shorelines on their tribal lands along the Mattaponi River. Along with other grants, the GCMP funding will assist in a variety of ways, such as purchasing native grasses central to the restoration efforts. The NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) has recognized the Middle Peninsula as a Focus Area to restore habitats for fish and shellfish and improve coastal community resilience, and is supporting this work as well. The GCMP is particularly pleased to participate in this effort to improve one of our local rivers and riverbanks. Chief Mark T. Falling Star Custalow and Tami Heath, who is coordinating the project within the Reservation, provided GCMP members Lisa Vawter and Anne Glubiak a tour of the shoreline project, complete with an enormous quantity of bagged oyster shells, which had been placed in the area as part of the shoreline project. This work itself was a tremendous effort.

Each year, the GCMP awards a limited number of grants to local projects, which are associated with environmental work, restoration, and beautification.

County administrator Stacey Davenport reviewed the expenditures and revenue figures of the proposed \$54,325,389 budget and the proposed real estate tax rate increase from \$0.58 per \$100 of fair market value to \$0.615 per \$100. Following her presentation, several supervisors indicated they do not favor a tax rate increase. They quickly voiced concerns with comments like “We need to cut back,” “We need to go back to the drawing board,” and “What are the citizens getting for this tax increase?” One citizen spoke during the public hearings, raising questions on how the budget process was performed. Supervisors will hold a special meeting on Monday, May 5th at the courthouse complex beginning at 1 pm to discuss the budget further.

In other matters, Joyce Wolfe from the Planning Department presented Zoning case-01-2022, a request to rezone 4.2 acres at 115 Commerce Park Road from B-2 (General Business) to I (Industrial District). The Planning Commission had previously recommended approval, and the supervisors voted unanimously to grant the request.

During the citizens' comment period, six citizens spoke, three of whom expressed their displeasure with the Parks & Recreation Department's relocation to the courthouse complex to accommodate the proposed relocation of the Library from Central Garage.

In unfinished business, the supervisors voted 4-1, with Supervisor Hodges dissenting, to approve the County Administrator's signing on April 24th of the sheriff's department radio equipment lease-purchase agreement with Motorola that was tabled from the April 14th board meeting. County Administrator Davenport advised that the contract was renegotiated to secure a reduced interest rate and reduced the total cost by \$50,000 from the initially quoted \$850,425. Yearly payments will start on July 15, 2027, and conclude on July 15, 2032.

Fourth District Supervisor Lindsay Robinson proposed the creation of a Citizens Finance Advisory Committee, consisting of four or five citizens, including one board of supervisor member, to collaborate with county staff on budget and finance matters. Robinson noted that a county finance board was established last year but never met. After some discussion, the supervisors unanimously approved the formation of a Budget Finance Committee with citizen participation.

In administrative matters, Davenport announced that the first of two town hall meetings regarding the new library is scheduled for Wednesday, May 7th, at the Parks and Recreation Building in Aylett, with the second slated for Wednesday, May 13th, at the West Point branch. Davenport also said that RFPs (Request for Proposals) on plans to renovate the existing parks and recreation building to accommodate the new library will be issued in the next 20 days. She could not predict when the new library would be up and running. Additionally, she stated that contrary to social media claims, the county is still negotiating with the Pamunkey Regional Library (PRL). No definitive dates have been set with the PRL regarding the termination of their services.

Davenport said exciting developments are on the horizon, including the construction of a new Dunkin' Donuts in Central Garage next to United Bank. Construction will start on May 12th. After some delays, WaWa at the corner of Rt 30 and Rt 360 will begin vertical construction on May 20th. The first Farmers Market of the season will take place on Friday, May 9th, from 4-7 pm in the King William High School parking lot. The Department of Social Services has seen recent staff turnover and is expecting a new director in the coming weeks.

The next meeting of the King William Board of Supervisors is scheduled for Monday, May 12th, at 6:30 p.m. in the administrative building.

Members of the King William County Board of Supervisors

I am writing today as a concerned and committed member of our community to express the critical importance of preserving and strengthening our Parks and Recreation resources—particularly our youth soccer programs and their designated facilities. These programs are more than recreational—they are lifelines for our youth and deserve to be prioritized, protected, and expanded as our county continues to grow.

Youth sports promote lifelong healthy habits, foster friendships, instill discipline and teamwork, and keep kids engaged in positive activities. Soccer, in particular, continues to grow in popularity and brings families together from across our region. We have kids traveling and paying to participate in our Parks and Rec program from King William and surrounding counties.

Game days and tournaments generate meaningful revenue for King William County by attracting visitors who dine, shop, and support local businesses. The fields are packed with multiple generations of families attending from near and far to watch the kids play. The location of the building and field are in the

heart of the county, which helps boost the convenience to local restaurants. The proximity to Fire and EMS is essential for emergencies that could occur on the field.

It is especially disheartening that our county does not currently offer middle school sports—a gap that leaves many students without access to structured physical activity during one of the most formative stages of their development. In this context, Parks and Recreation becomes even more essential. These programs fill a void that would otherwise leave kids without healthy outlets or guidance during after-school hours.

I am a long-standing youth soccer coach here in King William County— I spend two nights a week out on the field with the kids of our community. I've proudly watched this program triple in size since it began, and the demand only continues to grow. That growth is a clear sign of how much our community values youth sports and their impact. As business-driven individuals, I ask that you reconsider your premeditated plan to displace a valuable revenue-generating operation that supports our youth.
